#### **VIRTUAL DRAFT PARTY**

The San Francisco 49ers are set to host the 49ers Virtual Draft Party presented by Levi's® on Thursday, April 23rd - the first night of the 2020 NFL Draft.

For the Faithful looking for a 49ers-centric Draft experience, the 49ers Virtual Draft Party will take place simultaneously on 49ers.com, the 49ers app, YouTube Live and Facebook Live. Live segments will be streamed on the above channels to complement the national television broadcasts on NFL Network, ABC and ESPN.

The first Draft Party segment will be the Pre-Draft Tailgate from 4:00 pm – 5:01 pm PT. Additional live segments will air surrounding the 49ers first pick (13th overall), the team's second pick (31st overall) and at the conclusion of the first round. The draft party will be hosted by 49ers Senior Team Reporter Keiana Martin and will feature interviews, look-ins and messages from 49ers fans, influencers, current players, draft prospects, General Manager John Lynch and Head Coach Kyle Shanahan. WHAT: 85th Annual National Football League Player Selection Meeting.

WHEN: 8:00 PM ET, Thursday, April 23 (Round 1).

> 7:00 PM ET, Friday, April 24 (Rounds 2-3). Noon ET, Saturday, April 25 (Rounds 4-7).

TIMING: Round 1: 10 minutes per selection.

Round 2: Seven minutes per selection.

Rounds 3 through 6, including compensatory picks: Five minutes per selection.

Round 7, including compensatory picks: Four minutes per selection.

**DRAFT-A-THON:** The 2020 NFL Draft will serve as a three-day virtual fundraiser benefitting six charities – selected by the NFL Foundation – that are battling the spread of COVID-19 and delivering relief to millions in need.

> The "Draft-A-Thon" will be featured across the live Draft coverage on ABC, ESPN. ESPN Deportes and NFL Network and pay tribute to healthcare workers and first responders in a variety of ways – including raising funds for the work being done to combat the impact of COVID-19. Funds will help support six national nonprofits and their respective COVID-19 relief efforts including:

- American Red Cross and its work to maintain a sufficient supply of blood while continuing to deliver its lifesaving mission due to the Coronavirus Outbreak
- CDC Foundation's All of Us: Combat Coronavirus Campaign to support vulnerable communities and bolster laboratory capacity, clinical research, data and technology infrastructure and local response efforts

#### FIRST-ROUND FATHERS AND SONS

In 2019, the San Francisco 49ers selected Ohio State defensive end NICK BOSA with the second overall pick and he joined his brother, JOEY BOSA (No. 3 overall in 2016, San Diego Chargers), and his father, JOHN BOSA (No. 16 overall in 1987, Miami) as first-round selections.

Additionally, Pittsburgh selected linebacker DEVIN BUSH JR. 10th overall in 2019, who joined his father, DEVIN BUSH **SR**. (No. 26 overall in 1995, Atlanta), as a first-round selection in the NFL Draft.

Bosa and Bush became the 10th and 11th players to join their fathers as first-round selections since 1967.

This year, LSU tight end THADDEUS MOSS and Minnesota defensive back ANTOINE WINFIELD JR. are hoping to join their fathers as first-round selections. Pro Football Hall of Famer RANDY MOSS was selected 21st overall by Minnesota in the 1998 NFL Draft while ANTOINE WINFIELD SR. was chosen with the 23rd pick by Buffalo in the 1999 NFL Draft.

#### ===== QUARTERBACKS ===:

The 2020 NFL Draft has as many as five quarterbacks - including potential first overall pick **JOE BURROW** - who could be selected in the first round. This is expected to become the seventh consecutive draft with multiple quarterbacks selected in the first round, the second-longest such streak in the common draft era.

2020 is also expected to become the fifth consecutive draft with at least three quarterbacks selected in the first round, tied for the longest such streak in the common draft era (2002-06: five consecutive drafts).

If multiple quarterbacks are selected in the top-10, it would become the sixth consecutive draft to do so, the longest such streak in the common draft era.

#### **22222 WIDE RECEIVERS** 22222

Alabama wide receivers **JERRY JEUDY** and **HENRY RUGGS III**, along with Oklahoma wide receiver **CEEDEE LAMB**, are projected to hear their names called in the first round.

If multiple wide receivers are selected in the first round, it would become the 12th consecutive draft to do so, the second-longest streak in the common draft era.

#### ARABA TIGHT ENDS ARABA

Notre Dame's **COLE KMET** and Washington's **HUNTER BRYANT** are expected to be among the first tight ends selected in the 2020 NFL Draft. A tight end has been selected in the first round in five of the past seven drafts, including **T.J. HOCKENSON** (No. 8 overall) in 2019.

#### DEFENSIVE LINE DEPENDENT

Louisville's **MEKHI BECTON**, Georgia's **ANDREW THOMAS**, Alabama's **JEDRICK WILLS** and Iowa's **TRISTAN WIRFS** headline the offensive line class for the 2020 Draft.

If four offensive linemen are chosen in the top-15 picks, it would become the third NFL Draft since 2000 to feature at least four offensive linemen selected in the top 15.

If Joe Burrow is chosen first overall in the 2020 NFL Draft, he would join **JAMARCUS RUSSELL** (2007) as the only players from LSU to be selected with the first pick in the common draft era.

Burrow could also join **CAM NEWTON** (2011) as the only quarterbacks to win the Heisman Trophy and the National Championship in the season leading up to their selection as the first overall pick in the NFL Draft since 1967.

If chosen in the top-five, Burrow would become the fourth offensive player from LSU and first since **LEONARD FOURNETTE** (No. 4 overall in 2017) to be selected with a top-five pick in the common draft era.

Burrow can become the ninth quarterback to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected first overall in the NFL Draft since 1967.

If Burrow is selected first overall, it would mark the first time in the common draft era that a Heisman Trophy winner was selected No. 1 in three consecutive drafts.

# FOUR PROBLEM FOUR PLAYERS IN 1ST ROUND



With quarterback Tua Tagovailoa, wide receivers Jerry Jeudy and Henry Ruggs III, and offensive lineman Jedrick Wills, Alabama is expected to have four offensive players taken in the first round of the 2020 NFL Draft.

If all four players are chosen in the first round, Alabama would join USC in 1968 as the only schools to have four offensive players selected in the first round of a single Draft in the common draft era.
