Super Freak

- WR **Richie James** hauled in a career-high 9 receipts. for a career-high 184 yds and 1 TD. His 41-yd. TD receipt. marked his 1st TD of the season and 3rd of his career. It also marked his 1st career 100-yd. rec. game.
- **James'** 184 rec. yds. are the most by a 49ers WR since 9/8/13 when WR Anquan Boldin registered 208 rec. yds. vs. GB.

Jet Rich Or Die Tryin'

- RB **Jerick McKinnon** rushed for 52 yds. and 1 TD on 12 carries while adding 3 receipts. for 16 yds.
- **McKinnon** now has a single-season career-high 5 rushing TDs on the year.

- DL **Jordan Willis** registered his first sack as a member of the 49ers, bringing down Packers QB Aaron Rodgers for an 11-yd. loss. He now has 4.0 career sacks.

**49ers Head Coach Kyle Shanahan
Press Conference – November 5, 2020
San Francisco 49ers vs. Green Bay Packers**

Opening comments:

"Alright guys, injuries from the game. [S Jaquiski] Tartt had a toe injury, did not return. [CB K'Waun] Williams, ankle. Did not return. Go ahead."

With the COVID issues, depleting you guys further, and all the tests coming back negative today, should this game have been pushed back to Sunday or Monday? And how much would that have helped your guys' cause?

"I don't really think about that stuff at all. It was never brought up pushing the game back, so we've been planning on it being at this Thursday at five or whenever it's supposed to start and that never changed. So, I know we're working together with the league on all that stuff. And that was never brought up, so never really thought about it."

Why did you decide to shuffle your center and right guard? Who plays center and right guard on a short week?

"Just after a couple of things in the last two games, we wanted to give [OL Daniel] Brunskill a shot. He'd been repping it a little bit, starting in training camp when we lost [OL Ben] Garland. We thought it'd be the best thing for us today and from what I felt out there, I think he did a pretty good job."

Obviously, a great performance from WR Richie James. Was that kind of the plan you had for WR Brandon Aiyuk going forward if he was to play in this game?

"Yes."

Obviously, the guys you have left to play tonight are NFL players and they get paid and all that, but did you feel like you guys collectively kind of had a hand tied behind your back, just with so many guys that weren't able to play?

"We knew it was going to be a challenge. We knew at the start of the week it was going to be a challenge and then losing those three guys yesterday was obviously a bigger challenge, but I still thought we could have a game and still thought we could play better than we did tonight. Being down like that and not being at our best and going against a good team like that, usually that's usually what happens, but I know we could have done better."

You've got this team to a certain point. You went to a Super Bowl, NFC Champions, and you overcame a lot to get there. As the coach, as the leader, how tough is it being back in this spot so soon after being in the Super Bowl?

"You'd have to ask our guys on that. For me personally, that was last year. You go into this year and you expect to be right there because of how we finished last year and the team that we had, but each year is a new year. We know the challenges that we have had. I think there's a number of games that we could have won that we didn't. And I know it doesn't get easier with some of the guys we've lost, but hopefully we'll get some guys back here going forward. I'm really looking forward to these three days off for our players. I think it's something that's needed pretty bad right now for us. Then we've got New Orleans after that and we've got one game in the next 24 days. So, hopefully we can get three off. Go take care of business versus New Orleans, get back on track, enjoy our Bye Week and come back and try to turn this around here in the second half because it's still early in the year. I still know we've got a chance to at least get in that tournament at the end of the year, but we've got to recover a little bit here with these three days and make sure when we come back, we start playing some better football."

Can you take us through what happened yesterday when you found out about WR Kendrick Bourne and then the other four guys and ultimately how it impacted your preparation and what your plans were for yesterday?

