San Francisco 49ers vs. Chicago Bears Game Notes Sunday, September 14, 2014

Moving The Chains

• The **49ers offense** converted 7 of 13 (53.8%) 3rd down atts., vs. Chi. This marks the second time under head coach Jim Harbaugh that the team has converted at least 50 pct. of their 3rd down atts. in consecutive games [7 of 12 (58.3%) at Dal. (9/7/14)]. The last time the 49ers converted at least 50 pct. of their 3rd down atts. in consecutive games was 10/20/13 at Ten. [8 of 16 (50.0%)] and 10/27/13 at Jax. [6 of 9 (66.7%)].

Century Mark

• T **Joe Staley** started his 100th game with the 49ers, becoming the 20th offensive lineman in franchise history to have played in 100-or-more games.

Block Party

- On the first series of the game, LB **Aaron Lynch** blocked a punt by P Patrick O'Donnell, giving the 49ers the ball at the Bears 8-yard line. The blocked punt led to a 3-yd. TD pass from QB **Colin Kaepernick** to WR **Michael Crabtree**.
- It marked the first blocked punt by the 49ers since WR **Kassim Osgood** blocked P Jon Ryan's punt vs. Sea. (12/8/13).

First Touchdown at Levi's® Stadium

• WR **Michael Crabtree** registered his first TD recept. of the season and 23rd of his career on a 3-yd. pass from QB **Colin Kaepernick**. It marked the first TD in Levi's® Stadium history.

Gore-geous Play

• RB **Frank Gore** found the end zone with an 8-yd. TD run. It marked his first TD of the season and 61st of his career.

Sack Machine

• DT **Justin Smith** registered 1.0 sack of Bears QB Jay Cutler. It marked his 3rd of the season and 85th of his career. His 3.0 sacks are tied for the most he's had through the first two games of a season in his career (2006).

First Career Catch

• TE **Derek Carrier** notched his first career recept. on a 22-yd. pass from QB **Colin Kaepernick**. He finished the game with 3 recepts. for 41 yds.

What happened in the second half there? Were the Bears doing things differently?

"They made some really good plays. Made some great plays. A couple interceptions that were just really good plays."

Fifteen or 16 penalties for the Niners, is that a major problem? It was today, I guess.

"[Nods head]."

What would you attribute that to?

"Don't know exactly."

What was the explanation given for the penalty on QB Colin Kaepernick? Did the official explain more what the inappropriate language was?

"No, he did not."

Did you hear anything?

"I did not."

Did you feel, after you guys got the 17-point lead, that you guys took the foot off the accelerator a little bit?

"No, didn't feel that way."

What happened with the delay of game on the final drive?

"That shouldn't have been a delay of game. Just took too much time at the line of scrimmage."

You guys had the third-and-six down there on the first drive of the third quarter, why the run play at that point?

"Which one? What yard line?"

The first drive of the third quarter. You got all the way down there and it was third-and-six--?

"Yeah, it was a run-pass option. We chose the run play."

Two plays were sent in?

"No."

Was Colin confused at what he was seeing sometimes tonight? I think he threw three interceptions.

"I think he was seeing things good. He threw some pretty darn good balls that got intercepted. Some really well played balls that got intercepted. Tip of the cap to the defense. But the young guy made a couple great plays."

You don't think he was trying too hard or forcing things at all?

"We're always trying hard."

Does this sting even more because it's the first regular season game in this building?

"It stings to lose. And we all have fingerprints on it."

You've been around football a long time. You've been in this situation before. How do you get back? How do you bounce back?

"Well, we'll look to see where we can improve and how we can be better for it. Bears made plays, especially in that second half. And we look at where the breakdowns were and where we can get better from them, how we can improve. And that's what you do. Make darn sure it doesn't happen again."

How's TE Vernon Davis?

"I don't know. I did not talk to Vernon after the game."

After the Kaepernick fumble, was he injured at all after that play? I didn't really see him running too much after that play.

"He had some pretty good runs after that."

There were a lot of penalties. Any penalties in particular that you took issue with or were the flags okay in your mind?

"Not allowed to talk about that."

How did you feel about the performance of the right side of the offensive line?

