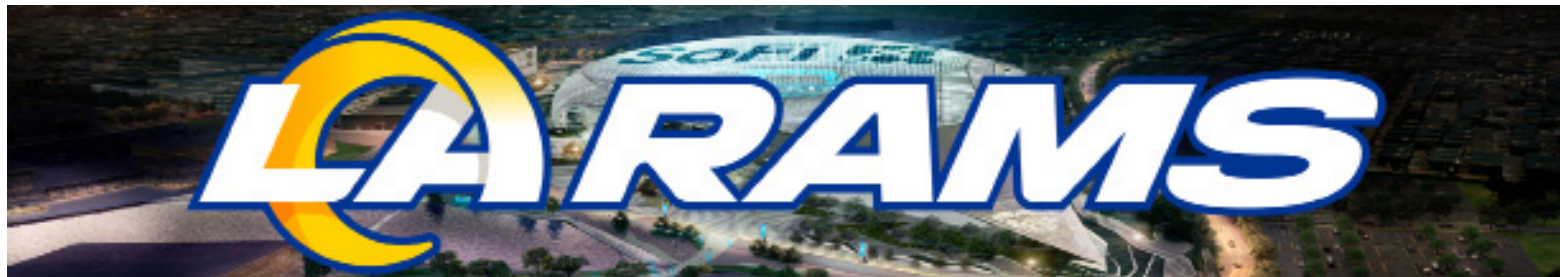

Rams Travel For Third Divisional Matchup Of Season

50 sack leaders in NFL history
Jalen Ramsey picked off Titans QB Ryan Tannehill. S Jordan Fuller led the team with seven tackles.

Santa Clara, Calif. – In the 144th matchup between the two division rivals, the Los Angeles Rams (7-2) will travel to face the San Francisco 49ers (3-5) on *Monday Night Football*. This is the shortest road trip this season for the Rams, only having to travel 340 miles. Head Coach Sean McVay will look to help break his team's four-game losing streak against San Francisco. A Rams victory would improve their NFC West record to 2-1.

The Rams are coming off a 28-16 loss to the Tennessee Titans (7-2) at SoFi Stadium. QB Matthew Stafford threw for 294 yards with one TD to RB Sony Michel. Stafford also had a season-long rush of 12-yards. The leading receiver in the competition was WR Robert Woods with 98 receiving yards and not far behind was WR Cooper Kupp's 95 receiving yards. RB Darrell Henderson Jr. averaged 5.0 yards per carry with his 11 touches, totaling 55 yards.

The Rams defense stayed atop the NFL leaderboard in sacks (28.0) with three Sunday night. Contributions came from DL Aaron Donald (1.0), OLB Leonard Floyd (1.0), DL Greg Gaines (0.5) and OLB Ogbornia Okoronkwo (0.5). Floyd is now eighth in the NFL in sacks with 7.5, trailing the NFL leader, Browns DE Myles Garrett (12.0). Donald's sack put him in the top with 91.5 career sacks. On the Titans first drive, CB Jordan Fuller led the team with seven tackles.

This game marks the Rams first time on *Monday Night Football* in the 2021 season. This matchup of Rams versus 49ers is the third most frequent matchup in *Monday Night Football* history. The two have battled on Monday night 14 times, San Francisco leading 9-4 in this specific series. Overall, the 49ers are up 73-67 on the Rams with three ties.

McVay's history runs deep in San Francisco. His grandfather, John McVay, worked various roles in administration with the 49ers in the 80's and 90's. John collaborated with former Head Coach Bill Walsh to make one of the most successful dynasties in NFL history. In 1989, John was named NFL Executive of the Year. Sean McVay also worked as an offensive assistant under current 49ers Head Coach Kyle Shanahan when the two worked for the Washington Football Team (2010-13).

The last time the 49ers had five losses heading into a Rams game, the Rams won in a 39-10 victory at Levi Stadium (10/21/18). Neither Stafford nor 49ers QB Jimmy Garoppolo played in that game. The only key Rams contributors in that game returning are TE Tyler Higbee, P Johnny Hekker, Donald and Woods. Stafford and Garoppolo faced off only once against each other in 2018 when Stafford threw for 347-passing yards and finished with a 101.7 passer rating.

What to Watch For



- Newly acquired **LB Von Miller** is set to make his team debut on Monday Night Football in prime time if his ankle is ready to go. If Miller can go, the Rams will trot out two top 50 all-time sack leaders in Miller (110.5) at 23rd and **DL Aaron Donald** (91.5) at 50th.
- **QB Matthew Stafford** is 601 passing yards away from reaching 50,000 passing yards on his career.
- **Head Coach Sean McVay** is 16-5 in games following a loss since he took over the position. His last game following a loss was Week 5 in Seattle, in which the Rams won 26-17. The Rams have only lost back-to-back games four times under McVay.
- **WR Cooper Kupp** is 123 receiving yards away from the NFL record for receiving yards during Weeks 1 through 10, (WR Antonio Brown '15 for 1,141 yards).