"We found out when we came in. I think I got told, struggling with day it is, I got told Wednesday morning. Then we got in and then we focused on clearing out the building because we had to shut everyone down when we found out about KB. Then went home and it was right back to quarantine, basically at home. I was there with my family, still homeschooling. It seemed like I went back in time three months ago and did everything from there. I went back into my office that was set up from the draft and did all the red zone stuff and at least was able to meet with the guys through Zoom and everything like we did in the offseason and get all the red zone stuff in. We didn't find out about Aiyuk and [T] Trent [Williams] until after those meetings and stuff. So, we were allowed to come back here last night and walk through the red zone and some of the openers and stuff and just had to do a little shuffling. There's not enough time to change everything. It's the night before the game and guys weren't practicing any ways because of the short week. So, we just got the receivers, reshuffled them and we walked through a lot last night and I think [wide receivers coach] Wes [Welker] grabbed a couple of them and walked through today before the game."

Given what you just said, obviously Richie James wasn't a big part of the game plan to start the week or on Tuesday when you had your practices. How impressive is it that he was able to kind of get up to speed and how did you and Wes sort of do that for this game?

"Richie has been here, so he knows what he's doing. I think the most impressive thing with Richie, we were told on Monday he had a 50% chance of playing because he was coming off an ankle injury. He wasn't able to go last week. So, we weren't sure if we were able to have him. So, we were, and we found out on Tuesday he was going to be able to dress for the game. We didn't plan on using him that much because he was coming off the injury, but I was just thankful to have him. For Richie, he got a lot of opportunities tonight, but I told him before the game that, hey, regardless of what happens, I know he's going in a little bit beat up. I know he didn't get to practice this stuff and I just wanted, he knew a lot of pressure was on him because he saw what the game plan was and he knew he was going to have those ops, but I was just happy that he was able to get out there and make it through the game and do a really good job when we came to him and we've got a lot of confidence in Richie. I hope in these three days away, he heals up more. It doesn't seem like he had any setbacks in the game and hopefully verse New Orleans we'll get [WR] Deebo [Samuel] back and get KB back and Aiyuk back and hopefully we'll get a little bit more continuity in the second half with our receiver group going forward."

You were missing a few players tonight because of the positive COVID test and around the league, there was a lot of that happening this week. What's your level of concern with the way things are going generally in the league and is there anything more your team can do to try to keep guys on the field?

"Yeah, I think there's always more. That's what we've got to look into and figure out how much more that we can do. It kind of is what it is, too. It's not just the NFL, it's the planet right now. You see it going all over the country and everything. I love that we're trying to play these games and get through them. I think our guys, when they have gotten it, hopefully they're going to be able to get through it and their health will be all right and not affected going forward. We haven't had it hit us really, yet. I know KB had that test and we had the close contacts and stuff and that's what the rules are. So, other teams have had to deal with that. I knew at some time we would have to deal with it. I was hoping it wouldn't be on a short week and with the injuries we had prior, so that just made it a bigger challenge, but that's challenges other people are going through and it's challenges people are going to have going forward. It's not getting better right now, so that's why everyone has to be on it with every single protocol that there is. I feel that we've been doing it the best we can, but we'll look into everything and see how we can continue to get better because there's still a number of games left in this year and I know our team

and I know the whole NFL plans on finishing those. I also plan on us playing better too. So, that all goes in hand."

Earlier this week, defensive coordinator Robert Salah said that the safeties are pretty flexible in terms of positioning and they can kind of play either position and it's similar. Why do you guys prefer S Marcell Harris at that spot as opposed to DB Tarvarius Moore?

"At which spot?"

The strong safety spot as Jaquiski Tartt's backup.

"I don't know. I'd say bigger body. Usually the bigger body goes at strong safety. Same with the two guys in front of both of them with [DB] Jimmie Ward and Tartt. They are both interchangeable, but Tartt's listed as a strong safety, so it's kind of the same deal."

You mentioned despite having a lot of guys, you still weren't thrilled with this performance. What areas were you particularly disappointed with?