"I think we're all going to look at this one and feel like we have fingerprints on it. And go back and see where we can improve. How we can be better for it. Can't really single out one particular segment at this point."

How about the DB Jimmie Ward matchup with WR Brandon Marshall? Seemed like Marshall kind of got his number there a little bit towards the end. How do you feel you guys could have changed up that matchup or could Ward have done anything different? Or did Marshall kind of takeover at the end?

"Really, I feel like we all have fingerprints on this one, and we'll look and see exactly what we could have done differently or how we can improve from it. And I feel like we will be able to and we'll come back stronger for it."

Colin, how do you evaluate your personal performance in the game? "Terrible."

Turnovers...Were you trying to do too much you think maybe?

"I mean, I made the throws I wanted to but they made plays on the ball."

Your two interceptions to your left, what did you see on those two passes?

"We had off-coverage on the one to Crab [WR Michael Crabtree], the DB made a great play. The other one, we had cover three and tried to hit a seam route."

What changed in the second half? You guys started off so strong in the first.

"We hurt ourselves. We weren't executing the way we should have been."

Colin, what did you say that got you the penalty after the interception?

"I didn't say anything."

You didn't use a slur of any kind?

"No."

But were you shocked when he announced that it was inappropriate language? "Yes."

It seemed like Bears DE Lamarr Houston was trying to bait you into something that was...You didn't say anything back?

"No."

Colin, when you have a game like this, a bad game, and people obviously are going to have good games and bad games, do you get down on yourself? What do you do? Do you say, 'Hey, I'm going to come back' as opposed to telling us what you are going to do? "You have to come back, that's your only choice."

Sometimes a player feels more confident than the stats with their game, than the stats might show. Despite the four turnovers, did you feel you had control of your game tonight?

"I'm not going to say I felt good about the game or what I did but as far as my decisions, I mean, I saw the coverage's. I went where I wanted to with the ball. We just didn't make the plays. I didn't make the throws."

A couple of your offensive teammates said that they thought you guys kind of took the foot off the accelerator a little bit. Did you feel that way offensively that you didn't continue to press when you got that lead and go for the jugular?

"We didn't execute the way we should have. I think that was the biggest thing."

Were the penalties what might have caused what took the gas out of you guys?

"We can't allow things like that to affect how we play."

On that final pass to Crabtree, was he your first read on that play?

"He was one of."

Colin, what did you see on that play?

"They had cover three, we got the look we wanted. We just have to make that play."

Colin, on your fumble, was it a matter of Bears DE Jared Allen just getting his helmet on the ball? Is there a way to prevent that from?

"He did get his helmet on the ball but regardless, I have to protect the ball. I can't turn it over."

You guys got such a slew of penalties. Did you discuss that at all with your teammates or the coaches?

"Well, we can't worry about that. We have to worry about what we are doing and executing."

On the interception did you see the safety coming over or did you think you had that catch? "No, I thought I had it. Kaep put it on a rope. I was focused on getting the ball."

QB Colin Kaepernick is a tough critic of himself. What was his mood like as the turnovers were happening?

"He was tough on himself but at the same time he realized that we still had a game to play. He came back out and he battled."

This team is so used to getting out to leads and winning when you do. Was there a little shock when it was suddenly 17-17?

"That's the NFL. Wins are tough to come by. When you have a team down, you definitely have to put your foot on their throat because nobody's going to quit in this league. That was evident tonight in the way they continued to play and the way they continued to work their butts off. They made it a game."

Could you talk about TE Derek Carrier coming in? With TE Vernon Davis and TE Vance McDonald going out, it was really his first game action. How did he fit into the offense?

"Derek played well, as we expect him to. He's a great athlete. We see those plays made by him on the practice field all the time. For us, it's not surprising."

I know it's disappointing, always, to lose, but here in the home opener, coming up short, especially having a big lead like that—just describe the emotions here in the locker room and how you're feeling.

"To be honest, it sucks. It's the first game ever in Levi's® Stadium. You want to end it on a good note. I think we turned the ball over too much. We as an offense need to pick it up. We can't leave our defense out to dry like that. We've got to get back in the meeting rooms, look at things and get better. There's always room for improvement, but not a great way to start the home openers."

Besides the turnovers, did anything else change in what they were doing or in how they were affecting you guys that way?

