DWIGHT CLARK DAY

This week's game against the Dallas Cowboys will feature a special halftime event featuring former 49ers WR **Dwight Clark**, the day will celebrate his many contributions to the organization as a player (1979-87), a front office executive (1989-98), and in his current role as 49ers Hall of Fame consultant. Fans will enjoy numerous "Dwight Clark" themed elements throughout the game, meant to show love and support for one of the most adored men to ever wear the red and gold.



In honor of Clark, the 49ers have named the **Golden Heart Fund** as this game's 50/50 Raffle Beneficiary. The Golden Heart Fund, which serves current and future 49ers alumni who are in need of financial, medical, psychological or emotional support, will also be the recipient of 25% of proceeds from sales of Dwight Clark apparel purchased on gameday at Levi's Stadium.




A special halftime presentation will feature a tribute to the 49ers 1981 Championship team and the historic moments that led to their Super Bowl victory. More than 30 alumni will take center field, while Hall of Fame QB **Joe Montana** addresses the crowd. The Super Bowl XVI season included "The Catch."

WHERE CLARK RANKS IN 49ERS TEAM HISTORY

The backdrop was a postseason matchup with the Dallas Cowboys on January 10, 1982. In the early 70's, the Cowboys had knocked the 49ers out of the playoffs three straight times and this was San Francisco's first playoff appearance since that time.

In a back-and-forth game, the 49ers trailed the Cowboys 27-21 with 4:54 to play. Behind Joe Montana, Freddie Solomon, Lenvil Elliott and others, the 49ers moved 83 yards to the Dallas six. Then on a third down play, Montana rolled to his right and threw to the back of the end zone where Dwight Clark leaped high and hauled the ball in with his fingertips.

The pass was completed and the play is now simply known as "The Catch," arguably the single-most famous moment in Bay Area sports history and one of the greatest in NFL history.

Still, there was drama to come. Eric Wright made a game-saving tackle on Drew Pearson and Lawrence Pillars forced a Danny White fumble that was recovered by Jim Stuckey. The 28-27 win sent the 49ers to their first Super Bowl and an NFL dynasty was officially launched.



GOLDEN NUGGETS

- In his first extended action in the NFL last week at Was. (10/15/17), QB **C.J. Beathard** completed 19 of 36 passing atts. for 245 yds. and 1 TD. His 245 passing yds. were the 2nd-most in a single-game by a rookie QB in franchise history [QB Tom Owen - 316 passing yds. at Chi. (11/17/74)].
- RB **Carlos Hyde** has registered 1 TD run in each of his 2 career games against the Cowboys, including 1 TD in last season's matchup between the two teams at Levi's Stadium.
