LOOKING AHEAD

With a Win at Cleveland...

- The **49ers** would improve to 8-11 all-time against the Browns, including a 3-6 record on the road.
- **San Francisco** would win their second consecutive meeting between the two clubs [49ers win, 20-10, at SF (10/30/11)].
- The **Niners** would win in Cleveland for the first time since defeating the Browns, 41-7, on 11/11/84.
- The **49ers** would move to 2-1 on the season against the AFC North. The team will finish their non-conference schedule next week as they host the Cincinnati Bengals at Levi's® Stadium.

NON-CONFERENCE RUSH

- As a team, **San Francisco** has been exceptional on the ground against AFC opponents since 2009. The team ranks 2nd among NFC teams rushing for 136.7 yds. per game and t-1st with 30 rushing TDs as a team against the AFC.

- During that timespan, the **49ers** averaged 4.69 yds. per carry against AFC opponents, a mark that ranks 2nd among NFC teams in non-conference play.

BALL CONTROL

- The **49ers** have not committed a turnover in four consecutive road games in the same season for the first time since the NFL merger in 1970.
- Since 2009, the **49ers** have posted a +62 turnover differential, ranking 3rd in the NFL. San Francisco ranks 3rd in the NFL with 124 giveaways and 10th with 186 takeaways during that timespan.

- Since 2009, the **Niners** have committed 25 turnovers in 26 games against AFC opponents, which ranks 2nd among the NFC in non-conference matchups (GB - 23).

GOLDEN NUGGETS

- With 1 recept. and 5 rec. yds. this week, WR **Anquan Boldin** would become the 1st player in NFL history to reach at least 50 receipts. and 600 rec. yds. in each of his first 13 NFL seasons.
- By converting his next FGA, K **Phil Dawson** will move into sole possession of the two longest consecutive made FG streaks in 49ers franchise history. Dawson has converted 18 straight attempts this season and in 2013 he connected on a franchise record 27 consecutive FGAs.
- **Dawson** made 305 FGs from 1999-2012 as a member of the Cleveland Browns, the most in franchise history.
- With his 71-yd. TD recept. last week at Chi., WR **Torrey Smith** became the first member of the 49ers to register 3 rec. TDs of 70-or-more yds. (75, 76 & 71 yds.) in the same season since WR John Taylor accomplished the feat in 1989 (70, 92 & 95 yds.).



- RB **Shaun Draughn** has registered 345 yds. from scrimmage (182 rush & 163 rec.) in 4 games with the team for an avg. of 86.3 YPG.
- Since joining the team in Week 9, **Draughn** ranks t-1st in the NFL among RBs with 22 receipts.