"No, I just think the biggest thing is we've got to play for 60 minutes. We stalled out a little bit and then we tried to regain our momentum, and then the turnovers hit. We've just got little things to clean up. It's on everybody on the offense. It starts with the offensive line. We've got to get better and we will."

How did it feel to get back in the fray?

"Good. It's always good to be out there fighting, having fun. Losing sucks, but to be out there felt good."

You guys have to bounce back obviously. You've got another tough division opponent next week, another physical team. Just talk about rebounding and turning it around.

"This next on is huge—the Cardinals, it counts for two. We need to rebound. We can't slip up. They're a good team. They're a great team. You go down to their house, it get loud, it gets feisty. This is going to be a big game for us to really show if we can be the team we think we are."

What was your take on the turnaround in the game?

"Turnovers. It was like how we played last week against the Cowboys, causing all of those turnovers in the first half. They got us this week. We turned the ball over four times, so it was kind of like how last week was. But it was on the other end of the table this time."

What changed in what they were doing?

"Calls and turnovers. They also had good field position. Every time our defense came on the field they were already on their 30, ready to score. They were already in field goal position at least three times in the second half."

How do you bounce back?

"We should have stopped them because of our defense and how we play the game. But they just had a better play call than we did and they were able to score touchdowns. This week we're just going to have to bounce back and regroup."

What about penalties?

"I just think that's something the NFL is going to have to correct. They called about 16 or 17 penalties on us today and I think they called 11 on them. That's way too many penalties for a football game."

Even though you had a 17-point lead, you've got to keep pushing, right?

"You've got to keep pushing. I think we gave them a touchdown right before halftime. When we came out, we actually had a good drive when we first came out offensively. We weren't able to capitalize on the score but we were able to get three points on the board. From there, the whole fourth quarter they caused turnovers. That was the momentum swing."

Was there a turning point in the game?

"When the score was 20-10. They got that interception and then they were able to get the ball and score. Then getting back on the field and causing another turnover and being able to score, and gaining a one-point lead on us. Then causing another turnover and being able to score again. That was the game, turnovers caused the game."

How disappointing was it to lose the first regular season game here?

"It was very disappointing. When it's a new stadium and when the 49ers organization has so much history behind them, we just wanted to come out here and win the game for the team and for the organization. That was what I wanted to do, and I'm pretty sure everyone else in the locker room wanted to win the game as well."

What could you guys have done differently?

"I don't know. I need to watch the film. It's hard for me to say because I'm playing only one position and doing my job. Like I said, we'll go back and watch film and get better. That's the only thing we can do. It's early in the season. I'm not going to cry over it. I'm just going to keep working hard. Like I said, we got room for improvement."

Is there something that Chicago did differently defensively in the second half?

"We just need to be in attack mode in the first half. That's what it is. Don't let up on the gas. Their guys, they played good in the second half. They came out, offense put some touchdowns up and they got the W. Not to say that they were the better team, but they came out with the W. And like I said, we need to go back and make it happen."

Did it feel like you guys let off the gas?

"No, I wouldn't say that. Not all the way. I won't talk about it that much. We got room for improvement and we need to go to practice and make it happen. The last play was me. I'm not going to do it alone. It

happens. It's football. I'm coming back stronger next week and so is all the rest of the receivers, the offense, the D-line, the DBs. We're coming back stronger. That's 49er football."

You specifically—I know that 54-yard run was taken back, but was that a statement that you still have it and can score from 50 yards out?

"It's football. God blessed me with the gift to play football, and like I said, I could tell how I feel in the offseason by my training—I know what I can do. It's a blessing that I'm still here. It's football, so I play the game I'm supposed to play—play hard and try my best to give my team whatever I have to do to help us win."

That run was kind of symptomatic of the way the game played out. You had a great run and it gets called back by a penalty—so many penalties tonight.

"We've got to watch the tape and we've just got to clean it up. We've got to clean it up and move on. We've got Arizona next week. They're 2-0 and they're feeling themselves. They're a tough team, great team, and they're playing great ball, so we've just got to watch the film and I think we've just got to finish better."

Given that you were up 17-0 and you had the stadium opener, how disappointing is this particular night?

