**THE MATCHUP**

The Saints, now in sole possession of the NFC South lead at 6-2, get to spend the next two Sundays at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome, starting with a 3:25 matchup with the 49ers on Nov. 15. The Saints are at least 6-2 at midseason for the fourth consecutive season and having captured their last five, have had winning streaks of at least five contests, serves as the backbone of each of those campaigns. This will be the second consecutive season that the Saints host their old NFC West rivals, where both clubs resided from 1970-2001.

San Francisco (4-5) leads the regular season series 48-26-2, including a 48-46 victory on Dec. 8, 2019 that gave the 49ers the edge in the NFC's number one postseason seed. But New Orleans is 8-3 in the last 11 meetings.

New Orleans comes off dominating 38-3 Sunday night victory over the Buccaneers at Raymond James Stadium, to secure the second consecutive season sweep of the division rivals who dropped to 6-3, extended their winning streak to five and improved to 3-0 in NFC South matchups.

The win featured nearly flawless performances on offense, defense, special teams, as the Saints handed the Buccaneers a 35-point loss, tied for the worst home loss in their history, while the pewter's signal-caller **Tom Brady**

was dealt his first season sweep of his career.

The win featured sparkling performances on offense by quarterbacks **Drew Brees** and **Taysom Hill** and their skill players, 137 yards rushing against what was the NFL's top -ranked run defense and only one sack surrendered. The 20-year veteran was efficient, posting a 135.2 passer rating, but completing 26 of 32 passes for 222 yards, four touchdowns and zero interceptions.

Hill enjoyed his most versatile and productive performance of 2020, completing both passes for 48 yards, leading the Saints rushing attack with seven carries for 54 yards (7.7 avg.) and catching a 21-yard pass from Brees, while serving as the punt protector on special teams.

The defense put together their most stout performance of 2020 at Tampa Bay. The unit held the Buccaneers scoreless until 5:52 remained and Tampa Bay mustered only 194 total net yards, including only eight on the ground on five attempts. DE **Trey Hendrickson** posted two sacks to increase his season total to 7.5, third in the NFL.

Special teams played their role in helping New Orleans win the field position battle. WR/RS **Deonte Harris** returned three punts for 30 yards, K **Wil Lutz** and P **Thomas Morstead** were flawless in limited action and the coverage group allowed only 47 kickoff punt return yards.

New Orleans Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** was born in San Mateo, Calif. Saints Wide Receivers Coach **Ronald Curry** served on the San Francisco staff from 2013-15, tutoring the 49ers wideouts in 2015. Saints Senior Offensive Assistant **Curtis Johnson** coached wide receivers at the University of California in 1995...Saints defensive end **Cameron Jordan** played at Cal from 2007-10, where he was an All-Pac-10 Conference first-team selection as a senior. Jordan and San Francisco defensive end **Dion Jordan** were high school teammates at Chandler (Ariz.) HS ...New Orleans wide receiver **Emmanuel Sanders** played for San Francisco in 2019...New Orleans guard/tackle **Andrus Peat** played at Stanford from 2012-14, playing in 40 contests, including 27 starts at left tackle...New Orleans Defensive Assistant **Michael Wilhoite** played for San Francisco from 2011-16 and played with 49ers cornerback **Richard Sherman** in Seattle in 2017...Saints running back **Ty Montgomery** played at Stanford...Saints defensive end **Carl Granderson** prepped at Grant (Sacramento, Calif.) HS. Saints defensive tackle **Malcom Brown** and 49ers quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** were teammates in New England from 2015-17...New Orleans guard/center **Nick Easton** spent the first month of the 2015 season with the 49ers. Easton and San Francisco fullback **Kyle Juszczyk** were college teammates at the Harvard...San Francisco Secondary Coach **Tony Oden** served on the New Orleans coaching staff from 2006-11...49ers Assistant Special Teams Coach **Stan Kwan** served in the same position in New Orleans from 2013-16...San Francisco quarterback **Nick Mullens** played at the University of Southern Mississippi...Saints practice squad center/guard **Cameron Tom** blocked for Mullens at Southern Mississippi...New Orleans cornerback **Marshon Lattimore** played with San Francisco defensive lineman **Nick Bosa** at Ohio State in 2016....New Orleans defensive end **Trey Hendrickson** and San Francisco linebacker **Azeez Al-Shaair** were college teammates at Florida Atlantic University...Saints quarterback **Taysom Hill** and 49ers linebacker **Fred Warner** were college teammates at Brigham Young University...Saints wide receiver **Marquez Callaway**, running back **Alvin Kamara** and defensive tackle **Shy Tuttle** played with 49ers cornerback **Emmanuel Mosely** at the University of Tennessee...Saints linebacker **Alex Anzalone**, defensive back **C.J. Gardner Johnson** and San Francisco safety **Marcell Harris** played at the University of Florida together...San Francisco defensive end **Kentavious Street** was tutored by Saints defensive line coach **Ryan Nielsen** at North Carolina State...San Francisco safety **Tarvarius Moore** played at the University of Southern Mississippi...Saints safety **Malcolm Jenkins**, linebacker **Patrick Robinson** and 49ers linebacker **Joe Walker** were teammates in Philadelphia. DATING GAME

This week's game at San Francisco is being played on November 15. The Saints are 3-3 on Nov. 15. New Orleans' first Nov. 15 game was in 1970 in Miami and its last was in 2009 at the St. Louis Rams. The Saints have played this week's opponent, San Francisco twice on the date, splitting a pair of contests at Candlestick Park New Orleans will be looking for it's third consecutive win on the date. The club has faced Miami, Minnesota, the 49ers (twice) and the Rams (twice) on this date. Here is a brief look at New Orleans' Nov. 15 games:

1970 - The Saints lose to the Miami Dolphins 21-10 at the Orange Bowl.

1981 - The Saints lose to the Minnesota Vikings 20-10 at Metropolitan Stadium.

1987 - New Orleans defeats San Francisco 26-24 at Candlestick Park, as K Morten Andersen boots a 40-yard field goal with 1:11 remaining in the contest to improve to 6-3.

1992 - The Saints fall to the 49ers at Candlestick Park 21-20, as San Francisco QB Steve Young connects with TE Brent Jones on an eight-yard touchdown with 46 seconds remaining completing a comeback from a 20-7 deficit in the fourth quarter.

1998 - The Saints drop the St. Louis Rams 24-3 at the Superdome to improve to 5-5 and keep their postseason hopes alive as DT La'Roi Glover had three sacks and DE Joe Johnson chipped in two.

2009 - New Orleans defeats the St. Louis Rams 28-23 at the Edward Jones Dome to improve to 9-0.

THE COACHES

New Orleans Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 145-86 overall record (.628), including an 8-7 postseason mark after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival in 2006. Payton holds both the club's top victory total and winning percentage. Payton is currently ranked 25th all-time in National Football League record books in victories, fifth among active head coaches. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the division, but also among the most accomplished within the NFL. Only the Patriots' Bill Belichick (2000) has been with the his team longer than Payton's 15 seasons. Payton is also one of just eight active National Football League head coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are Belichick, the Seattle Seahawks' Pete Carroll, the Las Vegas Raiders' Jon Gruden (Buccaneers in 2002), the Baltimore Ravens' John Harbaugh, the Dallas Cowboys' Mike McCarthy (Green Bay in 2010), the Philadelphia Eagles' Doug Pederson and the Pittsburgh Steelers' Mike Tomlin. The 2019 Saints edition posted their second consecutive 13-3 regular season record, capturing their third consecutive NFC South title and playoff berth. A franchise-record six players were selected to *Associated Press* All-Pro and a club-best 11 were named to the Pro Bowl. New Orleans won seven games on the road for the second consecutive season. The Saints set an NFL single-season record with only eight turnovers as

they ranked second in the league in turnover ratio (+15). New Orleans also ranked third in sacks (51), tied for third in scoring (28.6 ppg.) and ranked fourth in opponent rushing yards per game. Special teams captured first place in NFL writer Rick Gosselin's annual comprehensive rankings. Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, at the time the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in September of 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013. Payton was born Dec. 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

Kyle Shanahan became the twentieth head coach in San Francisco 49ers franchise history on February 6, 2017 after spending the prior two seasons as offensive coordinator of the Atlanta Falcons. Shanahan has 16 seasons of coaching experience at the National Football League level, including nine seasons as an offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons (2015-16), Cleveland Browns (2014), Washington Redskins (2010-13) and Houston Texans (2008-09). In six of his nine seasons as an offensive coordinator (2008-09, 2012-13 and 2015-16), Shanahan has guided an offense that ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in yards gained. In 2016 with Atlanta, Quarterback Matt Ryan earned league Most Valuable Player honors and threw for a single-season franchise record and career-high 4,944 passing yards and 38 touchdowns under Shanahan. In Shanahan's first season as head coach of San Francisco, the 2017 49ers finished the season winners of five consecutive games. In 2018, the team won two of their final four games. In 2019, Shanahan led the resurgent 49ers to a 13-3 record, the NFC West division title and advanced them to the Super Bowl. In 2020, he has kept San Francisco in the hunt at 4-5 despite devastating injuries at the quarterback position, on the defensive line and in the secondary.

