

SHANE DAY

Shane Day is in his fifth season with the 49ers and second as the team's quarterbacks coach, having previously served as San Francisco's offensive quality control coach for three seasons (2007-09). Day spent the prior three years (2016-18) as the tight ends coach of the Miami Dolphins.

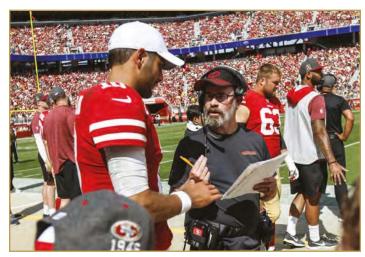
In 2019, Day worked with QB Jimmy Garoppolo, as he completed 329 of 476 attempts (69.1 percent) for 3,978 yards and 27 touch-downs with a passer rating of 102.0, earning Comeback Player of the Year honors from *Sporting News*. His 69.1 completion percentage in 2019 ranked tied for fourth in the NFL (min. 200 attempts) and his 27 passing touchdowns ranked tied for fifth. Garoppolo's 69.1 completion percentage also ranked third in franchise history and was the highest in a single season since 1994 (QB Steve Young - 70.4 percent). He also ranked fourth in franchise history for the most passing yards (3,978) and completions (329) in a single season.

In 2018 with Miami, Day worked with second-round draft pick, TE Mike Gesicki, who finished the season with 22 receptions for 202 yards (9.2 average). The year earlier, TE Julius Thomas caught 41 passes for 388 yards (9.5 average) and ranked third on the team with three touchdowns.

In his first season with the Dolphins in 2016, Day helped Miami have their most successful season since 2008, winning 10 games, including nine of the final 11 to finish the season and earn a playoff berth. After losing TE Jordan Cameron to injury in Week 3, Day prepared TE Dion Sims for one of the best seasons of his career as he started 11 games and finished with career highs in receptions (26) and receiving touchdowns (four) to go along with 256 yards. Former undrafted TE MarQueis Gray also had the best season of his career, setting career highs with seven starts, 14 receptions and 174 receiving yards.

Day joined Miami after two seasons as the assistant offensive line coach (2014-15) with Washington. In 2015, Washington ranked 10th in scoring (24.3 points per game) and the offensive line allowed 27 sacks that season, the fifth-fewest in the NFL. Washington won the NFC East for the second time since 1999 with a nine-win campaign. T Trent Williams earned his fourth-consecutive Pro Bowl selection and was named Associated Press Second-Team All-Pro for the first time in his career. In 2014, RB Alfred Morris rushed for 1,074 yards, his third consecutive season with 1,000-or-more yards, and Williams earned the third Pro Bowl selection of his career.

Prior to Washington, Day was the quarterbacks coach at the University of Connecticut for two seasons (2012-13). In 2013, he took over play-calling duties after nine games and helped the Huskies finish the season on a three-game winning streak as the team threw for seven touchdowns and only one interception.



Day went to Connecticut after two years (2010-11) as the quarter-backs coach of the Chicago Bears. In his first season, Day coached QB Jay Cutler, who completed 261 of 432 passes for 3,274 yards and 23 touchdowns. The Bears went 11-5, won the NFC North and advanced to the NFC Championship that season. The following year, Chicago started three different quarterbacks, as Cutler, QB Caleb Hanie and QB Josh McCown combined to throw for 3,346 yards and 18 touchdowns.

Day's first stint with the 49ers spanned three seasons (2007-09) as an offensive quality control coach. He worked with the team's quarterbacks in 2007, running backs in 2008 and offensive line in 2009. In those three seasons, RB Frank Gore rushed for 3,258 rushing yards, the seventh-most in the NFL during that timespan.

Day joined the 49ers after spending the 2006 season at the University of Michigan. With the Wolverines, he was the assistant quarterbacks and quality control coach in charge of developing the team's quarterbacks. His other duties included opponent film breakdown, recruiting and other assignments for the team's staff.

Prior to joining the Michigan staff, Day spent four seasons coaching at Auburn (WA) Riverside High School. He coached the wide receivers (2001) and quarterbacks (2002) during his first two years. Day continued as the quarterbacks coach along with his promotion to offensive coordinator for the 2003-04 seasons.

Day graduated from Kansas State University in 1999 with a degree in English. He lettered in football as a wide receiver at Rhodes College in Memphis, TN. In addition, Day played shortstop and outfield on the Lynx baseball team. He and his wife, Christie, have a daughter. Vivienne.