"When you're up, and like you said, new stadium with the fans, great fans, when you're up like that you've got to go for the kill. We let them get back into the game. We didn't finish and they beat us."

Did you have any words with Kap (QB Colin Kaepernick) afterwards?

"It's football. I told him it's football, keep his head up. He'll come back. He's a ballplayer and a tough quarterback. It's football. You have your ups and downs. Kap is going to bounce back, we know that."

Did you guys feel like maybe the team lacked a little bit of intensity after you guys got off to that lead?

"I won't say that. They made plays. It's NFL ball; they're here for a reason, we're here for a reason. They kept fighting and we didn't finish."

As a team leader, Frank, what do you say to the team after a loss like this?

"Just got to keep our head up, watch the film and do better. Whatever mistakes we had, we've got to clean them up to get ready for next week."

In the redzone, it seemed like you guys bogged down a little bit. I don't know what you can possibly say about it other than it just seems like breakdowns more than anything else?

"Yeah, you know, it's frustrating like I said. It's your own season, it's a long season. The trick is not to go up and down with your emotions. Don't get too high with your highs, too low with your lows. It's one of those things – you've got to learn from this loss. Being up 17 and then coming back getting beat in your own place and move forward and win next week.

How would you evaluate the way you played in this game?

"You know, I thought I played well for a lot of the game. That last drive is obviously not up to par. So, it's frustrating. It's something to improve on. Got to do better next time, next game."

In the second half, the Chicago Bears were doing a lot of disguising. Is that what you guys saw and were they doing some things that you weren't necessarily prepared for?

"A little bit. On the field from the sideline, everything they did we've been through. We knew what they were going to do. They've got a lot of veterans; they're not trying to trick anybody. Their guys are playing their scheme, playing their defense. We just need to execute better and then not turn the football over. And it's not anybody's fault. Everybody had fingerprints on it. We just need to do better."

You guys have won a million games just like this, right? Up 17-0? Does this seem strange to kick back a game when you had it under control?

"It hurts to let that one slip away. I know if we play a little bit better, more efficient on offense, I think we walk out of there with a win. It just seemed like one play here, one play there, not having everybody on the same page, a penalty. Those things kill you, obviously. They came back and beat us. Momentum shifted. We just have to execute better."

We know QB Colin Kaepernick is as tough upon himself as anybody. What was his mood throughout the turnovers?

"Even with turnovers it was everybody's fault from the blocking scheme, protection, the throw, and the routes. We all had fingerprints on it. It was group mistakes. He's hard on himself, but even through the game, we still had a game to win. He's confident going in ready to lead our team down the field. That was his attitude."

What was your take on the second half and what did they do well?

"Those guys are pros, too. They go into halftime and make adjustments. They came out and played a good half and made some big plays on defense. You have to keep your foot on the pedal. They're professionals too and they made more plays than we did in the second half."

How disappointing was it not only to lose the game, but to lose it here in the first regular season game?

"We want to win every game, especially the home opener and at the new stadium. We wanted to put on a good show and win the football game. That's every week. If we don't perform better, it's going to be tough to win any games no matter where they are or what part of the season they're in. We need to take care of the football."

Are penalties another thing that needs to be cleaned up? You had 16 penalties today.

"That's unacceptable. Turnovers and penalties, especially the point in the game where they were made, that's losing football."

This had to be particularly disappointing given the fact this was the opener for Levi's® Stadium? Was that in your mind or when you're in the game, you're in the game?

"No, I wasn't thinking about that at all in the game. Obviously before and after the game you think about those things. You would love to open the stadium with a win, but hey, this is the NFL, you lose games. Like I said, we've just got to get out back out there and play again next week."

The Bears big receivers posed big problems, especially in the second half, and Bears WR Brandon Marshall showed why he's an All-Pro.

"Yeah, they definitely did. [Bears QB Jay] Cutler made some good throws in the redzone, they made some good catches. If we could have broken up a couple of those passes, we might have had a better chance, but they did a good job. Give them credit."

"That's a tough one. We put ourselves in some bad situations, but we've got to bounce back. This one is over. It's done with. We've got to look ahead to our next game."

