- Last week at Arz. (10/28/18), DL Arik Armstead brought down Cardinals QB Josh Rosen for a 9-yd. sack.
- Armstead has registered at least 1.0 sack in consecutive games for the first time in his career. With 1.0-or-more sacks this week vs. Oak., he would become the first member of the 49ers with at least 1.0 sack in three consecutive games since LB Dan Skuta in Weeks 14-16 of the 2014 season.

MOST REGULAR SEASON GAMES

- WR Marquise Goodwin is averaging 21.6 yds. per recept. this season, ranking 2nd in the NFL among players with at least 10 recepts. (DeSean Jackson, TB - 22.8).
- LB **Fred Warner** has registered 65 tackles this season, ranking t-8th in the NFL and 2nd among rookies (Darius Leonard, Ind. – 88).

81 GETS HIS HOF RING

At halftime of this week's 49ers vs. Raiders game, former 49ers WR **Terrell Owens** will be presented his Ring of Excellence by Pro Football Hall of Fame President David Baker.



 Owens will be made available to media prior to the game on the Levi's Stadium field.

Originally a third-round draft pick (89th overall) by the San Francisco 49ers in the 1996 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, Owens finished his 15-year NFL career among the league's all-time best. In addition to his time in San Francisco

(1996-2003), Owens had stops in Philadelphia (2004-05), Dallas (2006-08), Buffalo (2009) and Cincinnati (2010).

 Owens was named AP First-Team All-Pro five times throughout his career (2000-02, 2004 & 2007), was selected to six Pro Bowls (2001-05 & 2008) and was chosen by Hall of Fame Selection Committee members to the 2000s All-Decade Team.

 Owens finished his career with the second-most rec. yds. in NFL history (15,934), only behind former 49ers WR and 2010 Hall of Fame inductee, Jerry Rice. He currently ranks 3rd in NFL history with 153 rec. TDs (153), behind Jerry Rice (197) & Randy Moss (156).

 In addition to the halftime ceremony, Owens' Hall of Fame bust is currently on display in the 49ers Museum through November 4th. *Please note that the 49ers Museum is open Friday through Sunday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. PT.
