With a Win vs. Baltimore Ravens...

- The **49ers** would improve to 2-4 all-time against the Ravens, including a 2-1 record at home.
- The **Niners** would move to 10-3 at home against non-conference opponents since 2009. The team's .750 winning pct. during that timespan ranks t-6th in the NFL and t-2nd in the NFC (GB .769; Arz. .750; Sea. .750).

• San Francisco would win their fourth consecutive home game against the AFC North. It would mark the 49ers longest home winning streak against the division since 11/29/87 (49ers win, 38-24, vs. Cle.) to 12/5/93 (49ers win, 21-8, vs. Cin.).

- Since 2009, the **49ers** have allowed 176 pts. against non-conference opponents at home, ranking 1st in the NFL during that timespan.
- LB Aaron Lynch has registered a total of 7.0 sacks in his past seven games at Levi's[®] Stadium, including 1.0-or-more sacks in six of those seven.

- RB **Carlos Hyde's** 25 total first downs this season (21 rush & 4 rec.) ranks t-8th in the NFL and t-5th in the NFC.
- Since 2011, WR Torrey Smith ranks 2nd in TD recepts. (9) and 3rd in recepts. (84) and rec. yds. (1,320) against AFC North opponents. In Week 2 at Pit., Smith registered 6 recepts. for 120 yds., including a career-long 75-yd. TD.
- **Smith** ranks 2nd in the NFL this season with a 20.64 rec. avg. Since entering the NFL in 2011, he ranks 2nd with a 17.04 rec. avg. (min. 50 recepts.) (DeSean Jackson, Was. 17.27).

Baltimore Ravens Head Coach John Harbaugh on the 49ers... "We're going to go out to San Francisco. It's going to be something that's going to be tough and challenging. It's a good football team. They have a lot of good players. We know a lot of those guys personally. We practiced against them last year. We know the team well. We have to go find a way to play our best and win the game, and that's all we need to be thinking about right now, and that's all we'll be focusing on."

Baltimore Ravens Head Coach John Harbaugh on the 49ers Offense...

"Obviously, they have a great back in Carlos Hyde, three really good tight ends and the receivers that you talked about, guys that we know well. It's a dangerous group. It's going to be a big challenge."

Baltimore Ravens QB Joe Flacco on the 49ers defense...

"I think they have a good front. I think NaVorro Bowman can kind of lead the group in terms of those front seven guys. I think he's still playing well. As far as the secondary goes, I think Bethea can be the leader in there and he can come up and hit people in the run game and can be confident back there in the passing game."

Baltimore Ravens CB Jimmy Smith on WR Torrey Smith...

"I know Torrey so well. We're like brothers. I know his moves, he knows my moves. So, it's going to be fun out there. I'm pretty sure we're going to get out there and have some plays where we're actually just laughing at each other at the end. But, I think it's going to be a great matchup."

IRONMEN

The 49ers have multiple players that rank near the top of the NFL in consecutive games played and games started.

- S Antoine Bethea leads all NFL safeties, having started in 117 consecutive games.
- WR **Anguan Boldin** ranks t-2nd in the NFL with 37 consecutive games started (Demaryius Thomas, Den. 53; DeAndre Hopkins, Hou. 37).
- K **Phil Dawson** ranks 3rd in the NFL with 94 consecutive games played (Mason Crosby, GB 133; Ryan Succop, Ten. 94).
- WR **Torrey Smith** has appeared in 69 consecutive games, tied for the 4th longest streak in the NFL (Eric Weems, Atl. 107; Brandon Tate, Cin. 85; Vincent Jackson, TB 73; Brian Hartline, Cle. 69).
- T **Joe Staley** has started 69 consecutive games, ranking 4th in the NFL (D'Brickashaw Ferguson, NYJ 148; Donald Penn, Oak. 129; Zane Beadles, Jax. 80).