"I'm not really saying that as a negative to our guys. I thought our guys played hard. I was really, you know, I thanked them for how they finished. The game was out of hand there at the end and our defense still stopped them there on their last drive and allowed the offense to go out and at least keep trying to fight and get some more points on the board. We're all pretty competitive in there and I still believed we could have done better. I'm not taking anything away from Green Bay at all, but it's going to be hard to, probably, for me, ever to not feel that way."

What were the impression that you had of Green Bay Packers QB Aaron Rodgers, Green Bay Packers WR Davante Adams and just your pass defense overall against those two guys?

"Aaron and Davante, they're the same as they always are to me. They're two great players and they've both been doing it for a very long time. I knew going into the game that would be a huge challenge. Thought we missed a couple of tackles on the opening drive and then they got that go route. I thought [CB Emmanuel] Moseley was in a perfect position, just a little nudge there that I don't expect to get called and Devante made a hell of a play and Aaron made a great throw. I think that was kind of, for our pass coverage all night, I thought we held them pretty good, but we gave up a bunch of big plays. So, don't confuse that with pretty good. That's why they got after us in that aspect, but the big plays were tough to overcome, especially when they came, some of the third downs and things like that. Then the PI on the double move down in the end zone, which I believe was on third down. I'm not exactly sure. When you give them some opportunities with the penalties and you give a guy like Aaron and Davante some of those big plays, and the way they got the run game going a little bit, creasing through there. We weren't very inspiring on offense, either, for the defense in the first half. We moved the ball a little bit, had a chance at that one touchdown that ended up getting overturned. We just asked them to hold on for too long."

Why was CB Jamar Taylor up and CB Ahkello Witherspoon down for this game?

"Jamar's our backup nickel and we wanted him in there to back up K'Waun and I think it was also for the whole depth of everything. It was more of a special team's decision. Got the guys out there who are starting on defense and everyone else was based off who helps us the most on special teams."

Can you talk a little bit about the preparation that you had this week? It was a very up and down week. You lost some guys to the COVID list. Tell us what it was like.

"Yeah, the last 48 hours, I guess you could say a little bit different. You wake up and see the news and you're a thrown off a little bit. Then coming off the short week definitely threw us for a loop. I didn't think I mean, at the end of the day, you've got to focus on the job at hand and that's playing the football game and executing as a unit to the best of our abilities. So, it was different, but thought we did a good job of focusing on what mattered."

How tough was it out there for you throughout the game?

"You only say it's tough because we didn't execute. I thought we actually, I felt like we could have played a lot better than we did. Felt like we had a lot of really good plays called that gave us a lot of opportunities and for whatever reason, we didn't connect. I'm excited to go back and watch that film because I really do, I feel like we could have got after those guys and done some good things. That's on the players and you just hope to go out there and do your best and we didn't do that tonight."

What was it that allowed WR Richie James to take advantage of his opportunity?

"Yeah, Richie's just a great football player. I've thought he's a really good football player since he's been here and he got his opportunities tonight. He's been pretty steady since he's been here, just always making plays when he has the ball in his hands. He proved that once again tonight. I think he's a great target and he always does a good job."

What's the level of optimism? We have a few days off to heal up and head to New Orleans.

What's the level of optimism in that locker room right now?

"Yeah, that's the most frustrating part, we know that we can be so much better. Even with the guys that we had on the field, myself included. We really feel like we can be a lot better and so with these couple of days away, just regroup, reset, and just foot on the gas for these upcoming weeks."

Along with the other challenges this week, you had different guys in front of you on the offensive line. How did that feel tonight?

"I love those guys. You ride with the guys that you have and everybody just did what they could and fought like hell. So, it was good. Our chemistry, just as a unit, we work really well together and you just keep going and make the plays that you can."

