LOOKING AHEAD

With a Win vs. Dallas...

- The 49ers would improve to 18-16-1 all-time against the Cowboys, including a 10-8 record at home.
- **San Francisco** would win their second-consecutive matchup against Dallas [W, 28-17 at Dal. (9/7/14)].
- The **Niners** would win their first two home games of the season for the first time since 2012 and just the third time since 2000.


 Head coach Chip Kelly would improve to 4-3 as a head coach against the Cowboys, including two consecutive victories.

GOLDEN NUGGETS

- With 2 rushing TDs last week at Sea., RB Carlos Hyde looks to find the end zone in back-to-back weeks for the first time in his career.
- In his NFL debut, **Hyde** opened the 2014 season rushing for 50 yds. and 1 TD on 7 atts. (7.1 avg.) at Dal. (9/7/14).
- Dating back to last season, LB **Ahmad Brooks** has registered 4.0 sacks in his last 5 games at Levi's Stadium.

RED ZONE PRODUCTION

- Through the first three games of 2016, the 49ers have come away with points on each of their 10 trips to the red zone (7 TDs & 3 FGM).
- **San Francisco's** 70.0% red zone TD efficiency ranks 6th in the NFL this season.



IT STARTS UP FRONT

- Through the first three games of 2016, the **49ers offensive line** has allowed only 2 sacks, tied for the fewest in the NFL (Oak. 2; NYJ 2).
- The team's 2 sacks allowed are the fewest given up in the first 3 weeks by the 49ers since 2000 (2 sacks allowed).
- The Niners have registered 6 rushing TDs this season, the 2nd-most in the NFL (Dal. 7).