SERIES HISTORY

Foes in the old NFC West from 1970-2001, the New Orleans Saints and the San Francisco 49ers have an extensive regular season history in addition to playing one of the most thrilling games in NFL playoff history. While San Francisco leads the regular season series 48-26-2, New Orleans has captured seven of the last ten regular season meetings. The first meeting between the two clubs was a 27-13 Saints loss on October 22, 1967 in San Francisco's Kezar Stadium during New Orleans' inaugural season. The last meeting was a 41-23 Saints win in overtime at Levi's Stadium on November 6, 2016.

In the 76 regular season games of the series there has been:

- Two seven-game San Francisco winning streaks from 1974-77 and from 1996-99.
- A six-game regular season winning streak for New Orleans from 2002-10.
- A 14-26 record for the Saints in home contests
- 35 games decided by double-digits.
- 12 games decided by 21-or-more points.
- 38 games decided by a touchdown or less.

LAST MEETING

San Francisco 49ers 48, Saints 46; December 8, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The Saints took the 49ers, who now have the NFC's best record (11-2), to the limit before dropping a 48-46 heartbreaker at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.

49ers kicker **Robbie Gould**'s 30-yard field goal as time expired was the difference. After New Orleans jumped out to a 27-14 second quarter lead in scoring touchdowns on their first four offensive possessions, San Francisco took their first lead of the game into halftime at 28-27. After New Orleans regained the lead for a short time in the second half, the 49ers kept the edge for the majority of the third and fourth quarters until QB Drew Brees engineered a seven-play, 76-yard drive with an 18-yard touchdown pass to WR Tre'Quan Smith with 53 seconds left. But San Francisco rallied as 49ers QB **Jimmy Garoppolo** led a seven-play, 63-yard drive to set up the win keyed by a 39-yard completion to TE **George Kittle** on fourth-and-two to set up the game-winner.

WEEK 1: Saints 34, Buccaneers 23; September 13, 2020 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – Drew Brees and Tom Brady, the two leading passers in National Football League history, couldn't muster vintage performances in the first NFL game featuring two starting quarterbacks in their 40s.

But while Brees avoided game-turning mishaps with an offense he's led since 2006, Brady suffered some costly cross-ups with his new team. Brady threw two interceptions in his Tampa Bay debut, Alvin Kamara scored touchdowns running and receiving, and the New Orleans Saints beat the Buccaneers 34-23 on Sunday.

"I made some just bad, terrible turnovers," Brady said. "I obviously have got to do a lot better job."

The first of Brady's interceptions led to Kamara's six-yard touchdown run. The second pick thrown by the new, 43-year-old Bucs QB — who left the Patriots in free agency after 20 years and six Super Bowl triumphs — was returned 36 yards for a touchdown by Janoris Jenkins.

"Win the turnover battle like we did, have a turnover for a touchdown, you're a 90-something percent winner in those games," Saints coach Sean Payton said. "Just a lot of things happened in that game that despite how you play, those things can help you win games. The energy and effort I was pleased with."

The 41-year-old Brees passed for 160 yards and two TDs. He did not turn the ball over and took only one sack. His first TD pass was a dump-off to Kamara from 12 yards out. In the fourth quarter he hit free-agent signing Emmanuel Sanders for a 5-yard score.

"I'd probably say I played awful," Brees said. "Certainly, we are used to playing at a much higher level offensively and especially in the passing game. So, we'll get that back on track."

Still, Brees found satisfaction in beating Brady's Bucs.

"Of course, it's significant and it's unique and I'd be lying to you if I said to you it didn't mean a little bit more," Brees said. "I've got so much love and respect for (Brady) and what he's able to accomplish."

"We played against each other in college, for goodness sake, in 1999," Brees continued. "At the end of the day, I think we'd both pinch ourselves if you told us back then we'd have the opportunity to play this long and be a part of so many great teams and moments, historic moments."

Few witnessed this latest bit of history in person, with government leaders and the Saints having agreed that no fans should attend the opener amid the coronavirus pandemic.

That turned the normally deafening Superdome into more of an echo chamber. When Wil Lutz's field goal put New Orleans up 17-7, the squeaking of pulleys could be heard as the net behind the goalpost was lowered.

Brady compared the environment to "a scrimmage."

"But obviously, it counts," he added. "We've got to look each other in the eye and all work harder, put more urgency on the things we have to do."

TE Jared Cook caught five passes for 80 yards for New Orleans, highlighted by a 46-yard reception down the left side that set up Sanders' TD. Brady was 15 of 28 passing for 157 yards and one TD through the first 54 minutes. He padded his numbers in garbage time, finishing with 239 yards and two TDs, the second scoring strike going to Mike Evans with 2:41 left.

Tampa Bay's opening drive was promising for Brady, who the Bucs hope can lead them to their first playoff appearance since the 2007 season.

He lofted a 26-yard completion to Chris Godwin along the right sideline, drew a pass interference penalty with a 22-yard attempt to Mike Evans and capped the drive with a 2-yard keeper, after which he emphatically spiked the ball.

It was a fleeting, triumphant moment for the Bucs in a game defined more, in the end, by their new star's mistakes.

FORTUITOUS MOVES

The Saints saw two players activated from the practice squad come up with big special teams plays. DL Margus Hunt blocked a 54-yard field goal attempt. WR Bennie Fowler recovered a muffed kickoff at the Tampa Bay 18 in the fourth quarter, setting up a 21-yard field goal that made it 34-17 with 8:01 left.

WEEK 2: Raiders 34, Saints 24; September 21, 2020 @ Allegiant Stadium – After being in control of the contest with a 17-7 lead, the Saints got caught in a hailstorm of a comeback in the desert debut of the NFL in Las Vegas, where the Raiders scored 24 consecutive points in the final

three quarters in a loss that dropped New Orleans to 1-1. Despite struggles on offense, New Orleans seemed to be inching back early in the fourth quarter when CB **P.J. Williams** recovered a fumble by Raiders QB **Derek Carr** at the Saints 40. But New Orleans couldn't get past the Las Vegas 47 and Carr engineered a ten-play, 89-yard drive that ended with a 20-yard rushing TD by RB **Jalen Richard**.

Carr completed 28-of-38 passes for 282 yards, three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 120.7 passer rating, despite being sacked three times.

New Orleans held Las Vegas scoreless on their first two possessions, including one late in the first quarter where DT **David Onyemata** sacked Carr on third down to get the defense off the field. But the momentum quickly changed when the Raiders forced a three-and-out. Carr led Las Vegas on a 11-play, 63-yard drive that ended with a three-yard touchdown pass to FB **Alec Ingold**. The club's then traded touchdowns, but Raiders K **Daniel Carlson** booted a 28-yard field goal as time expired at the half to tie the score.

On the fifth play from scrimmage of the third quarter, Raiders TE **Foster Moreau** had a 31-yard grab from Carr to set up a one-yard touchdown throw to TE **Darren Waller**. Once the Saints got the ball back, their only drive of the third quarter was stunted at the Las Vegas 43-yard line by 35 yards. Following Richard's fourth quarter touchdown, New Orleans would match it with a three-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara**. On Las Vegas' next drive, Carlson kicked a 54-yard field goal, set up by a 29-yard pass interference penalty assessed to CB **Janoris Jenkins**.

WEEK 3: Packers 37, Saints 30; September 27, 2020 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The Saints battled back from four deficits to tie the score at 27-27 on the final play from scrimmage in the fourth quarter on a spectacular 52-yard touchdown reception by RB **Alvin Kamara**, then stopped Green Bay on downs near midfield to put themselves in position to take a fourth quarter lead. But a fumble that set up a field goal, hurt New Orleans' momentum, as well as three defensive penalties on Green Bay's drive, proving to be the difference in the Packers' win.

In a contest that featured seven different lead changes, New Orleans tied the score on the last play from scrimmage of the third quarter at 27-27 when Kamara took a screen pass from QB **Drew Brees** and slithered and broke multiple tackles for the career-long 52-yard receiving touchdown, also moving into first place in franchise history in multiple-score contests (16). S **Malcolm Jenkins** and CB **Marshon Lattimore** then combined to stop Packers RB **Aaron Jones** on a fourth-and-one near midfield.