Opening comments:

"This is just a tough one to swallow. Just have to come back next week. It's a long season. [DT] Justin [Smith] says it all the time that it's hard to win in this league and that proves it. They're good too, so we've just got to come back out here, get healthy and just get back right."

Is it a tough one, because your unit did basically everything it set out to do in this game? It's hard to see how you would improve on what the defense did.

Run defense, it looked like you guys tightened that up pretty good?

Opening comments:

"It's very disappointing in the sense that knowing the first home game here at the new stadium, all of the events and stuff that was going on and then us needing the win that's what we wanted. Not getting that done, it doesn't feel good."

Was there any distraction or anything with all of the hoopla going on?

"No, there was no distraction. We put the loss on us as a football team, not on anybody else. We all had a fingerprint on that game and we win as a team and we lose as a team."

How do you assess being up 17-0 and allowing them to get back in the game defensively?

"I don't have one particular word to say. But, anytime you have an opportunity to be up on a team like that, you have to capitalize, you have to put even more pressure on them and we didn't do that. We didn't play a complete football game as a defense and that's on us. We have to do better. But, that's the thing about the National Football League in the regular season is you get the opportunity to out and watch film win or loss and you get better from it."

Is it getting better on both sides of the ball, the calls, is it getting harder to know what you can legally do sometimes?

"The only thing that I'm going to do is smile on that. We have to cut down on the penalties. Whether that's on us or whatever it is, we have to do better on that end. That's all I have to say."

With Chicago Bears WR Brandon Marshall in particular, how tough is he in the redzone?

"He's a tough guy. He's tough to cover by anyone on the field. I think for the most part we had done really well on him. It's just getting him in the redzone, he's a big body. The youngster [DB Jimmie] Ward was fighting his tail off and doing all that we ask him to do. The plays just went their way on those."

Did you talk to Jimmie after the game?

"No, I just talked to him during the game. I'm sure that I'll talk to him tomorrow sometime. We tend to always have a conversation. But, my hat goes off to him. To come in early like he has, it's still early. My thing to him is to not get down on himself. To take his game and understand the magnitude of the NFL and the receivers that are here. I know that he will and he's going to be better before each game."

Press Conference – September 14, 2014

San Francisco 49ers vs. Chicago Bears

Opening statement:

"I'll just start out by saying I'm very proud of our football team the way they overcame adversity last week by going back to work, taking one day at a time, alleviating the noise that was going on outside of our building which was expected based on the way we played a week ago. We went to work and played four quarters tonight. We certainly didn't start well in all three phases. Our guys gathered themselves and went back to work and just want to congratulate our coaches, our players for staying with it and finishing the entire game."

To get the night you got out of WR Brandon Marshall not knowing coming in today whether he'd play at all, what were your thoughts on his performance tonight?

"I thought he was excellent. The play he made really sparked us, that was an exceptional catch on any field at any time and I think that really sparked our football team."

The injury to CB Charles Tillman, how serious is it?

"I don't know anything about the injuries right now. I know what we saw is that [SChris] Conte was out of the game and Charles [Tillman] was out of the game and [CB] Sherrick [McManis] was out of the game but I haven't had a chance to talk to anyone about any of the injuries.

How were the receivers able to overcome that slow start because it seemed early on they were really sitting on everything and then in the second half they just... (inaudible)

"I just think that they did a good job game planning us defensively. I think they did a good job with field position, there were so just so many factors in this game in terms of early penalties, special teams issues, dropped passes, 17 yard drives where penalties extended the drive, long field, just so many things happened in the first half to our football team. As I said we were lucky to be down 10 points at halftime because we had the two turnovers that we didn't do anything with in the first half. I think we just settled down and started playing and then guys started making plays. The pass rush really started to unfold and we put pressure on [QB] Colin [Kaepernick] and things started happening. We're on a short field with a couple of drives and we're able to finish with one long drive. Just so many things happened, but it was almost a complete inverted second half with all three phases coming together."

How excited were you with CB Kyle Fuller?

"Charles [Tillman] goes down, he has to go outside, comes up with a couple huge of plays for us that obviously put us in scoring position."

QB Jay Cutler's second half is what you want to see a quarterback do is be that efficient and take it all on himself.

