



BUTCH BARRY

ASSISTANT OFFENSIVE LINE

6TH NFL SEASON x 1ST WITH 49ERS

Butch Barry is in his first season as an 49ers assistant offensive line coach. He joined the 49ers after spending the 2020 season as a senior analyst with the Green Bay Packers.

The 2020 Green Bay Packers saw five offensive players earn selections to the Pro Bowl, including T David Bakhtiari and G Elgton Jenkins. Bakhtiari, along with C Corey Linsley, also earned Associated Press First-Team All-Pro honors last season. Green Bay finished the season ranked eighth in the NFL, averaging 132.4 rushing yards per game.

Barry went to Green Bay after spending the 2019 season as the offensive line coach at the University of Miami. With Miami, the Hurricanes offense saw freshman QB Jarren Williams become the first Miami QB to throw for more than 2,000 yards (2,187) since QB Brad Kaaya accomplished the feat in 2014. Barry's offensive line paved the way for a pair of 500-yard rushers in RBs DeeJay Dallas (693) and Cam'Ron Harris (576), with Dallas later being drafted by the Seattle Seahawks in the fourth round of the 2020 NFL Draft.

Barry joined Miami after four seasons (2015-18) as the assistant offensive line coach with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. The Buccaneers finished in the top 10 in total offense in three of his four seasons, including the 2018 season as Tampa Bay ranked third in the NFL averaging 415.5 yards per game and set a single-season club record with 6,648 total yards. Tampa Bay's offensive line helped the 2017 Buccaneers rank fourth in the NFL in passing yards per game (272.9) and ninth in total yards per game (363.5).

In 2015, the Buccaneers ranked fifth in the NFL in rushing yards per game (135.1) and second in yards per carry after finishing with a team record 4.75 average. RB Doug Martin finished the season with 1,402 rushing yards, the third-best total in team history and the second-most in the NFL. Tampa Bay's offensive line also protected QB Jameis Winston, who became the third rookie in NFL history to throw for more than 4,000 yards (4,042) and 20 touchdowns (22). Additionally, in 2015, Tampa Bay finished tied for the fourth-fewest sacks allowed in the NFL with 27 after ranking tied for 29th in that same category the season prior.

Prior to his time in Tampa Bay, Barry spent five seasons on the coaching staff at Central Michigan University, spending four years as tight ends coach (2010-13) and one season as offensive line coach (2014). In 2014, Central Michigan's offensive line helped RB Thomas Rawls rush for 1,103 yards and 10 touchdowns on 210 attempts (5.3 average). As tight ends coach, Barry worked with TE David Blackburn, who earned Second-Team All-Mid-American Conference honors as a senior in 2011 as he became the first Chippewas tight end to earn all-conference honors since 1996. That season, Blackburn set career highs in receptions (34), receiving yards (479) and touchdown receptions (five).



In 2009, Barry served as the offensive coordinator/offensive line coach/recruiting coordinator at North Greenville University, helping the Crusaders rank sixth national in fewest sacks allowed (nine). From 2006-08, Barry worked at Michigan Technological University, coaching offensive line all three seasons and also serving as the offensive coordinator for his final two seasons (2007-08). The Huskies rushed for more than 2,000 yards in each of his three seasons and averaged 30.1 points per game and 414.1 yards of offense per game in 2007.

Barry went to Michigan Tech after two seasons as the offensive line coach at Southwest Minnesota State (2004-05). In his first season in 2004, the Mustangs offense rushed for 1,770 yards and 22 touchdowns on 441 carries (4.0 average), including two games with 200-or-more yards and five touchdowns on the ground. He began his coaching career at CMU as a graduate assistant, a position he held for two seasons (2002-03).

Barry was a three-time letterman at Central Michigan, earning Academic All-Mid-American Conference honors in 2000 as a member of the Chippewas offensive line. A native of Sturgeon Bay, WI, he and his wife, Andrea, have two daughters, Aislin and Bridget, and one son, Finn.