**Packers Head Coach Matt LaFleur
Postgame Quotes – November 5, 2020
San Francisco 49ers vs. Green Bay Packers**

Opening comments:

"I just want to start out by saying that I thought it was a great team win. It obviously feels really good to come out here and get a win especially on a short week. There were a lot of hours put in for the preparation. I was really happy with the play of our team. I thought the energy was there, that was something that we were looking for. I thought all three phases came to play and there were a lot of guys that had to step up and embrace new roles. It's always fun to see those guys come out on top. Again, just really proud of our team's effort."

How important was the fact that LB Preston Smith, LB Za'Darius Smith and LB Rashan Gary were able to get the pressures that they did? Obviously, you forced a couple turnovers off of it,

but without 49ers LT Trent Williams, you probably liked your match ups on that side. Did that make a big impact on the game?

"Yeah it sure did. Obviously, I think it all starts up front and those are three of our best players on defense and when they play really well we're really tough to deal with. I think that's exactly what happened. Obviously, getting two turnovers caused by that front, Preston with the hit on the quarterback that caused the interception by [S] Raven Greene and then also Za'Darius' sack fumble. Both those led to points and I'm just really happy with our overall effort."

Can you just talk about how important it was to get the contribution you got from WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling especially with him coming back from the early drop in the game?

Yeah, it was definitely the key. I think any time you have a guy where it doesn't go his way early it's tough and that was obviously a significant drop. It was third down and we weren't able to convert, but to see somebody be resilient and be tough minded, that's what we're looking for in this football team. We want resilient guys and it's always fun to see a guy come through. I thought he played an outstanding game. I mean yeah he had the drop, but he bounced back, scored two touchdowns and I'm just really happy overall with his effort and his ability to respond.

You told us a week ago that there's nothing that WR Davante Adams can't do. Tonight he was able to get more deep balls than maybe he had in the recent past. What we're leading to those? How did those come about?

"The coverage presented itself. When you have two great players like [QB] Aaron Rodgers and Davante Adams in the line, it affords you the time to hang in a pocket and throw some deep. Those were some dime balls that Aaron was throwing to Davante, but also you can look back at that fourth down when the defender was draped all over Davante and he made unbelievable will catch. I was a little surprised that it wasn't holding on that play, but it was awesome to see Davante battle through that and make a play."

I know you guys were really light at running back, but did you feel like you were taking much of a risk there with RB Aaron Jones getting touched this as you got well into the fourth quarter?

"We we're having we're trying to be mindful of that. Unfortunately you know [RB] Dexter Williams went down and that certainly hurt our depth. Obviously we were trying to be very cautious with Aaron. You could see and feel his impact immediately in that game. I think on that first drive he was outstanding and throughout the course the game. He is a dangerous guy with the ball in his hands and he's able to make people miss. He's got the burst and the slashing ability to spring one at any moment. I think it was a big boost to our offense just having him available and in the lineup."

Given the fact that you were down a bunch of guys coming into the game and then lost a bunch of guys during the game, how tough was it juggling things on the sideline as far as getting guys in and out? How was the operation with your assistants?

"I thought out guys for the most part did a pretty good job. There were a couple I think late in the second half we were down a couple more guys. [WR Equanimeous St. Brown] EQ got nicked and so did [WR Darius] Shepherd. With all the juggling there were a couple communication problems in terms of getting guys in the right spot, but overall I thought for the most part was pretty good."

What's it like from your vantage point when Aaron's throwing the ball the way he wants tonight and everything's clicking on offense like that?

"Oh it's special. It's unbelievable. You could give him the game ball every game. He is an unbelievable quarterback, just pinpoint accuracy and he's just a great leader for everybody. It is definitely special to be a part of this with him leading the way for us. He just has such command out there on the field. It really is something special to watch."

You obviously had plenty of challenges of your own, but you look at what 49ers Head Coach Kyle Shanahan was dealing with and the COVIDstuff the other day. How do you put this in perspective? This wasn't the same team that you faced last year, but you took care of business. How do you view what you did tonight?