"I think Jay has had as I said to [WBBM Newsradio 780 Host] Tom [Thayer] and to [WBBM Newsradio 780 Host] Jeff [Joniak] on the radio, I think Jay has really had an excellent start to the season minus one play. I think he's played really well and he led the way this whole week. He did it through his demeanor right after the game, he did it throughout the week in our building with the way he carried himself, the way he supported his teammates, the way he prepared for this game. We all looked to him this week to see how he would handle the adversity of last week and he stood tall throughout the week and our players followed."

How proud are you of the defense that came up with some huge plays?

"Huge. We've got a long way to go. We've got a lot of work to do and I think that some of that was evident tonight in all three phases. Our guys did step up against an extremely explosive team, explosive quarterback who can do damage so many different ways, explosive receivers, great back and a really good offense. I was just really happy to see them have success we were seeing in practice. I said throughout the week we were seeing it on tape in practice. We're fitting the run better, we were running to the ball better. There were some tremendous tackles tonight and some misses of course. We played a good team. They're going to win some, but the guys kept coming back and it was good to see them have success."

You mentioned how great of a catch it was by Brandon Marshall, how important was it to get those points in at halftime? Did it change the mood?

"I think it was incredibly important to have something to hang our hat on. We fell apart in all three phases and couldn't get anything started and we got in our own way on a lot of it with no disrespect to the 49ers."

Special teams penalties, and sometimes that's something that can really hold you back.

"We didn't have any penalties on defense and special teams that's why all these games here, they're all their own story. We had enough penalties to really hurt ourselves tonight that really changed field position dramatically. We had the blocked kick, we had a fumbled quarterback snap getting the ball in short field. Our defense had two short fields on touchdowns to my recollection and we held them to two field goals I believe on two other drives. When you think about it, there's 14 plus six that's 20 points right there. I'm thinking it was 20 points on short fields and turnovers relative to the offensive side of the ball or the blocked kick. I could be wrong, but I think I'm close."

Was there a unique challenge for Jay Cutler tonight? WR Brandon Marshall and WR Alshon Jeffery were playing but they're not at normal strength so is this a feeling out process of where to put the ball and how much they've got?

"I wouldn't read that much into it. I'm sure that's part of it and we had talked a lot about this during the week that if they didn't play we were just going to throw to the guys and work the progression and if they did play we would do the same thing. We weren't going to get caught up in who's in and who wasn't because we didn't know how much they were going to play or if they were going to play. Even at the start of the game we didn't know how much they would be able to play so we didn't worry ourselves about it. We just called plays and tried to continue to probe the defense as the game went on."

After the type of loss you had last week and then to have this kind of win with you coming back from the adversity, what can this do psychologically for this team?

"We'll see. As I told the team as you go on this marathon of a football season, you're going to have opportunities to gain some backbone and I think this really helped us and will help us. The bottom line is we'll go back to work. That was the message in the locker room is, the reason why we're able to get to this point is we went back to work last week and focused on each and every day in practice. Doing our job, being at our best each day in our preparation on and off the field in and out of Halas Hall and that's what enabled us to have an opportunity tonight and that's what we have to do next week. We're going to do the same thing. We're going to get some rest. We've got an extra day of rest this week with the Monday night game and then we're going to go back to work and try to get better as a football team one day at a time."

The greatest upside in DE Will Young it seems like he just keeps coming.

"I think Willie is a high-motored guy. He loves to play the game. I think you see that in the way he plays and he comes to work every day with a smile on his face. He loves football and you see it transcend into the games obviously is tremendously exciting. We brought him in as a guy to sign to be our starting defensive end and as I've said many times [DE] Jared [Allen] came in, we're rotating him around and it's going to help us throughout the season. We've got three guys that we can move around like that."

Obviously you had the short field on CB Kyle Fuller's interceptions, but in the first half with two turnovers and the three and outs, was there something that you had to remind them on in the importance of taking advantage of those?

"I really can't even answer that. I'm not trying to avoid the question, but I really don't remember to give you answer with any kind of content to it."

Jay, how big was the drive at the end of the first half?

Cutler: "Yeah, well we had to have it. We struggled early on. I think they had a really good plan on defense. We liked our plan as well, but it's just a matter of figuring them out and getting our play-calling situated."