History Lesson



DL Aaron Donald and QB Patrick Mahomes in the highest scoring Monday Night game ever and third highest scoring game in NFL history.

Since taking over as Head Coach, Sean McVay has led the Rams in five *Monday Night Football* games. The Rams have won four of those contests, their only loss coming to the Baltimore Ravens, who were on a six-game win streak at that point in 2019. Twice McVay has had to play two *Monday Night Football* games in the same season. In McVay's first season, the Rams beat the Raiders (33-13) and the Chiefs (54-51). Last year, the Rams served up losses to the Bears (24-10) and the Buccaneers (27-24).

The most memorable *Monday Night Football* game under McVay was against the Chiefs on November 19, 2018 and was the highest scoring game in MNF history (3rd in NFL history). The game was supposed to be played at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City but was moved to Los Angeles six days before kickoff due to poor field conditions. Although it was not played where expected, this MNF matchup will go down in the history books as one of the most captivating NFL games to be played.

Overall, as a franchise, the Rams are 32-33 in their Monday night

Success In The West



Under Head Coach Sean McVay, the Rams are 17-9 in the regular season against NFC West opponents. L.A. is 8-1 against the Arizona Cardinals and have outscored them 271-128. L.A. has outscored NFC West foes, 722-524, through McVay's first 28 regular season divisional games. The Rams finished 6-0 in the NFC West during the 2018 season. The last time an NFC West team accomplished the feat was the Cardinals in 2008. It marked the first time the Rams swept the NFC West since 1999.

The Rams are 10-4 in NFC West road contests since the start of the 2017 season. The most recent road win was against the Seattle Seahawks, at Lumen Field in Week 5. The Rams swept the Seahawks in 2018, marking the first time since 2015 L.A. has swept the Seahawks.

The Rams entered Week 17 of the 2017 season with a two-game lead in the NFC West and an 11-4 record when they decided to rest their starters against the 49ers.

The Rams outscored their divisional opponents, 171-112, during the 2017 season, which was a 59-point differential. It was the highest positive point differential in the division for the Rams since 2001, when the Rams outscored their divisional opponents, 274-160, for a 114-point differential. The 2001 Rams played in a five team division and therefore had eight divisional games that season.

The Rams also posted 30-plus points against all three of their divisional opponents during the 2018 season. The 2002 Rams were previously the last team to accomplish that feat.

He had three TDs, 0 interceptions and a near perfect passer rating of 156.1 in the win. Then in Week 3 Stafford won the award again. This time Stafford threw for 343 yards, four TDs, 0 interceptions on 27 of 38 passing, as the Rams outdueled QB Tom Brady and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Stafford's two NFC Off. Player of the Week awards in September were largely in thanks to WR Cooper Kupp's play during the month. The 2021 NFL Draft marked the 85th draft for the Rams franchise dating back to the second-ever NFL draft in 1937. The team has not had a first-round selection in 12 of those drafts, including a five-year span from 2017-2021. This trend will continue as the Rams traded their 2022 and 2023 first rounders, along with a 2021 third and QB Jared Goff, to Detroit for QB Matthew Stafford.

The season following a draft in which the team didn't make a selection in the first round, the Rams went on to win at least 10 games on seven different occasions (1967, 1968, 1973, 1984, 2017, 2018, 2020), including four seasons where the Rams claimed the NFC West title (1967, 1973, 2017, 2018).

Additionally, five of the franchise's 21 ties have come during those 10 seasons.

The Los Angeles Rams offensive line leads the NFL in least sacks allowed with just seven on the season. They did not allow a sack during Week 4 against Arizona, and have not allowed more than two in any game through seven weeks.

LA had two games during the 2020 regular season where they didn't allow a sack. The Rams kept QB Jared Goff from absorbing a sack for the first time in the 2020 season in a Week 6 contest at San Francisco. Against a strong Tampa Bay defensive line that would go on to win the Super Bowl, L.A. kept their QB clean for the second time all season while he attempted 51 passes.

In six separate games during the 2019 season, L.A.'s offensive line had a clean sheet, including both contests against its NFC West foes the Seattle Seahawks and once against the San Francisco 49ers.