"I think we did what we needed to do. I know they were short numbers, but again it's the National Football League and you can't take anybody for granted. I still think they got a hell of a team despite missing some big-time players. I think that's a credit to the way they built that roster. I think they're extremely deep, extremely talented. Again, I know they are missing some creatures on both sides of the ball, but that's one of the better defenses we've played despite missing some of those guys. Then also on offense it's always difficult going against Kyle and his staff. I think they do an outstanding job of trying to exploit your weaknesses and really attacking you and putting your defense in binds. They've got an outstanding team and I know they've been hit with an unfortunate number of injuries, but I do think that it speaks to the level of how good that football team is."

Can you take us through the process of getting Aaron Jones on the field? When did you know and then once you know, what is the process game plan wise to get him going right away as a major focal point on that first drive?

"We had a pretty good idea this week that he was going to be able to go. Anytime you're dealing with something muscular you never want to totally commit to that because you just don't know how it's going to feel, but he woke up this morning and said he felt great. We put him through a little pregame routine and he said he felt great. So we went with what we thought was best. Obviously if he wasn't able to go then [RB] Tyler [Ervin] was going to get those touches. Those were plays that we felt good regardless of which back was in there. We've got confidence in all three backs that were up tonight, but I'll tell you what it definitely speaks to the versatility of Tyler to be able to do both. To play wide receiver, to be a returner as well as a running back and I thought his value to this team is very significant."

Where would you be if you didn't have multiple guys on the offensive line playing multiple positions?

"I think we'd be in rough shape. The versatility of those linemen, [G] Elgton Jenkins for [G/T] Billy Turner. Elton played three positions tonight, that's unheard of I think in this league. For him to be able to play left guard, left tackle and then go in at center at the end of the game, that's pretty special. I think that's a big-time credit to that whole room and [offensive line coach] Adam Stenavich and [assistant offensive line coach] Luke Butkus for their ability to prepare those guys. They don't blink. They're faced with a little bit of adversity, asked to switch positions and nobody wants to do that. I don't think Billy wants to switch from left to right mid game, that's not easy. I can't even articulate how hard that really is when you're getting used to setting up on one side of the line and you have to flip. That's not easy to do especially against some good defensive linemen. And the way they come off the ball is like very few teams in the National Football League. I think they roll off the ball as hard as anybody. Their ability to be able to do that is extremely rare and very special. We're fortunate to have guys with that ability and just the way they attack it on a daily basis is very special."

When you look at WR Davante Adams it just seems like every single game it's been 10 to 12 catches. What have you thought about the start he's been off to and obviously again tonight stepping up for you guys?

"Yeah, he's such a great player. He's tough on matchups. He's able to create so much space with his release pattern and he's got enough speed to get on top so you can't necessarily play it low and expect

certain routes. We hit him with a lot of different things today. We hit him on the first possession with the go ball that he made a nice adjustment and then again on the last possession we were in on the inside go route. He's so talented, he can do it all. He handles himself the right way, he's just a joy to play with and a special guy."

What did you see from WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling and what he was able to bring down after that early drop and how he was able to recover after it?

"I don't have any reservations throwing the ball his way. So obviously the drop denied the drive continuing, but the beauty is a two minute warning hit we came together on the sidelines, we're talking through some plays and [head coach] Matt [LaFleur] brought up that play and I looked at Quez and I said do you want to play and he said yeah. I said all right and we went back out there to see if I could get him on a touchdown and sure enough I did."

I know it's two different years, two different teams, but the way last year went with two games out there in San Francisco, to start with a three minute touchdown drive and then have your defense come out and force a three-and-out right away, how important was it to set the tone like that?