What does it say about your team that you're able to come back from being down by 17, especially on the road against the 49ers?

Cutler: "The defense did a great job of giving us short fields, causing turnovers, getting off on third down, hanging in there, keeping it close enough so that we could get back in it."

On that first touchdown to Brandon, what was the look you guys got there and what can you say about the catch that Brandon made there?

Cutler: "It was a great catch. I'll let the man...he'll walk you through it a little bit better than I will. I think he made it harder than it needed to be on purpose so that he could get the good catch."

How tough was it when you took that hit to get your composure back?

Cutler: "It just knocked the wind out of me so it was just a matter of enough time to get my wind back. Trest [head coach Marc Trestman] understands that kind of stuff so he called a run play and then we were back to business."

How were they playing your receivers outside early on?

Cutler: "They were mixing it up. They were sitting on our stuff. Eight, 10, 12 yards they were kind of sitting out there, showing a shell, matching up underneath – they had a good game plan."

Was there any challenge trying to get a feel for WR Brandon Marshall and WR Alshon Jeffery not knowing if they were going to be at full strength?

Cutler: "No. I knew if they were going to go, we were going to be fine. I've worked with those guys enough that it's like riding a bike."

How much of a steadying influence is it to have them in there?

Cutler: "It's huge. It's night and day. It was a long week without those two out there."

Did you feel a real difference in the second half in the way you guys were clicking? It looked a lot different.

Cutler: "Yes and no. The defense was causing turnovers, we had some short fields there, we had a few big plays. The film, it's going to be a little bit different from the first half to the second half, but the defense set us up nicely, I think."

Brandon, what does it say about the team being down 17-0 and scoring three times in the second half?

Marshall: "Yeah, I think Coach Trestman said it best: it's tough being in games like this, but what happens is it builds character, it builds a stronger backbone. We're going to need it with the schedule that we have and what we're trying to accomplish. It's tough to be in that situation but I think we grew a lot tonight."

Can you take us through the first touchdown catch?

Marshall: "What Jay said is that I would've made it easier for myself if I stayed outside, but I went inside. Once I saw one-high I felt the ball coming my way, and when it was in the air I just threw my hand out there and stuck."

You said in the beginning of the week that you were playing this week. How close did that come to not happening?

Marshall: "It came probably an hour and a half before the game. Friday we tried to give it a go and it didn't feel great. I just tried to stay positive and speak positive things into existence. I knew once I got to the game if I could at least jog, adrenaline will kick in and I would be able to run a little bit."

That power of positive thinking, that really works for you, doesn't it?

Marshall: "Yeah, I really believe in it. I really believe we can speak life and we can speak death, and all week I was speaking life and healing on my leg. I just wanted to at least go out there and pull some coverage for guys. I just didn't want to let our guys go out there and be by themselves. Those guys are more than capable. We believed in them. Jay was positive all week and was getting those guys rolling – he had some of our young guy just writing scripts out all night and all day – so those they were ready to go if we weren't."

How did you guys break through from the first to the second half? It seemed like they were really on you guys.

Marshall: "It's one play, it's one drive at a time. I think it's a trickle-down effect of Coach Trestman's poise; it doesn't matter if we're winning or we're losing, his demeanor is the same. Jay, you guys know, he has no emotion, so when you see our leaders poised and their hands steady, everyone else is kind of calm. We just stayed in it and believed that if we could just get in the end zone once, we'd be able to build off that."

Were you frustrated early on?

Marshall: "Yeah, I was really frustrated. I tried to stay positive and it worked.

What was the energy shift for you guys as the defense started to get the ball back and get sacks?

Cutler: "They were playing well in the first half, too. We just had to stay positive and hopefully they kept playing well in the second half and we could get a little rhythm going. We picked up the pace a little bit in the third quarter and no-huddled a little bit and moved the ball some. And then short fields, any time you have short fields and you're creating turnovers, it's going to have a negative effect on your team. That's what our defense was able to do and whenever we're able to capitalize on turnovers, that's hard to overcome."

What did you think when Jay took that big hit and came back?

Marshall. "I said that in the locker room. That's old news for us. I've been around Jay for a long time and I remember a couple years ago him getting criticized pretty heavily for not coming back into the game, but he's one of the toughest guys I know. But you guys won't understand that because whether it's good or bad, his posture, his demeanor is the same. For me, it was just like, 'Okay, get up and let's roll."

