This week will mark the ninth contest between Dallas and San Francisco in the postseason, tied with the LA Rams for the most playoff games against a single opponent in Cowboys history.

Dallas has an all-time playoff record of 36-29. Its 36 postseason wins are tied with Pittsburgh and Green Bay for second all-time, trailing only New England's 37 playoff wins.

DALLAS COWBOYS 2022 SCHEDULE

The Cowboys schedule featured five games in 2022 that were broadcast nationally in primetime, including two from AT&T Stadium. In addition to the two primetime games at AT&T Stadium - both on NBC's *Sunday Night Football* - and the club's annual Thanksgiving Day national appearance (on FOX), the Cowboys made three national appearances in primetime on the road, one on ESPN's *Monday Night Football*, one on NBC's *SNF* and one on Thursday night on Amazon Prime video.

The Cowboys played eight games against teams that qualified for the 2022 playoffs - Cincinnati, Jacksonville, Minnesota, New York Giants (twice), Philadelphia (twice) and Tampa Bay.

This season marked the eighth time - third time in the last four seasons - that the Cowboys faced both Super Bowl participants from the previous season:

DAK PRESCOTT

- Dak Prescott is coming off four touchdown passes at Tampa Bay, joining Roger Staubach and Troy Aikman as the only quarterbacks in franchise history with four touchdowns in a playoff game. With three touchdown passes against the 49ers, Prescott will become the only Cowboys quarterback with three postseason games of three-or-more touchdown passes.
- * Prescott's 24 rushing yards gave him 96 career rushing yards in the playoffs and moved him past Troy Aikman (87) for the second-most career postseason rushing yards by a Cowboys quarterback. He trails only Roger Staubach (432) in franchise postseason history.
- * With 300 passing yards on Sunday, Prescott would tie Danny White (three) for the second-most 300-yard games in Cowboys postseason history.
- * This week's quarterback bout will feature Prescott (29), the oldest quarterback remaining in the NFL playoffs, and Brock Purdy (23), the second-youngest quarterback remaining in the postseason.

MICAH PARSONS

- Micah Parsons tallied his first career postseason sack at Tampa Bay last week. With a sack on Sunday, Parsons would be one-of-nine Cowboys defenders to have 2.0 postseason sacks in his first two seasons and the first since DeMarcus Lawrence in 2014.
- With 1.5 sacks against San Francisco, Parsons would be one-of-seven Cowboys defenders with a multi-sack game in the postseason in one of his first two seasons. The last Cowboys defender to do so was Michael Myers in 1999 (at Min, 1/9/00).

EZEKIEL ELLIOTT

Elliott (two) needs a rushing touchdown on Sunday to tie Don Perkins, Robert Newhouse and Scott Laidlaw for the fourth-most postseason rushing touchdowns in franchise history.

DARON BLAND

Rookie cornerback DaRon Bland led the Cowboys and ranked second among NFL rookies with five interceptions in 2022. With an interception in the postseason, Bland would become the first Cowboys rookie to record an interception in the playoffs since Larry Brown in 1991 (at Chicago, 12/29).

- Dalton Schultz (15) needs seven receptions to tie Doug Cosbie (22) for the fourth-most receptions by a tight end in franchise postseason history.
- * Schultz would also tie Cosbie (three) for the third-most career postseason touchdown receptions by a Cowboys tight end with a touchdown reception against the 49ers.

CEEDEE LAMB

CeeDee Lamb had three games with 10-or-more receptions in 2022, which tied Jason Witten (2010) and Michael Irvin (1995) for the most 10-catch games in a season in team history. The last Cowboys player with 10 receptions in a playoff game was Michael Irvin in 1995 (at San Francisco, 1/15).

DALLAS COWBOYS

With a win on Sunday, Dallas would tie New England (37) for the most playoff wins in NFL history.



- Head coach Mike McCarthy has an 11-9 career record in the postseason. With a win against the 49ers, McCarthy would pass John Harbaugh and Pete Carroll for the third-most playoff wins (11) among active NFL head coaches, behind only Bill Belichick (31) and Andy Reid (19). McCarthy's 12 wins would also tie Bill Cowher and Tom Coughlin for the ninth-most postseason victories all-time.
- * Dallas will play San Francisco in the postseason for the ninth time on Sunday, tied with the LA Rams for the most playoff games against a single opponent in Cowboys history.
- * With 400 net yards of offense on Sunday, it will mark the fourth season in franchise history first since 1994 that the Cowboys totaled 400-plus yards of offense in multiple postseason games.

EFFICIENCY IS KEY ★

Dak Prescott put together the best playoff performance of his career on Monday night at Tampa Bay, completing 75.8% of his passes for 305 yards and four touchdowns while adding a score on the ground.