"Yeah I think that's been important the entire season. We've scored on eight straight possessions start to start the game. That's what my trusty sidekick [communications manager] Tom Fanning just told me walking in here but that's what it felt like. We've gotten off to a good start every single week and that's been important for our football team. A lot that's been the scripting that Matt does and then we've just out and executed really well. We had a jolt tonight having number 33 back. He's a dynamic guy. He had a couple plays in the first drive that were really special. It's fun seeing him out there, but we a lot of contributions from other guys tonight. We had an injury up front with [T] Rick [Wagner] and move some guys around. G] Elgton Jenkins went to left tackle and then [G] Jon [Runyan] came in to play left guard, [G/T] Billy Turner went back over to the right tackle. So the flexibility those guys give us, that's pretty special. It was a really clean night in the pocket with those guys doing a great job up front. Their defense has some talented players on it and obviously they're missing some guys from previous seasons, but they've been playing pretty well on that side the ball the last three or four weeks and it was good night for us."

I want to ask about RB Tyler Ervin. When you guys claimed him and after that 49ers game last year, did you think at that time he might ever have an impact on the offense and how much has your trust grown in him on the offense since then? What did you think about what he did tonight with your running back room kind of thing?

"He's special guy. special player. I think some of the beauty in what's happened over the years with guys like that is, you have a guy come in who's just a solid dude. He's a great locker room guy, a great teammate, you wrap your arms around him, embrace him and make him feel really welcome and comfortable. Once you do that, you start to see the personality come out and the opportunities come. We got him at a time last year when we had negative return yards in the punt game and in the first game he made a direct impact. I started thinking what did these other teams see or not see that would cause them to get rid of a guy like that. Sometimes just a change of scenery is good for a player. In this case we got not only a great player, but a great person. He's been in the receiver room for much of the year and this week we needed him to play running back, carry the football and do a number of things for us. He's definitely one of the unsung heroes of the night and I'm not sure what his final stats look like, but the impact that he made for us is really important."

If I could just follow up on Marquez, when you're watching that first touchdown in flight, how much do you need to see him catch that, not just for the seven points, but for the continued report after that drop? We've obviously seen his talent in flashes, but do you think he'll ever be that consistent number two for you that you need in this passing game?

"I do have a lot of faith and trust in him. I've seen him grow as a player. I'm sure it's tough to not get the kind of numbers and targets that you want from week to week, but it's happened to guys over the years who have some ups and downs as far as targets and production and the guys that stick around are the guys that can stay focused and push through the adversity and any frustration that might come up. I'm proud of Marquez. He's done a really nice job for us of just staying focused and staying confident. I didn't see his head drop. After he dropped the ball I was talking to him about another play that I'd seen on the pad. It wasn't even something that felt like I need to go over and talk to him about. As far as the first touchdown, I didn't really see him. I just saw the area of the field and expected that he was going to beat the safety on that side. I wanted to put just little extra height on it because I knew the safety on the backside was doubling Davante and after the front side guy attached to the Y, I felt good MVS being there on deep ball and that's a fun one."

You mentioned they were missing some guys obviously and you guys had your own challenges all week, but after the way things played out with them last season, how do you put in perspective what you guys did tonight given the number of guys they were missing and how different they were from the team that beat you twice last year?

"They're a different team on paper for sure. They've had some tough injuries to some really key players but look no one's feeling sorry for anybody in this league and that's the way it goes. No one's feeling sorry for us when we're dealing with our injuries. You just have to be a next man up mentality and obviously they had a number of young guys play, we had no young guys play. We've had many of our star players not play in various games. Obviously tonight our left tackle is out, [WR] Allen Lazard was out, [RB] Jamaal Williams and [RB] AJ Dillon with the contact tracing. There were a number of impact players on defense that didn't play or got hurt during the game. So that's the NFL in 2020. Obviously they've got hit with the injury bug a lot more than you usually see, but it's still football. It still feels great to win. It feels good to be 6-2 at the halfway point and first in the division."

Elgton has proven he can play pretty much anywhere across the line. I'm just curious if there's any other linemen you've played with in your career that you think would match his versatility and effectiveness?