Following a seven-yard rush by RB **Latavius Murray**, QB **Taysom Hill** fumbled on an option play as it was forced and it was recovered by Green Bay LB **Z'Darius Smith**, setting up a 49-yard field goal by K **Mason Crosby**. On Green Bay's final drive, with the Packers up 30-27 and third-and-three, LB **Demario Davis** jumped offsides, giving QB **Aaron Rodgers** a free play. On it, CB **Janoris Jenkins** was assessed a defensive pass interference penalty at the New Orleans one-yard line, exhausting New Orleans' hopes for a comeback.

Kamara had a huge performance, setting career-highs in both receiving yardage and touchdown receptions with 13 grabs for 139 yards and two scores, adding 58 rushing yards on 12 carries for 187 total yards from scrimmage. Brees completed 29-of-36 passes for 288 yards with three touchdown throws, zero interceptions and a 127.8 passer rating.

Rodgers completed 21-of-32 passes for 283 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 124.9 passer rating. Green Bay WR **Allen Lazard** recorded six catches for 146 yards with one touchdown, including a career-long 72-yard grab. Packers RB **Aaron Jones** rushed 16 times for 69 yards with one touchdown, as the Saints did not surrender 100 yards rushing to a player for the 45th consecutive regular season/postseason contest, now tied for the third-longest streak in National Football League record books.

WEEK 4: New Orleans Saints 35, Detroit Lions 29, October 4, 2020 at Ford Field- The Saints came away with a convincing win against the Lions, showcasing their run game versatility, dominant defense and effective passing game, scoring 35 unanswered points.

The Lions offense put up two touchdowns within the first five minutes of play, displaying an early 14-0 lead against the Saints. The Detroit defense came up with an interception on the Saints' first play, to put them in prime field position. QB **Matthew Stafford** found targets RB **D'Andre Swift** and WR **Kenny Golladay** during their first scores.

Quarterback **Drew Brees** and the Saints offense overcame the two-touchdown deficit, going into the half with a 28-14 lead.

Running backs **Alvin Kamara** and **Latavius Murray** took command of the run game, splitting up touches throughout the game. New Orleans had a total 164 yards rushing, Kamara with 19 carries for 83 yards (4.4 yd avg) and Murray with 14 carries for 64 yards (4.6 yd avg). The run game

capitalized in the red zone, exhibiting Kamara's seventh touchdown this season, as well as two rushing scores from Murray.

Brees and the passing offense were consistent throughout the contest, with two stand out targets, WR **Emmanuel Sanders** and WR **Tre'Quan Smith**. Brees threw for a total of 246 yards, two touchdowns and went 19 for 25. Sanders led the team in receiving, during a breakout game with 6 receptions for 93 yards, his season high. Brees connected with Smith twice in the endzone, giving him (Smith) a total of 4 receptions for 54 yards.

The Saints offense went five-for-five in the red zone against the Lions defense, scoring touchdowns on each attempt.

DE **Cameron Jordan**, DT **David Onyemata** and DE **Trey Hendrickson** led the pass rush, each coming up with one sack apiece. CB **Patrick Robinson** forced a critical turnover, picking off Stafford in the end zone in the second quarter.

- New Orleans' defense was steady on all aspects. The Saints' run defense held the Lions to 90 yards rushing and only allowed a season-low 281 total yards, the first time they gave up under 300 yards this season. Surrendering only 36 yards rushing to Lions RB **Adrian Peterson**, New Orleans has not allowed an opposing running back to reach the century mark for their last 46 regular season and postseason games, the third-longest streak in the National Football League.

- Kamara scored a touchdown for the sixth consecutive regular season game dating back to 2019, tying the franchise mark for consecutive contests with a score.

- Jordan's sack gives him four against Detroit, tying the franchise for fourth among teams on his list of sack victims behind the three NFC South clubs.

- The victory improved New Orleans' all-time regular season record vs. Detroit to 13-12-1, increasing the number of clubs they have a winning record against to nine.

- **Sean Payton** now has 141 career wins in regular season/postseason combined, moving him into a tie with John Fox for 25th all-time in NFL record books.

WEEK 5: New Orleans Saints 30, Los Angeles Chargers 27, October 4, 2020 at Mercedes-Benz Superdome- Wil Lutz kicked a 36-yard field goal with 5:08 left in overtime and New Orleans' defence stopped Chargers receiver Mike Williams just short on fourth down to preserve a 30-27 victory over seemingly star-crossed Los Angeles on Monday night.

Chargers kicker Michael Badgley, who missed his first career point-after kick wide right in the first quarter, had a chance to redeem himself after Williams' leaping catch between two defenders put the Chargers on the Saints' 32-yard line in the final seconds. But Badgley's 50-yard kick as time expired bounced off the right upright.

"The young man has been kicking outstanding. He's got to do better but we could have done some other things better," Chargers coach Anthony Lynn said.

Drew Brees rushed for a 1-yard touchdown and hit tight end Jared Cook for a 41-yard score as the Saints rallied from a 17-point deficit in the second quarter.

"This is how you grow as a team," Brees said. "This is how you become battle-tested — and I think it pays dividends."

Rookie Justin Herbert's fourth touchdown pass of the game, a 64-yarder to Michael Williams, briefly put Los Angeles back in front before the Saints (3-2) tied it on Taysom Hill's nine-yard run with 52 seconds remaining in regulation.

The Chargers (1-4) fell to their fourth straight loss by a touchdown or less, and the second in overtime. They also blew a 17-point lead for a second straight game.

"Never thought this team would lose four straight. We've put ourselves in position, but we didn't get it done," Lynn said. "We have to finish these damn games."

Herbert, who was named the starter for the remainder of the season this week, finished 20 of 34 for 264 yards without an turnover. Five of his completions went to Williams for 109 yards and two TDs.

Brees finished 33 of 47 for 325 yards, including 12 completions to wide receiver Emmanuel Sanders for 122 yards, as his 13 career overtime wins a starting quarterback broke a tie with Tom Brady since it was instituted in the 1974 season. Kamara had 119 yards from scrimmage, highlighted by his leaping, juggling catch along the right sideline over the head of safety Rayshawn Jenkins to set up Hill's tying TD.

In Week Four, it was Tampa Bay's Tom Brady, a six-time Super Bowl winner. This week it was Brees — the NFL's all-time leader in completions, yards and touchdowns.

Brees' dive over a pile of linemen at the goal line made it 20-10 14 seconds before halftime.

Lutz' 53-yard field goal pulled New Orleans within a touchdown in the third quarter. Then Brees found Cook

open behind the Chargers' secondary on third-and-long to tie it early in the fourth quarter.

In staking Los Angeles to an early 20-3 lead, Herbert became the first rookie to pass for three TDs in the first half of a Monday night game.

His first came touchdown pass of the evening when he rolled right away from pressure and fired a 17-yard pass down the sideline to Allen.

Herbert's 49-yard completion to Jalen Guyton set up his four-yard scoring strike to Williams one play later. The touchdown capped a drive extended by a roughing-the-punter penalty against New Orleans running back Dwayne Washington.

Chargers S Nasir Adderly's interception of Brees and 39-yard return to the Saints one-yard line set up Herbert's three-yard scoring pass to tight end Hunter Henry, which made it 20-3.

WEEK 7: New Orleans Saints 27, Carolina Panthers 24, October 25, 2020 at Mercedes-Benz Superdome— The New Orleans Saints earned a hard-fought 27-24 victory over the Carolina Panthers with 3,000 fans in attendance for the first time this season at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on Sunday, Oct. 25

Saints quarterback Drew Brees found a rhythm on the opening possession, driving 75 yards which ended with a four-yard touchdown pass to tight end Jared Cook. The score marked the first time the Saints have scored a touchdown on the opening possession of a game in the 2020 season.

With two of his top targets inactive for the contest, Brees relied on rookie wide receiver Marquez Callaway, wide receiver/return specialist Deonte Harris, wide receiver Tre'Quan Smith and running back Alvin Kamara in the passing game. Star receivers Michael Thomas (hamstring) and Emmanuel Sanders (Covid-19) were absent. Thomas hasn't played since the team's opening week win over Tampa Bay.

Brees completed 29-of-36 passes for 387 yards and two scores. In a standout performance, Callaway hauled in eight catches for 75 yards. The Saints were 12 of 14 on third down and never punted.

The Saints rushing attack, led by Kamara and Latavius Murray, combined for 130 yards on the ground. Kamara also notched eight receptions for 65 yards. After a 16-yard grab in the second half, Kamara joined Roger Craig and Christian McCaffrey as the only players with at least 2,500 rushing and 2,500 receiving yards in their first four seasons in NFL history.

While the New Orleans defense had some struggles, DE-Marcus Davenport stepped up when it mattered most. Davenport sacked former Saints QB Teddy Bridgewater for a eight-yard loss with two minutes remaining, knocking Carolina out of reasonable field goal range. Joey Slye attempted a 65-yard field goal to tie the game, but just came up short.