Prescott's 75.8% completion rate was second among all quarterbacks in the Wild Card Round behind Kirk Cousins (79.5%). Prescott's 75.8% completion percentage finished as the second-highest in a single game in Cowboys postseason history:

Dak Prescott recorded four touchdown passes and a rushing touchdown in the 31-14 win at Tampa Bay. Prescott has recorded a rushing touchdown and passing touchdown in each of his last four playoff contests, the only player in NFL history with a rushing and

passing touchdown in four consecutive postseason games.

He is also the sixth NFL quarterback all-time with a passing and rushing score in four career playoff games:

Along with protecting the ball, Prescott dished out dimes all over the field to finish with 305 yards and four touchdowns through the air, the only player in Cowboys history with 300 passing yards

and four passing touchdowns in a playoff game.

He is the third Cowboys quarterback with four touchdown passes in a playoff game, joining Hall of Fame quarterbacks Roger Staubach and Troy Aikman:

Prescott has two career 300-yard passing games in the post-season (vs. GB, 1/15/17; at TB, 1/16/23), the third-most 300-yard games by a Cowboys quarterback in the playoffs, trailing Aikman (four) and Danny White (three).

\star SEARCH FOR SCHULTZ \star

Dalton Schultz led off the 2022 postseason with seven receptions for 95 yards and two touchdowns in the win at Tampa Bay becoming the first Cowboys tight end with multiple touchdown receptions in a playoff game.

Schultz's 95 receiving yards were the third-most by a tight end in Cowboys postseason history. He now has two of the four highest receiving yard totals by a tight end in Cowboys postseason history:

Tony Pollard provided an explosive spark out of the backfield at Tampa Bay, rushing for 77 yards on 15 carries (5.1 avg.). Pollard had three runs of 10-or-more yards against the Bucs, tied with J.K. Dobbins and Christian McCaffrey for the most explosive runs (10plus yards) out of all running backs in the Wild Card Round:

The Dallas defense came out firing on all cylinders, as a Jayron Kearse interception in the back of Dallas' end zone gave Tom Brady his first red zone interception as a Buccaneer. Additionally, the Cowboys shut out Tampa Bay in the first half to take an 18-0 lead into the break.

Monday night marked the third time in franchise history - first since 1996 - that the Cowboys held an opponent scoreless in the first half of a playoff game:

★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 6-10 record in 2020, a 12-5 record in 2021, and a 12-5 mark in 2022, he owns the fifth-most wins (20th all-time) and sixth-highest winning percentage (.614) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles and one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

HEAD COACHES

MIKE McCARTHY (166-106-2, 16th Year, 31-21 with Dallas)
The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, and he has led the franchise to back-to-back playoff appearances for the first time since 2006-07. He has also won 12 games in each of the last two seasons, the first time Dallas posted consecutive seasons with 12-plus wins since 1994-95.

McCarthy is in his 16th year as a head coach - 13 with Green Bay and three with Dallas - along with 13 years as an assistant coach in

the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 155-97-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the fifth-most wins (20th alltime) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles, one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season.

In 2021 McCarthy led the Cowboys to the franchise's first NFC East title in three years, along with a 12-5 regular season record. Under McCarthy, Dallas led the league in total offense (407.0), scoring

offense (31.2 points-per-game) and takeaways (34).

In his first season with the Cowboys, McCarthy's plan to install a new culture in Dallas was halted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Due to COVID protocols, McCarthy's first offseason with the Cowboys included no in-person meetings or practices and a season-ending injury to his starting quarterback in Week 5. Despite the hurdles, the 2020 Cowboys were in position to win the NFC East entering Week 17 but came up just short.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in

points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-or-more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, Mc-Carthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10).

KYLE SHANAHAN (57-48, 6th Year)

The San Francisco 49ers named Kyle Shanahan the 20th head coach in franchise history on Feb. 6, 2017. In five years, Shanahan turned a struggling 49ers team into playoff contenders, guiding the club to its second division title and third postseason appearance in 2022

After earning a spot in the 2021 postseason as a wild card, Shanahan's club took home the NFC West Division title in 2022 with a 13-4 record. The 49ers offense finished the year fifth with an average of 365.6 yards-per-game and sixth with an average of 26.5 points-per-game - finishing the season with their third different starting quarterback. On the other side of the ball, San Francisco's defense was the stinglest, yielding 16.3 points-per-game and just 300.6 yards-per-outing. The rush defense finished second, allowing only 77.7 yards-per-game.

In the two years prior to Shanahan's arrival, San Francisco went a combined 7-25. Shanahan started the rebuild from scratch, and after enduring two losing seasons in 2017-18, the 43-year-old head coach broke through in his third year.

In 2019 Shanahan led the 49ers to a 13-3 regular season record, the NFC West Division title and an appearance in Super Bowl LIV. San Francisco's nine-win improvement from 2018-19 was the largest win improvement from one season to the next in franchise history. Shanahan was named Coach of the Year by Sporting News in 2019.