"Well we had two amazing guards at one point named [former G] T.J. Lang and [former G] Josh Seiden and Seiden played some left tackle for us at times. He could play really anywhere on the line, super talented guy. T.J. started at all three interior positions. I'm not sure if he's played all five positions at one point, but I wouldn't put it past him. Those two guys were rocks for us, super versatile guys, extremely intelligent guys, some of the funniest guys I've ever been around. They are guys I still keep in touch with and really enjoy those guys. Elgton is a talented guy who's shown he can play various positions. He started at right tackle for us in game one. He can play both guard positions. He's gotten a lot better at snapping if we need him and in a pinch. I'm really proud of him. He's a good kid. He really cares about it and he's improved from year one to year two."

We've seen you and Davonte connect on so many crossing routes, sideline stuff. Why was the deep stuff a little bit more there tonight?

"I think it was just the coverage. They didn't necessarily shade him every single time. It was one of those nights where a couple of the plays we just got coverages that really matched the play that was called. The first touchdown was just a double go concept and the safety at the snap, I was holding my eyes to the right, he didn't go and really double Davonte so I had plenty of room out there and he made a nice play on it. Then the double move there and more of a quarter's look across the ball. We had some receiver occupying the safety on his side so he really had 1-1 coverage outside again and if I had thrown it a little more inside he scores on that one. And then late in the game when the game's out of hand on a third down again he has 1-1 coverage with a young corner and I put it in a good spot and he made a nice play."

I want to go back to Fanning's note of the night on your eight for eight. What is it about the script? Is there ever much deviation in that and what does that say about how tuned in all 11 are to accomplish what you've done so far this season?

"There's not a lot of deviation from it. I think that's the beauty in what Matt's been drawn up. We've been doing a good job of executing well. The other part is the situational, we've been good on third downs early in the game. The relationship I think is in a really good spot with [quarterbacks/passing game coordinator] Luke [Getsy], Matt and myself. We have conversation about where we like early in the game. So when it gets to those third down situations or red zone situations, we've already talked about exactly where what we all think is the best play in those situations. We start with the best ones and kind of work our way down. Matt's done a good job of mixing things up to give us the opportunity to start fast and then we've gone out and executed really well."

You seem to be having a great deal of fun tonight throughout the game. How would you describe the feeling when everything seems to be working with the timing and chemistry?

"Yeah I mean there's nothing better than winning. It's a special feeling. I've been around long enough where they all count. They're all special. Again, not having the same type of atmosphere is different. Last year we played a couple of really tough games at night and in this stadium. It didn't quite have the same feel as those two nights, but it's still the NFL, it's still a special win. It's fun to execute the way we did tonight. It's just nice with the game being clean and not really getting hit at all other than at the end of the first half. Having [RB] Aaron Jones back I think got them thinking about the run and we did a good job up front of slowing them down, opening up some gaps and just taking what was there in the pass game. We were efficient. We made some really good plays down the field. I threw it pretty accurately and then when it was off schedule I think we did a nice job of keeping things alive and making some plays."

When they have to replace somebody on the offensive line like when Rick Wagner got hurt. Do they tell you on the sideline that there's going to be all these changes or who's going to be playing where when you come back and how does that affect the way that maybe you call protections or anything like that?

"I had a front row seat, it happened at halftime. We came in there and I heard the whole conversation about what they were going to do. Did Elgton want to play left or right? Billy didn't really have a say. I don't know why they went with the young guy first, but he didn't really have a chance. They just said Billy you go to the right, Johnny you're coming in to play left guard. There was a lot of yelling for John and John was actually sitting right over here. They didn't see that he was hearing the conversation, but I watched the whole thing. When it comes to protection I don't think we had to change a whole lot. I mean Elgton's a talented guy over there and John has proven that he's a reliable backup and he's done a good job. I think he's been in three times now because of injury and done a good job all three times. It was a fun conversation to listen to in the locker room though. I was fully aware of what was going on at halftime and thinking about what we wanted to do protection wise, but those guys really held up good."