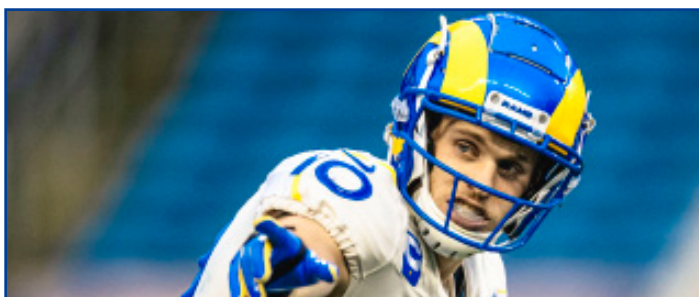

Running Through The Woods



WR Robert Woods isn't only good at catching, but also rushing. Amongst all wide receivers since 2017, Woods (485) ranks second in rushing yards only trailing WR Curtis Samuel by one yard. Since 2017, Woods has carried the ball 70 times, amassed 485 yards on the ground, averaging 6.9 yards per rushing attempt. So far in 2021 Woods has eight rushes for 46 yards, ranking him fourth among WRs this season in rushing yards.

Woods wasted no time gaining rushing yards in 2020. In the season opener he carried the ball once for 14 yards. The crafty veteran scored his third rushing touchdown in a Week 2 win over the Eagles. Woods finished with 19 yards rushing on the day. On the season, Woods has rushed 24 times for 155 yards (6.5 yards/rush), the third-best total in the NFL, and is tied for the league-lead with two rushing touchdowns.

In the 2019 Week 1 win over the Carolina Panthers, Woods recorded 16 rushing yards on two carries (8.0 yards/rush) with a 20-yard scamper as a longest rush. In 2019, he ranked third amongst receivers in the NFL with 115 rushing yards on 17 carries.

Woods had 19 rushing attempts for 157 yards and averaged 8.3 yards per rushing attempt during the 2018 season. The former Trojan recorded a 56-yard rushing attempt in a Week 5 win over the Seahawks and a 4-yard rushing touchdown in a Week 16 win over the Cardinals.

The Rams allowed only 66 first quarter points during the 2020 regular season, including a shutout of Cowboys in Week 1, the New York Giants in Week 4, the Chicago Bears in Week 7, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in Week 11, the New England Patriots in Week 14 and the Seattle Seahawks in Week 16. In 2020 the Rams had an eight-game regular season streak where the team did not allow more than three points in the first quarter of the game.

The team has stayed focused in the first quarter during the 2021 season. Through nine games, only the Lions (10) have scored more than seven points in the first quarter against the Rams. A redzone interception on the first drive of the season kept the Chicago Bears scoreless. The following two drives for the Bears ended after failed conversions on fourth and four each time. Week 2 was another scoreless first quarter for the Rams D. In Week 3 the Buccaneers were forced to punt three straight times. Week 4, the defense finally allowed a second drive touchdown to QB Kyler Murray and the Arizona Cardinals, breaking the season long first quarter scoreless streak for the Rams. Week 5 in Seattle both teams were shutout in the first quarter. When the Rams traveled to New York for Week 6 the Giants were able to get a field goal to start the game, but no points followed. Week 7 saw the Lions get a first drive TD after RB D'Andre Swift broke off a screen for a 63-yard score. Then after a recovered onside kick a Lions FG followed on the second drive. Week 8 saw the Rams shutout Houston until the fourth quarter. In Week 9 Tennessee was shutout in the first quarter.

Last season, L.A. took the ball away from their opponents 30 times, the third-most in the NFL. L.A. scored a league-best 113 points off takeaways during the 2018 regular season.

Not only did the Rams take the ball away, they made their opponents pay for turning the ball over. L.A. finished the 2017 regular season ranked fifth in the league in total takeaways with 28. The Rams scored 126 points off of turnovers, the second-best total created by the defensive unit in 2017 and 26.4 percent of the team's points last season came following a takeaway, which was the fourth-highest percentage in the NFL.

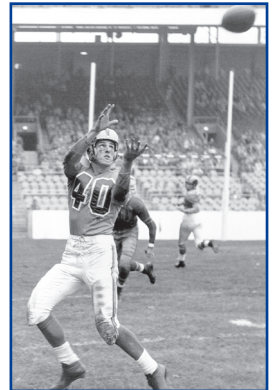

There was only one problem, No. 40 was worn by former Ram Elroy "Crazylegs" Hirsch (1949-1957), a College Football and Pro Football Hall of Famer. While Hirsch's number wasn't officially retired with the Rams, the last player to wear the number on a Rams jersey was DB Jack Morris (1958-1960) over the following three seasons after Hirsch left. Thus, Miller decided to ask for permission to wear the number from the Hirsch family and was granted their blessing.