Shanahan's offensive presence was immediately felt upon his arrival in the Bay Area. In his first season at the helm, the 2017 49ers averaged 349.2 yards-per-game, the highest output by San Francisco since 2012. Shanahan's high-flying offense also finished 2017 with 3,925 net passing yards, the most in a 49ers season since 2000.

Prior to arriving in San Francisco, Shanahan had 13 seasons of NFL coaching experience. Nine of the seasons included offensive coordinator stints at Atlanta (2015-16), Cleveland (2014), Washington (2010-13) and Houston (2008-09).

Following the 2016 season, Shanahan was named Associated Press Assistant Coach of the Year after helping the Falcons to a Super Bowl LI appearance. In nine seasons as a coordinator, six of Shanahan's offenses ranked in the top-10 in yards gained

Shanahan was just 26 years old when he was named the wide receivers coach of the Houston Texans. Just two years later, Shanahan was named the Houston offensive coordinator at 28 years old, the youngest coordinator in the NFL.

Three of the four teams in the NFC East clinched a playoff spot in the 2022 postseason, marking the third season since the NFL's realignment in 2002 that the NFC East sent three teams to the playoffs - 2006 and 2007.

All three NFC East teams - Cowboys, Giants and Eagles - advanced to the Divisional Round, the only time since 2002 that three teams from the same division advanced to the Divisional Round. It's just the fourth time since the NFL merger in 1970 that a division sent three teams to the Divisional Round - 1985 AFC East, 1992 NFC East and 1997 NFC North.

The first time these two clubs met, the Dallas Cowboys were just nine weeks old and lost their first eight games. Dallas hosted San Francisco on Nov. 20, 1960 and lost 14-26 in front of 10,000 fans at the Cotton Bowl.

The last time the Cowboys and 49ers faced off was in a Wild Card Playoff Game in 2021. The 49ers held off a late rally from Dallas and downed the Cowboys 23-17 in front of 93,470 fans at AT&T Stadium.

PRO BOWL COWBOYS

Seven Dallas Cowboys were named to the 2023 NFL Pro Bowl last week, the most the club has sent to the game since eight were named in 2018. Pro Bowl selections are determined by fans, players and coaches, with each group's vote counting one-third toward deciding the rosters.

From the offense, Zack Martin (eighth) was named a starter, while CeeDee Lamb (second) and Tony Pollard (first) both earned a spot on the NFC roster. Martin's eight selections tie him for the sixth-most by a Cowboy, tie him with Tyron Smith for the second-most by a Dallas offensive lineman and are one behind Larry Allen (nine) for the most by a Cowboys guard.

Representing the Dallas defense is DeMarcus Lawrence (third selection), along with Trevon Diggs and Micah Parsons - both selected as starters for their second consecutive years. Diggs earned his second straight Pro Bowl selection, becoming the first Cowboys cornerback since Deion Sanders (1996-99) to make it in consecutive years. Parsons is the seventh player in franchise history to make the Pro Bowl in each of his first two NFL seasons, and just the third defensive player overall, along with Everson Walls (1981-82) and Mel Renfro (1964-65).


Rounding out the Cowboys Pro Bowl roster is first time selection KaVontae Turpin, who becomes just the seventh Dallas Cowboys rookie to earn a spot on the all-star roster since 2000 and the 13th overall. Turpin earned a spot as the NFC's return specialist and becomes the 12th different Dallas Cowboys special teamer (13th appearance), fourth non-kicker and first designated return specialist to earn the honor.

This season ushers in a change to the Pro Bowl format. The NFL will debut the 2023 Pro Bowl Games including:

- Three NFC vs. AFC flag football games Gridiron Gauntlet: A full-field relay race between six NFC players and six AFC players
- Move The Chains: An offensive and defensive lineman strength and speed competition
- Best Catch Finals: Two fan-selected winners from Thursday's Skills competition will compete for thetitle







Since Prescott returned from a thumb injury in Week 7, the Cowboys led the NFL in third down offense, converting 52.3% of their third down chances and ranked fifth (45.5%) in the NFL spanning the entire season. After Week 6, Dallas was 29th in the NFL with a 32.1% third down conversion rate.



Dallas converted at least 50.0% of its third downs in seven consecutive games (at Min, 11/20 - at Ten, 12/29), the first time that the Cowboys went seven straight games with a 50.0% conversion rate-or-better since a seven-game streak in 2014 (at Cle, 9/7 - vs. Cin, 10/5).

The Cowboys started 2022 first round draft pick Tyler Smith at left tackle in their season opener against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers due to an injury to Tyron Smith in training camp. Tyler Smith became the first Cowboys rookie to start at left tackle in the season opener.