"I thought the sack on third down was critical," Saints Head Coach Sean Payton said during his postgame press conference. "It put them in a much different position. It was a good win."

Bridgewater, who played two seasons with the Saints before joining Carolina this season, completed 23-of-28 passes for 254 yards, including a 74-yard touchdown strike to wideout D.J. Moore.

WEEK 8: New Orleans Saints 26, Chicago Bears, November 1, 2020 at Soldier Field – The New Orleans Saints earned a 26-23 overtime victory over the Chicago Bears behind the leg of kicker Wil Lutz on a crisp, autumn afternoon at Soldier Field on Sunday, Nov. 1, All Saints Day.

Lutz knocked home a 35-yard field goal with 2:12 left in overtime to secure the fourth consecutive win of the season for New Orleans, which is 5-2 and tied for first with Tampa Bay in the NFC South.

"It was a hard fought game," Saints Coach Sean Payton said during his postgame press conference. "I think in the second half we played better football. It's good when you win an overtime game like that - it's the second one this year. There's a little bit of grit and toughness that I think you begin to build. I don't think you just start with it." Saints quarterback Drew Brees completed 31-of-41 passes for 280 yards and two touchdowns. Brees connected with tight end Jared Cook on a 16-yard touchdown strike with three seconds remaining in the first half, trimming Chicago's lead to 13-10 at the break. Taysom Hill found paydirt late in regulation on a 20-yard pass from Brees, extending the Saints lead to 23-13. On the play Brees surpassed Buccaneers quarterback Tom Brady for most career touchdown passes (560 to 559).

Running back Alvin Kamara hauled in nine passes for 96 yards, finishing with 163 all-purpose yards in the contest. New Orleans' first three offensive possessions of the second half started inside Chicago territory. Return man Deonte Harris set up the Saints offense with excellent field position on a pair of electrifying punt returns, including a 42-yard return setting the Saints up in the red zone midway through the third quarter.

Defensively, New Orleans tallied 5.0 sacks on the afternoon. Defensive end Trey Hendrickson established a new season high (5.5 sacks) on the year with one quarterback takedown. Saints cornerback Marshon Lattimore came up with an interception with 8:34 to play in the third quarter. The takeaway came on the ensuing play after Bears wideout Javon Wims was ejected for throwing multiple

punches at Saints cornerback C.J. Gardner-Johnson. Saints linebacker Demario Davis had an opportunity to seal the win in regulation, but a forward progress call allowed Chicago to maintain possession after Davis forced and jumped on a fumble.

Bears quarterback Nick Foles completed 28-of-41 passes for 272 yards for two touchdowns and one interception. Foles connected with former Tulane Green Wave wideout Darnell Mooney five times for 69 yards and one touchdown. Star receiver Allen Robinson had six receptions for 87 yards and a score. Chicago running back David Montgomery flirted with a 100-yard rushing game, finishing with 21 carries for 89 yards.

WEEK 9: Saints 38, Buccaneers 3; November 8, 2020 @ Raymond James Stadium – Drew Brees vs. Tom Brady, and the battle for the supremacy of the NFC South, was a one-sided affair.

Brees threw for 222 yards and four touchdowns, regaining the NFL career TD pass lead and lifting the New Orleans Saints into first place with a 38-3 rout of Brady and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sunday night.

The three-time defending division champion won their fifth straight game, intercepting Brady three times and completing a season sweep of the Bucs (6-3), who also suffered a double-digit loss at New Orleans in Week 1.

"Each time you can win and find different ways to win, I think it just builds confidence and creates momentum," Brees said.

"Obviously tonight was a great night," he added. "All the way around in all three phases, it was pretty exceptional."

The Saints (6-2) weren't perfect—turning the ball over twice themselves—however the offense was extremely efficient with receivers Michael Thomas and Emmanuel Sanders back in the lineup, and the defense played its best game of the season.

Brees was 26 of 32 passing, including first-half TD throws of 14 yards to Tre'Quan Smith, 8 yards to Adam Trautman and 12 yards to Sanders, who missed the previous two games while on the COVID-19 list. The 41-year old added a three-yarder to Josh Hill to make it 38-0 with just over nine minutes remaining.

"We knew this was a big game, divisional opponent, Tampa's playing extremely well," said Brees, who lost a fumble on Tampa Bay's only sack but did not throw an interception.

"Obviously we're been a little short-handed over the last few weeks ... Tonight, it was good to get them back in the mix," Brees added. "We wanted to spread the ball around, wanted to play complementary football. I can't say enough about our defense, they just played phenomenal."

Brees regained the league career TD pass lead with 564, three more than the 43-year old Brady, who had thrown for 17 touchdowns and just one interception over the previous six games.

Quarterbacks Coach Joe Lombardi - The grandson of legendary National Football League head coach Vince Lombardi, who led both Green Bay and Washington. He led the Packers to three straight and five overall NFL Championships in seven years, in addition to winning the first two Super Bowls.

Secondary Coach Aaron Glenn - Younger brother, Jason, was a linebacker and sixth-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in the 2001 NFL Draft, playing six seasons with the New York Jets, Miami Dolphins and Minnesota Vikings.

Offensive Assistant D.J. Williams - Father, Doug Wil-

liams, is the Washington Football Club's Senior Vice President/Player Development, who won Super Bowl XXII as starting quarterback for the Redskins, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year pro football career, which includes him being in the Tampa Bay Buccaneers Ring of Honor, also working in the Buccaneers front office.

Vice President/Asst. GM-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame LB/C E.J. Holub. Grandson of Eagles running back and Bears personnel exec. Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, is Director of Player Personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

Linebacker Demario Davis - Cousin Steve McNair was a former standout quarterback for the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1995-2005) and Baltimore Ravens (2006-07).

Quarterback Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon played linebacker and on special teams for the Raiders (2009), Houston Texans (2010) and St. Louis Rams (2010-11).

Cornerback Janoris Jenkins - Cousin, Pernell McPhee plays linebacker for the Ravens (2011-14, 2019-present) and also played for the Bears (2015-17) and Washington (2018).

Linebacker Kaden Elliss - Father, Luther was a former first round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in 1995 and played ten years in the NFL and was selected to two Pro Bowls.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2020 Saints offensive line:

Left Tackle Terron Armstead - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. He's opened 79 regular season games and seven postseason contests and has been selected to the Pro Bowl the past two seasons, as well as being selected as the club's 2019 Man of the Year and the team nominee for the NFL's Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award. Armstead has opened all eight contests this season for a unit tied for surrendering the second-fewest takedowns.

Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college offensive linemen in 2014. In his first six seasons, Peat's played in 69 games with 63 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. He opened ten contests at left guard in 2019, returning to action in Week 17 after missing five contests, being named to the Pro Bowl for the second consecutive season.

Center/Guard Nick Easton - Originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Baltimore Ravens out of Harvard, Easton developed into a starting swing guard/center by his second season and opened 18 contests for Minnesota. The North Carolina native signed with New Orleans in 2019 to provide interior depth and started five consecutive contests at left guard in place of an injured Peat, the final four where the Saints surrendered only three takedowns. Easton has started four games at right guard and one at left guard in 2020.

Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, viewed by many as one of the best linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he was an AP All-Pro selection at right tackle in 2018, not missing an offensive snap in both postseason contests and all 15 regular games at the right tackle position that he played in. Ramczyk opened all 16 regular season games in 2019 to serve as a dominating bookend to Armstead, earning first-team All-Pro honors.

Center/Guard Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies offensive line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, as he ably replaced the retired Max Unger, opening all 16 regular season contests. McCoy has opened the first eight contests in 2020. He has not missed an offensive snap.

Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in his college career, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten as a junior in

2019. Ruiz has played at right guard in the last seven games, with four starts including in Sunday night's win at Tampa Bay, when the Black and Gold gave up only one sack..

Guard/Tackle Derrick Kelly II - This 6-5, 320 pound former four-year starter on the Florida State line was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2019, possessing the flexibility to play both tackle and guard. After spending his rookie season on the practice squad, Kelly increased strength in the 2020 offseason and made big strides in training camp, securing a roster spot and serving as a jumbo tight end, as well as a contributor on special teams.

Tackle/Guard James Hurst - A seven-year NFL veteran who was signed as an unrestricted free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 93 career regular season starts at three different positions on the inside and outside.