Overall, the Dallas offensive line was blitzed on 28.7% of its passing plays, the ninth-highest rate in the league. Despite the amount of pressure, the Cowboys were fourth in the NFL with 27 allowed sacks. Additionally, the Cowboys allowed 190 pressures, the 10th-fewest in the NFL per *PFF*:

For only the second time in franchise history, the Dallas Cowboys used a top-five pick on a running back when they chose Ezekiel Elliott out of Ohio State with the fourth overall selection in the 2016 NFL Draft. Dallas selected Tony Dorsett with the second pick in the 1977 NFL Draft.

In his first season, Elliott had seven 100-yard rushing games - most by a Cowboys rookie all-time and tied for the NFL lead in 2016. He owns 30 for his career to rank third all-time in team history.







FRICK AND FRACK

With Dalton Schultz battling injuries at the beginning of the season, 2022 fourth round draft pick Jake Ferguson and undrafted free agent Peyton Hendershot stepped up for the Cowboys offense this season.

Named after the 1937 comedic ice skating duo "Frick and Frack" by Coach McCarthy in a Week 8 press conference, the two young tight ends were close both on and off the field.

Ferguson and Hendershot both found the end zone twice in 2022, becoming two-of-seven tight ends in franchise history to catch multiple touchdowns in their rookie seasons:







★ TAKEAWAYS IN BUNCHES ★

The Cowboys led the NFL with 33 takeaways in 2022 just one season after leading the league with 34 takeaways. Dallas was the first team to lead the NFL in takeaways in back-to-back seasons since Pittsburgh from 1972-74 (three straight seasons):

★ I'LL TAKE THAT ★

In Dan Quinn's first season as the defensive play caller, Dallas tied for the league lead with a +14 turnover differential in 2021. In Quinn's second season with the Cowboys, Dallas once again led the league with a +10 turnover differential:

Dallas finished the season with a turnover margin of +10 just one season after totaling a +14 turnover margin. The Cowboys posted a turnover differential of +10-or-more in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1998-99.

★ NO TOUCHDOWNS ALLOWED ★

The Cowboys allowed 20.1 points-per-game in 2022, the fifth-fewest in the NFL. Dallas also tied Denver for the sixth-fewest touchdowns allowed (35) in 2022:

After ranking 24th in opponent negative plays in 2020, Dallas has taken down opponents behind the line of scrimmage at a high rate since Dan Quinn's arrival last season. In 2022 the Cowboys passed 2021's opponent negative plays mark (99), as they were fourth in the NFL with 115 opponent negative plays:

Dallas has put an emphasis on takeaways since Dan Quinn arrived as defensive coordinator in 2021. In 2022 Dallas made an effort to jar the ball loose from opposing ball carriers, as the Cowboys led the league with 20 forced fumbles, which is also the most by a Cowboys team since the stat became official in 1994:

The Cowboys held opponents to 87-of-231 on third downs in 2022, a 37.7% opponent third down conversion rate that was ninth in the NFL. When limiting opposing offenses on first and second down, the Cowboys defense gave opponents fits on third-and-long (more than six yards), ranking third in the league.

Maher then made a 60-yarder at Minnesota (11/20/22), upping his NFL record to four field goals of 60-plus yards:

Brett Maher signed with the Cowboys during training camp in Oxnard, California prior to the season. Maher exceeded expectations, going 29-for-32 on field goals this season, amounting to a career-high 90.6% field goal percentage that tied for eighth in the NFL

Along with his accuracy, Maher racked up points, thanks to a potent Dallas offense. Maher's 137 kicking points tied for third in the NFL and finished as a single-season franchise record:

At Philadelphia (10/16) Turpin returned a kick 63 yards to set up a Cowboys field goal prior to halftime. Against Detroit (10/23) he caught a punt at his own seven-yard line before returning it 52 yards, the fourth-longest punt return of the season.

Turpin is the only NFL player this season with a 50-yard punt return and a 50-yard kick return. The last Cowboys player with a

50-yard kick return and 50-yard punt return in the same season was Ryan Switzer in 2017.



In 2018 Harrington was the running backs coach and run game coordinator at Independence Community College in Independence, Kansas, leading the Pirates to 147.7 rushing yards-per-game.





PRO: The Dallas Cowboys brought in a familiar face to provide training camp competition to Lirim Hajrullahu when they signed Brett Maher on Aug. 9. Maher, who kicked for Dallas from 2018-19, spent the 2021 season with the New Orleans Saints, where he made 16-of-18 field goal attempts for a career-high 88.9% field goal percentage. In two seasons with the Cowboys, Maher made 49-of-66 field goals (74.2%) and holds the club record for the longest made field goal, a 63-yarder against Philadelphia (10/20/19). Following his departure from Dallas toward the end of the 2019 season, Maher spent time with four other teams in 2020 - the N.Y.