Offensive Lineman Ethan Greenidge - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at Villanova, Greenidge started 43 contests for the Wildcats. The Long Island, N.Y. native was signed by New Orleans as a free agent after the 2019 NFL Draft and after adjusting to the physical and mental rigors of the pro game in 2019, he has appeared in six contests in 2020.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last six NFL Drafts from 2015-20, New Orleans has shown a commitment to improving the defense, spending 18-of-32 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in the 2015 NFL Draft, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine defensive players in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the players selected by New Orleans from 2015-20 on the 53-man roster:

Linebacker Alex Anzalone, Florida (D3b-17) - Selected in the third round (76th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Anzalone posted 53 tackles as a senior through the first eight games before suffering a forearm injury. Anzalone enjoyed a breakout campaign in 2018, when he played in all 16 games and finished with 59 tackles, two sacks, an interception and three forced fumbles. Fully recovered from a shoulder injury that limited him to two games in 2019, Anzalone returns to the starting lineup in 2020 after a successful rehab and has posted 32 tackles (15 solo) through seven contests.

Linebacker Zack Baun, Wisconsin (D3a-20) - Selected in the third round (74th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft, Baun finished his college career with 154 tackles, 15 sacks, two interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, six passes defended, three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. The Saints were attracted to his playmaking ability that he displayed for the Badgers in 2019, when he ranked second in the Big Ten with a 19.5 stops for loss and 12 sacks (second among Power Five linebackers in both categories). Baun's contributed on special teams and defense the last seven contests posting three defensive stops and three coverage tackles.

Defensive Back C.J. Gardner-Johnson, Florida (D4-19) - Possessing a combination of instincts and speed, this Florida native was a solid value in the fourth round after playing in all 13 games with 12 starts for the Gators in 2018, when he posted 71 tackles, three sacks and four interceptions with two brought back for touchdowns. Gardner-Johnson appeared in all 16 contests with seven starts in 2019, recording 46 tackles (35 solo), one interception, eight passes defended, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and three special teams stops, adding three stops and a pass defense in the playoff game. He ranks third on the team with 40 stops (35 solo) in 2020.

Defensive End Trey Hendrickson, Florida Atlantic (D3c-17) - This third round draft choice in the 2017 NFL Draft (103rd overall) out of Florida Atlantic brought his raw talent, size, strength and speed to a youthful Saints defensive line. Hendrickson was ranked third on the team with a career-high 4.5 sacks in 2019, adding one more takedown in the postseason. Hendrickson picked up where he left off in 2020, leading the team with a career-high 7.5 sacks, ranked third in the NFL.

CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17) - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft out of Ohio State and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. . For the 2017 season, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and was selected as *AP* Defensive Rookie of the Year. His five takeaways (two interceptions and three fumble recoveries) in 2018 led the team, adding two more picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win. In the Sept. 22 win at Seattle, Lattimore led New Orleans with a career-high 12 tackles (career-high ten solo). For his efforts in

2019, Lattimore was selected to his second Pro Bowl after posting a club-best 14 passes defended. He leads the cornerbacks with 38 tackles, one interception and three passes defended.

Defensive Tackle David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16) - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks. Onyemata had a career-high 4.5 sacks in 2018, including a single-game career best three takedowns in at Dallas/ Onyemata provided a punch for the Saints defense, having started all 15 games that he has played in and recording 32 stops and three sacks to tie for fourth on the team, while being a key run-stopping cog to the NFL's fourth-ranked rush defense, being re-signed to a three-year contract in the offseason. Onyemata has three sacks and one interception.

Defensive End Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18) - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, playing an important role in the club's packages in 2018, recording 4.5 sacks. Davenport posted six sacks in 13 games. After missing the first four games with injuries in 2020, he returned in Week Five and has made a big impact in the front. In Week Seven, his sack of Carolina QB Teddy Bridgewater in the fourth quarter forced an unsuccessful 65-yard field goal attempt. He added a split sack in the week eight overtime win at Chicago.

Safety Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17) - A three-year starter at the University of Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American as a junior when he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read offenses and make breaks on the football. His athleticism showed in his rookie season in as he made 70 tackles, four interceptions and six passes defended, adding ten more stops (seven solo) and another pick in the postseason. In 2019, he played in all 15 games with 14 starts, posting 52 tackles (35 solo), the team-high four picks, tied for eighth in the National Football League, 13 passes defended, a forced fumble and two coverage stops. In 2020, he has 30 stops, three passes defended and a club-best two picks.

Cornerback P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15) - Williams' career was initially limited by missing all but two games his first two seasons with a hamstring injury (2015) and a concussion (2016), but he's rebounded to miss only one game with injury since. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners, in 2019, he made 41 stops, a sack, an interception, three passes defended and one special teams stop, serving as the team's nickel corner for the second straight season. In the Dec. 22, 2019 win at Tennessee, Williams further showed his versatility by making the switch to safety after Marcus Williams was forced to depart with a groin injury and then starting in Williams' place in the regular season finale at Carolina. Williams was re-signed in the offseason by the club, and has posted 17 tackles, one fumble recovery and three special teams stops in seven contests, seeing action at both cornerback and safety with one start.

STOPPING THE RUN

In rush defense, the Saints gave up only 80.2 net yards per game in 2018, second in the NFL after giving up 129.4 per game in 2017. The 2019 Saints finished ranked fourth in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game (91.3). 2018-19 marked only the second time they did so in back-to-back seasons in franchise history, joining the 1986—1987 teams. The Saints produced their most impressive run-stopping effort in several seasons in 2018 and carried it over in 2019 and 2020. Between deep touchdown passes and athletic interceptions, players often use their hands to produce the game's flashiest plays. However, players using their feet make the difference between winning and losing, drilling clutch field goals or flipping the field with a well-executed punt.

K **Wil Lutz** went undrafted in 2016, joining the Ravens for training camp. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lutz joined the Black and Gold and immediately took on placekicking and kickoff duties. Lutz has kicked in 72 games, converting 135-of-153 field goal attempts (88.2 percent) and 224-of-230 PATs. He's recorded 276 touchbacks. His 88.2 percent field goal percentage is best among kickers with at least 50 made field goals in team history. Until the 2018 regular season finale, he'd kicked a field goal in a club-record 36 consecutive games, second-longest streak in NFL history

With his first field goal on Oct. 20, 2019 at Chicago, Lutz set the NFL record for consecutive road field goals.

Thomas Morstead was the first punter drafted by the Saints since 1984. The club's fifth round draft choice (164th overall) in 2009 from Southern Methodist University, Morstead's been a weapon in the field position game with his strong leg and outstanding placement abilities. In 12 seasons, he has a gross average of 46.6 on 655 punts with a 41.5 net and 240 punts inside the 20-yard line, while also booming 259 kickoffs in the end zone for touchbacks. SWISS ARMY KNIFE

QB **Taysom Hill**, in his fourth season with the club, has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints on offense and special teams. A participant on virtually every special teams unit except field goal and PAT, as well as the back-up signal-caller and as a runner and receiver on offense, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops to rank second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt in Week Four and blocked a punt, Dec. 9 at Tampa Bay. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), ranked third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt earned him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the 2018 postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt.

In 2019, Hill appeared in every contest, carrying 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with one touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six touchdowns, deflecting a punt, returning one kickoff for 12 yards and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in total touchdowns and third in receiving touchdowns. After a multi-threat performance on Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first NFL quarterback to both rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Chicago's Jim McMahon in 1983. In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass to Deonte Harris.

In 2020, Hill has continued to contribute on multiple facets on offense and special teams, completing four of five passes for 86 yards, rushing 26 times for 141 (5.4 avg.) yards with one touchdown, catching six passes for 74 yards with one touchdown. and playing on several special teams units. In the Oct. 12 win over the Chargers, his nine-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter tied the score for the first time in the eventual come-from-behind victory. Hill added his first receiving touchdown of 2020, a 20-yard grab in the Nov. 1 overtime win at Chicago. In Sunday night's win at Tampa Bay, Hill led the Saints in rushing with seven carries for 54 yards, completed both passes for 48 yards and had a 21-yard grab.

Hardee led the team with nine stops and a blocked punt recovered for a touchdown as a rookie in 2017. In 2018, Hardee led the team with a career-high ten stops, with Hill ranked second with six. He posted five tackles in 2019 and leads the club with six stops in 2020 before being placed on Injured Reserve prior to the Week Nine contest at Tampa Bay.

Robertson, one of the club's special teams captains, also made a big play in the November. 4, 2019 win over the Los Angeles Rams when he stopped Rams holder Johnny Hekker short of the first down marker on a fake field goal attempt. He did the same on Dec. 23, 2018 vs. Pittsburgh in a crucial fourth quarter situation to snuff out a fake punt attempt. Robertson has been voted as a captain of the coverage units for the third consecutive season and has two stops.

In another addition to the club's special teams units, Gray led the team in 2019 with 17 stops, blocked a punt and recovered a fumble on a muffed punt as he was selected an *Associated Press* second-team All-Pro. Gray has three stops in 2020

A seventh round draft pick of New Orleans in 2019, Elliss' blue collar mentality has fit in with the coverage units as he rebounded from a season-ending knee injury in his rookie season to have three stops in 2020.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

Special teams played a key role in the team's season opening 34-23 win over Tampa Bay on September 13. Two players called up from the practice squad the day before made a significant impact, wide receiver **Bennie Fowler III** and defensive lineman **Margus Hunt**. Early in the fourth quarter with New Orleans leading 31-17, the Saints took advantage of a facemask penalty on New Orleans' prior touchdown to have it assessed on the kickoff. Fowler then recovered a muffed return on a short kickoff at the Tampa Bay 18-yard line to help set up a Lutz field goal. Late in the second quarter with New Orleans leading 14-7, the 6-9 Hunt blocked a 54-yard field goal attempt to eventually put Lutz in position to drill a 29-yard field goal. Morstead captured NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors, punting six times for a 44.0 net punting average with five punts inside the 20.

Special teams also played a key role in the team's Oct. 12 30-27 overtime win over the Chargers. Lutz was a perfect three-of-three, booting field goals of 48, 53 and 36 yards. His shortest came in overtime to give New Orleans their first lead of the contest as he was named NFC Special Teams Player of the Week. Rookie wide receiver **Marquez Callaway** filled in for an injured Deonte Harris in the return game and brought back six punts for 69 yards and returned two kickoffs for 57 yards. In overtime, running back **Alvin Kamara's** 31-yard kickoff return gave New Orleans favorable starting field position at their 34-yard line for the game-winning drive.

Every facet of special teams made a difference in the November 1 26-23 overtime win at Chicago. Lutz booted four-of-five field goals, including the 35-yard game winner in overtime. Chicago averaged only 15.3 yards per return on four kickoff returns, with two stopped at the 11- and 13-yard lines. Harris averaged 22.3 yards on three punt returns, including a season-long 42-yard runback. Hardee led the units with two stops.

RETURN UNITS

Wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harris** has made an impact on New Orleans' return game since being picked up an undrafted free agent in 2019. Harris was signed following the NFL Draft out of NCAA Division II Assumption, where he finished his college career as one of the most prolific returners in NCAA history. In the final game of his college career, he set the NCAA-All Division record for career combined return touchdowns (14).

In 2019, Harris brought back 36 punts for 338 yards (9.4 avg.), ranked first in the NFC and fourth in the National Football in punt return average, ranked second among

rookies, following a 53-yard runback for a touchdown in the first quarter of the Sept. 22 33-27 win at Seattle.

He also returned 24 kickoffs for 644 yards (26.8 avg.), second in the NFC and third in the NFL and has recorded one special teams stop. On offense Harris carried twice for 18 yards (9.0 avg.) and caught six passes for 24 yards.

Harris is the first player signed by New Orleans as an undrafted rookie following the draft to be selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie.

DREW BREES

- Since first signing with New Orleans in 2006 and starting all 224 regular season games he has appeared in, a club record in both categories, Brees leads the NFL with 67,188 passing yards, 484 touchdown passes, 8,637 attempts, 5,953 completions, a 68.9 completion percentage, 115 games with at least 300 yards passing, 16 with at least 400, 510 completions of 25 yards or more and stands at third in the league with a 101.6 passer rating.
- Since signing with the Saints, Brees threw for 4,000 or more yards in his first 12 seasons with the club before sitting out the 2018 regular season finale at 3,992 and became the only National Football League signal-caller to throw for 5,000 yards five different times and ranked at or near the top in every passing category.
- In 11 regular season games sandwiched between a right thumb injury in 2019, Brees enjoyed another standout season as he completed 281-of-378 passes (74.3%) for 2,979 yards with 27 touchdowns, four interceptions and a career-high 116.3 passer rating. Brees finished ranked first in the NFL in completion percentage, second in passer rating and fourth in fourth quarter passer rating (110.2).
- Through the first eight contests of 2020, Brees has completed 211-of-285 passes (74.0%) for 2,120 yards, 17 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 110.3 passer rating, while also rushing for two touchdowns Brees leads the NFL in completion percentage, ranks fourth in passer rating and fifth in third down passer rating (116.2).
- Brees has been selected to play in a team-record 12 Pro Bowls as a Saint, with 13 overall berths in the National Football League's all-star game, three times as a starter, including his most recent selection in 2019. His seven consecutive selections (2008-14) as a Saint is tied for first in club history with Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle William Roaf and Brees has been a Pro Bowl selection for the last four campaigns.

564 touchdown passes and a 98.7 passer rating. He stands as the NFL's all-time most accurate passer and is also the leader in attempts, completions, passing yards and touchdown passes.

BREES VS. 49ERS

Sunday's contest against San Francisco has added significance as New Orleans will be looking to hold onto or add to their half game lead in the NFC South over Tampa Bay, as remain in the thick for the NFC's number one seed in the playoffs.

In ten regular season starts against the 49ers, nine as a Saint, Brees has completed 269-of-400 passes for 3,011 yards with 27 touchdowns, only seven interceptions and a 104.7 passer rating. Below is an overview of several of Brees' greatest moments vs. San Francisco

October 28, 2007 - After an 0-4 start to the 2007 season, Brees led the Saints all the way back to 4-4, completing 31-of-39 passes (79.5%) for 336 yards, four touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 136.8 passer rating in a 31-10 win.

September 28, 2008 - Brees helped New Orleans snap a two-game losing streak, completing 23-of-35 passes for 363 yards, three touchdowns, one interception and a 116.7 passer rating in a 31-17 win.

September 20, 2010 - In a 25-22 win on Monday Night Football at Candlestick Park, Brees completed 28-of-38 passes (73.7%) for 254 yards, two touchdowns and a 108.9 passer rating in a contest decided by a 37-yard Garrett Harley field goal as time expired with Brees leading a seven-play, 51-yard drive where he completed four-of-six passes for 56 yards, including a 30-yard completion to WR Marques Colston.

January 7, 2012 - Brees completed 40-of-63 passes for 462 yards with four touchdowns in an NFC Divisional Playoff thriller, the sixth-highest postseason yardage total in NFL history. Brees led New Orleans back from a 17-0 deficit to take a 24-23 lead late in the fourth quarter with three more lead changes in a 36-32 loss.

November 6, 2016 - Brees completed 28-of-39 passes for 323 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 122.1 passer rating in a 41-23 win in their first trip to Levis Stadium.

He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in total yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

• Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *AP* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

Despite missing two games (knee/ankle) in 2019, Kamara finished ranked third in the NFL in receptions by running backs with 81, tying his career-high. Kamara also led New Orleans in rushing, carrying 171 times for 797 yards (4.7) and five touchdowns. With 1,330 total yards from scrimmage, Kamara joined Deuce McAllister (2002-04) as only the second Saint to have 1,300 total yards from scrimmage in three consecutive seasons. Kamara accomplished the feat in his first three seasons. He also became the only Saints running back to be selected to three consecutive Pro Bowls as well as three Pro Bowls overall.

LATAVIUS MURRAY

- Originally a sixth round pick of the Raiders in the 2013 NFL Draft out of the University of Central Florida, the versatile back brings a bruising style to the Black and Gold to complement Kamara. Signed as an unrestricted free agent from the Minnesota Vikings in 2019, Murray has appeared in 101 career games with 59 starts for the Raiders, Vikings and Saints, carrying 1,126 times for 4,656 yards (4.1 avg.) with 41 touchdowns and catching 174 passes for 1,212 yards, including his first career receiving touchdown scored vs. Arizona on October 27, 2019.

- In his first season in New Orleans, Murray played in all 16 games for the third consecutive season with seven starts, carrying 146 times for 637 yards (4.4 avg.) with five touchdowns to tie for the team lead and also caught 34 passes for 235 yards with his first career receiving touchdown, to rank third on the club in overall scores. He has been a member of four teams since being selected in the third round (82nd overall) of the 2010 NFL Draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers, and has appeared in 150 games with 106 starts over that period. In his long career marked by big play ability, he has accumulated 8,235 receiving yards off 631 catches (13.1 avg.), recording 45 touchdowns.

• After spending the final four games of the 2018 campaign with the Denver Broncos on Injured Reserve with a ruptured Achilles tendon, Sanders went through an aggressive rehab and in a season split between the Broncos and San Francisco 49ers, appeared in 17 games with 16 starts and posted 66 receptions for 869 yards with five touchdowns, also tossing a 35-yard touchdown in San Francisco's matchup with New Orleans as his acquisition played an important role in the 49ers run to the Super Bowl.

• For the season, Sanders has posted 30 receptions for 342 yards with three scoring grabs as his connection with Drew Brees heats up with an increasing familiarity with the Saints offense and his teammates, this showing in the October 12 win over the Los Angeles Chargers, when he posted a career-high 12 grabs for 122 yards.

MARCUS DAVENPORT

• Trading up to the 14th spot in the 2018 NFL Draft, the Saints addressed the line and the pass rush with this gifted pass rusher, only the second draft choice ever from Texas-San Antonio. During four college seasons, Davenport notched totals of 186 tackles (97 solo), 22 sacks, 38 tackles for loss, six forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one returned for a touchdown and eight passes defended, finishing his career as the school's all-time leader for stops for loss, takedowns and quarterback hurries (21). In 13 games as a rookie, Davenport posted 22 tackles (12 solo), four sacks, two passes defended and one forced fumble. He served as a solid bookend opposite Jordan in 2019, starting all 12 games before being placed on Injured Reserve and posting 29 stops, six sacks and four forced fumbles.

• After recovering from toe and elbow injuries, Davenport made his debut in the team's win over the Chargers, Oct. 12, recording two quarterback hits and a pass defense. Vs. Carolina, Oct. 25, his fourth quarter sack of Panthers QB Teddy Bridgewater forced them to attempt an unsuccessful 65-yard field goal attempt. He added half a sack in New Orleans overtime win at Chicago, November 1. On Sunday night at Tampa Bay, his deflected pass was picked up by defensive tackle David Onyemata for a pick..

TREY HENDRICKSON

- Selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft, Hendrickson came to the Saints from Florida Atlantic, where he departed the school with a team-record 29.5 career sacks. Hendrickson has appeared in 28 career games in three seasons, recording 35 tackles (22 solo), six takedowns, two passes defended and two forced fumbles. Following an offseason, where he made significant strides in the weight room and with his technique, Hendrickson's hard work paid off with two sacks in the Sept. 9, 2019 season-opening win over Houston followed up by a takedown/forced fumble in Week Two at the Los Angeles Rams and one on Thanksgiving night at Atlanta. In his breakthrough campaign, he had 19 tackles, 4.5 sacks to rank fourth on the club and added one more takedown in a postseason contest.

- Hendrickson has started the first eight games of 2020, he leads the team with 7.5 sacks to rank third in the NFL.

CARL GRANDERSON

- Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming, Granderson posted 17.5 career sacks in college and possesses the perfect body type for a pass rusher. As a rookie, Granderson appeared in eight regular season contests, posting ten tackles and one sack as he moved into the defensive line rotation in December and is expected to see more action in 2020.

- Granderson posted a quarterback takedown and a forced fumble as he joined Hendrickson in a rotation to replace the injured Davenport in the season opener vs. Tampa Bay, posting three total tackles in 2020 and has added five tackles, one forced fumble and one pass defended.

DEFENSIVE TACKLES**MALCOM BROWN**

- This former first round draft pick out of the University of Texas was a vital part of a Patriots defensive line that helped pick up two Super Bowl championships in the last three seasons. The University of Texas product has been a run-stopping force in the New England defensive line for the past four seasons and now with New Orleans after signing as an unrestricted free agent in the offseason, playing in 83 career games with 74 starts and recording career totals of 235 tackles (125 solo), ten sacks, one forced fumble and four fumble recoveries. Brown supplemented the middle a Saints defense that finished the 2019 regular sea-

son fourth in opponent rushing yards per game, posting 1.5 sacks and one fumble recovery in all 16 contests as well as 34 stops, adding one more split sack in the NFC Wild Card Playoff loss.

- Brown has opened all eight contests posting 16 tackles (five solo) and one sack in providing a line of defense for the NFL's third-ranked run defense.

DAVID ONYEMATA

- A fourth round selection out of Manitoba in 2016, Onyemata teams with Brown to form a solid duo in the interior of the Saints defensive line. In 64 games with 26 starts in four seasons, he has posted 141 career tackles, 9.5 sacks, two passes defended and one forced fumble. In 16 games with four starts in 2018, Onyemata posted 36 tackles, in helping with a run defense ranked second in the National Football League. On Nov. 29, 2018 vs. Dallas, he enjoyed a breakout performance with career-highs in tackles (seven), Quarterback takedowns (three) and forced fumbles (one). In 2019, he opened all 15 regular season games he played in, posting 32 stops, one pass defended and three sacks for the NFL's fourth-ranked run defense. Onyemata was re-signed to a three-year contract by the Saints in the offseason and is ranked second on the team with three quarterback takedowns and added an interception in Sunday night's win at Tampa Bay.

SHELDON RANKINS

- The third defensive lineman selected in the 2016 NFL Draft out of Louisville, Sheldon Rankins started all 16 games in 2017 posting 26 tackles (16 solo), two sacks for loss of 13 yards, one interception, one pass defended and one forced fumble. He helped a defensive unit that went from 31st in the NFL, allowing 28.4 points per game in 2016 to allowing 20.4 points per game in 2017, good for tenth in the league. In 2018, Rankins had a career-high 40 tackles (26 solo), a forced fumble and a career-best eight sacks to rank second on the club and fifth in the National Football League among defensive tackles.

- In 2019, after ardent rehabilitation from a ruptured Achilles tendon, Rankins returned to the lineup in Week Four and contributed two sacks to the defensive line rotation, being voted by his teammates as the team's Ed Block Courage Award winner. The outlook is optimistic for Rankins in 2020 with his injuries further behind him, having recorded his first sack of the season in the Oct. 12 contest against the Chargers.

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

- This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints after a breakout 2017, where he started 16 games for the New York Jets. Davis posted a team-high and career-high 165 tackles (112 solo) and a career-best five sacks. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 134 games with 120 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and Saints, recording 928 tackles (623 solo), 24.5 sacks, two interceptions, 35 passes defended, three forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries and 24 special team stops.

- In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the National Football League in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

- After agreeing to a three-year contract extension on Sunday, the defensive team captain went out and posted six tackles and sacked Buccaneers signal-caller Tom Brady in the September 13 season-opening win vs. Tampa Bay and has filled up the stat sheet with 47 tackles (33 solo) to tie for the team lead, two sacks and two passes defended.

CRAIG ROBERTSON

- In just his first year with the Saints in 2016, Robertson quickly became one of the defense's most important members. Robertson joined the Saints looking to contribute on defense and special teams, yet his production outpaced

even the highest expectations, posting 201 tackles, three interceptions and three fumble recoveries in his first two seasons. In 2018 and 2019, while he continued to contribute on defense he has served the as captain of the club's coverage units on special teams. Robertson, who has 554 career defensive stops and 49 special teams tackles, provides depth at all three linebacker positions and outstanding leadership to the defense and special teams units.

ALEX ANZALONE

- One of three third round picks in 2017, Anzalone came to the Saints after a solid career at the University of Florida. In his rookie season, Anzalone started four games before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury and posted 16 tackles, a sack and a pass defended. In 16 games with seven starts in 2018, posted 59 tackles (34 solo), two sacks, one interception, two passes defended and three forced fumbles.

- After missing the last 15 regular season and postseason contests of 2019 with a shoulder injury, Anzalone has opened the first eight contests of 2020 at middle linebacker, recording 32 tackles (15 solo).

SECONDARY

MARSHON LATTIMORE

- Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

- In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs. Lattimore also added two picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia.

- A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

OUT OF THE MARSH

- In the season-opening, September 13 34-23 win vs. Tampa Bay, Lattimore was assigned to wideout Mike Evans, who recorded only one two-yard touchdown reception late in the fourth quarter with New Orleans already 34-17.
- In New Orleans 30-27 overtime win over the Los Angeles Chargers on Monday night, October 12, Lattimore saved the game and brought home victory with a tackle of Chargers wideout Mike Williams on fourth down, one yard short of the first down marker.
- In New Orleans' 26-23 overtime win at Chicago, Lattimore recorded his first interception of 2020.

JANORIS JENKINS

- A nine-year NFL veteran who was originally a second round draft pick of the St. Louis Rams in 2012, Jenkins has shown a nose for the ball during his stints with the Rams (2012-15), New York Giants (2016-19) and since joining the Saints prior to Week 16 of the 2019 campaign. He has played in 121 games with 118 starts, posting 514 tackles two sacks, 24 interceptions, with eight returned for touchdowns, 115 passes defended, six forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one blocked field goal and one return of a blocked field goal for a touchdown.

END ZONE LEADER

Affectionately nicknamed "Jackrabbit", Jenkins picked off Buccaneers signal-caller Tom Brady and returned it 36 yards into the end zone in the club's 2020 season opening win over Tampa Bay and moved into a tie for eighth all-time in NFL records.

MARCUS WILLIAMS

- After being selected in the second round of the 2017 NFL Draft (42nd overall) out of the Utah, this ball-hawking safety has started all 50 games he has appeared in, recording 195 tackles (153 solo), one sack, 11 interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, 23 passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. With a pick in his second consecutive season opener, Williams' 11 picks since being drafted is tied for ninth in the NFL over that period, tied for third among safeties.

- Williams opened 2019 in impressive fashion, recording a key third quarter pick in the Monday night win over Houston and posting a pick at the end of the Sept. 29 win vs. Dallas. He finished with 53 tackles (38 solo), the four interceptions to tie his career-high, with one returned for a touchdown, tied for third in the NFL, a career-best 13 passes defended, a forced fumble and two coverage stops.

MALCOLM JENKINS

- Returning to New Orleans this offseason after six seasons in Philadelphia, Malcolm Jenkins is one of the NFL's most intelligent and instinctive defensive backs. One of only two safeties in Saints history to be selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro, Jenkins has played in 175 career games with 166 starts and has career totals of 1,161 tackles (823 solo), 12 sacks, 18 interceptions, with six returned for touchdowns, 122 passes defended, 15 forced fumbles, nine fumble recoveries, one special teams fumble recovery, one blocked field goal and 44 special teams stops. He has also played in 12 postseason contests with 10 starts and has recorded 73 tackles (52) solo, two sacks and five passes defended.

- The three-time Pro Bowler started all 16 regular season games at safety for the sixth straight campaign in 2019 and finished with a team-high 118 tackles (82 solo), a career-high four forced fumbles, a career-high tying 2.5 tackles, 12 passes defended and one fumble recovery. He added ten stops and a sack in Philadelphia's playoff game for the NFC East champions. In his 2020 Saints return, Jenkins is tied for first on the team with 47 tackles (34 solo), one sack, one interception and a club-best six passes defended through the first seven contests of 2020, playing virtually every defensive snap, after being voted by his teammates as a team captain.

SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- With the win, the Saints improve to 6-2 on the season and sweep the season series with Tampa Bay for the second consecutive year. New Orleans returns to action on Sunday, November 15 when they take on the San Francisco 49ers at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome. Kickoff is set for 3:25pm CT on Fox.
- New Orleans has won each of its last five games and now has at least a five-game winning streak in four consecutive seasons for the first time in franchise history. The 6-2 start also gives New Orleans at least a 6-2 mark at the season's midpoint for the fourth consecutive season – the first such four-year stretch in club history.
- With the win, New Orleans' record against Tampa Bay improves to 37-21 all-time and 17-9 all-time on the road. New Orleans has now won its last five games against Tampa Bay, including its last three games at Raymond James Stadium.
- Offensively, the Saints scored a season-high 38 points and amassed 420 yards, including 138 rushing yards and 282 passing yards. New Orleans held the ball for 40:04, their highest time of possession since Week 10 of the 2017 season, when they amassed 41:23 time of possession in a 47-10 victory over Buffalo.
- Three players (Drew Brees, Taysom Hill, and Jameis Winston) completed passes for the Saints for the first time since October 6, 2019 when Alvin Kamara, Teddy Bridgewater, and Hill completed passes against Tampa Bay. Prior to that game, Billy Joe Hobert, Danny Wuerfell, and Lamar Smith did so on September 6, 1998 when the Saints defeated the St. Louis Rams in St. Louis in their 1998 season opener.
- Defensively, New Orleans held Tampa Bay to a season-low 194 total yards, including 186 passing yards and eight rushing yards, which matches the second lowest rushing total surrendered by New Orleans in franchise history (two yards against New England on 11/30/1986 and eight yards against Dallas on 12/6/1998). New Orleans also recorded three interceptions for the first time this season, while holding Tampa Bay QB Tom Brady to a passer rating of 40.4, the third lowest passer rating of his career.
- The victory gives New Orleans a series sweep over Tampa Bay QB Tom Brady, the first time Brady has been swept by a division opponent in his NFL career.
- The Saints' 35 point margin of victory is New Orleans' largest since defeating the Philadelphia Eagles 48-7 in Week 11 of the 2018 season.
- Tampa Bay's leading rusher, RB Ronald Jones rushed for nine yards on three carries, as the Saints extend their streak to 51 games, including postseason, without giving up 100 yards rushing to a single individual player. The streak now matches the 1972-76 Dallas Cowboys as the longest such streak in NFL history.
- New Orleans' defense held Tampa Bay to 3-and-outs on each of the Buccaneers' first four drives, marking the first time in Tampa Bay QB Tom Brady's career (333 games, including playoffs) that his team has gone 3-and-out on each of its first four drives.
- For HC **Sean Payton**, the victory improves his career record against Tampa Bay to 18-10, his road mark against the Buccaneers to 9-5, and record against Tampa Bay HC Bruce Arians to 5-1. The victory gives Payton his fifth career series sweep of the Buccaneers and he now has swept each NFC South opponent in back-to-back seasons at least once in his career.
- QB **Drew Brees** finished the game with 222 passing yards on 26-of-32 passing and added four touchdown passes. Brees has now thrown for four or more touchdowns in 37 career games. With the win, Brees' career record against Tampa Bay improves to 20-10, making the Buccaneers the first team Brees has defeated 20 times in his career.

- In his seventh career matchup against Buccaneers QB Tom Brady, Brees surpassed Brady for the NFL's all-time lead in touchdown passes, having now thrown for 564 touchdowns. Brees also now holds a 5-2 record against Brady in his career.
- QB **Taysom Hill** recorded new career highs in both passing and rushing yards, finishing with positive yards rushing, passing, and receiving for the second time this season and fourth time in his career. Hill rushed for 54 yards on seven attempts, passed for 48 yards on two-for-two passing, and added one reception for 21 yards. Hill's other game this season with positive yards in each category came in Week 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Playing in his 150th career game, WR **Emmanuel Sanders** recorded four receptions for 38 yards and his third touchdown reception of 2020. Sanders has recorded at least four receptions in each of the last four games he's appeared in this season. Sanders now has 631 career receptions, surpassing Pierre Garcon and Rob Moore for 67th in NFL record books.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** rushed for 40 yards and one touchdown on nine carries, and now has 2,879 rushing yards in his career, surpassing RB Tony Galbreath for 9th in club record books. Kamara scored his tenth career touchdown against the Buccaneers, his most against any single opponent, making Tampa Bay the first team Kamara has double digit scores against. Entering the game with 298 receptions, Kamara also surpassed 300 for his career, finishing with five catches for nine yards.
- In his first game since Week 1, WR **Michael Thomas** led the Saints in receptions on receiving yards, finishing with 51 yards on five catches.
- DE **Trey Hendrickson** recorded 2.0 sacks (on back-to-back plays in the third quarter), and now has 7.5 sacks this season, good for third amongst all NFL defenders. In his second career game with 2.0 sacks, Hendrickson finished with a total of three tackles and added two quarterback hits.
- S **Malcolm Jenkins** recorded his first interception since Week 12 of the 2018 season, as a member of the Philadelphia Eagles, and tied for the team lead with five tackles.
- Playing in his 136th consecutive game, LB **Demario Davis** finished with five tackles, tied for the team lead. Davis has recorded at least five stops in six of the Saints' eight games.
- CB **PJ Williams** recorded five tackles, tied for the team lead. Williams last recorded at least five tackles in New Orleans' Week 2 loss at Las Vegas, when he recorded seven tackles against the Raiders.
- S **Marcus Williams** recorded his second interception of 2020, both coming against Brady. Williams, who added one tackle and one pass defense on the night, has now recorded multiple interceptions in each of his four seasons in the NFL.
- WR **Tre'Quan Smith** recorded one reception for 14 yards and his third touchdown of the season. Smith's lone reception went for a touchdown score for the third time in his career, joining Weeks 12 and 15 of last season in victories over Carolina and Indianapolis, respectively.
- TE **Josh Hill** scored his first touchdown of the season and recorded his first multi-catch game of 2020, finishing with two receptions for 14 yards and the touchdown reception.
- WR **Deonte Harris** recorded the longest reception of his career on a 40-yard catch and run on the Saints' second drive of the game. In addition to the one reception, Harris averaged 10.0 yards on three punt returns.
- RB **Latavius Murray** recorded double-digit rushes for the fifth time this season, recording 39 yards on 10 carries.
- TE **Adam Trautman** scored his first career touchdown, becoming the 72nd player to catch a touchdown from Brees. Trautman finished with three receptions for 39 yards.
- DT **David Onyemata** recorded his first career interception, picking off Tom Brady with 11:05 to play in the second quarter and setting up a Saints' 5-play, 27-yard touchdown drive. Onyemata added four quarterback hits and one pass defense on the night.
- DT **Malcolm Brown** recorded his first sack since Week 5 of 2019, and added a quarterback hit.
- The Saints extend their streak to 296 regular season games without being shut out, the longest such running streak in the NFL and fourth longest all-time. The streak dates back to September 6, 2002 when New Orleans defeated the Buccaneers 26-20 at Raymond James Stadium.