Jay, talking about the defense and how well they did, they've been maligned at times. S Chris Conte, who's kind of been beat up around this city for a while, makes a diving pick. For them to step up like this on the road, what does that mean?

Cutler: "I mean, today I think anyone is looking to beat up anybody in the press. In the locker room, we stick together, we know those guys can play. I think [Bears general manager] Phil [Emery] did a good job of bringing in guys to help that defense. The defensive line is better which is going to help the secondary, that's just how it goes in this league. When the offensive line gets better it's going to help the quarterback, the running back and the receivers. It starts up front and whenever we're improving up there you're going to see an effect on the back end."

What did you think of CB Kyle Fuller's game today?

Cutler: "We knew it since day one. Day one he came out there and he was manning up B [Brandon Marshall] and Alshon--."

Marshall: "Relax."

Cutler: "You could tell he could play. They were getting him, but you could tell he was going to be really good in this league."

Marshall: "Going back to my rookie year, [Ravens OLB] Elvis Dumervil came to me after one of our training camp practices and said, 'Man, [free agent CB] Champ Bailey is in there watching you in one-on-ones,' because I beat him pretty bad. He was basically studying, and for Kyle Fuller I had to do that this training camp. I had to go in there in the Weber Center and just watch what he was doing because he surprised us. I told him it's not about starting, it's not about making the Pro Bowl, for him, he needs to have Hall of Fame on his brain because that kid can play."

What specifically does he have in his skill-set that strikes you?

Marshall: "He has no fear. There's no wide receiver, there's no moment that's bigger than him. He has a great skill-set, but better yet, his attitude is amazing and his approach to the game is amazing." Cutler: "I think you would think he's been in the league five or six years. Just the way he carries himself, it's fun to watch him."

How much of a boost is this type of a win?

Cutler: "It's hard to win every week, especially on the road. We knew they were going to be amped up with opening up the new stadium and all of the Hall-of-Fame guys coming back. We just kind of had to weather the storm and we have to take a look at this film on Tuesday, break it down, and then we have to move on. We can't really dwell on this. There's a lot of football left, so we just have to kind of keep building on this and get better and better each week."

Did Coach Trestman have any message for you guys at halftime to get you guys going?

Cutler: "No. I mean, he says the same thing. He's not going to give us big motivational speeches because we don't need it. Those last for about one play and then it's over with, and then you're back to the rest of the guys in the huddle."

Marshall: "I think he asked, 'Are you guys OK?'

Cutler: "He sticks to the game plan and starts figuring out what we can do and trying to move the ball. It's cool to have him because he's level-headed and he's always working for us."

When CB Charles Tillman gets hurt and Conte gets hurt is it really easy to allow the sideline to get down? How do you fight against that?

Marshall: "I think the guys understand, especially the guys that have been around for a while, that's the NFL, it's next man up. The guys were excited when Alshon and I went down, in a positive way where it's next man up, and that's what Alshon and I were preaching all week. It's like, 'Listen, there's going to be no drop-off.' Same thing with the guards and [Bears G] Matt [Slauson], our up-front guys, guys understand that's why they're here. They get paid too and they're more than capable."

Cutler: "Our team is pretty deep, too. There's obviously a limit to depth, but we're pretty deep, I think."

Down 17-0, what made you guys think you could still come back and win this?

"Just how we got down. We had a blocked punt, we had some bad field position and we just kept fighting. We were +2 [on turnovers] at the half, and any time you're plus on the road, you're going to keep going. On the two long drives, that 17-play drive [in the first quarter] where we had a turnover, then the penalties, and then next thing you know, to hold that to a field goal and then to have that long drive to open the half and to be able to hold them to field goals there, that was huge for us. I think that right there gave us confidence that we could get the job done."

How about CB Kyle Fuller stepping up when CB Charles Tillman got hurt?

"That's huge. That's what guys have to do. Kyle played great, [DE] Willie [Young] played great. The guys that might not have been on the stat sheet tonight, there's a lot of guys that just did their job and were where they were supposed to be, forcing plays and that's how you beat teams like this. That's how you beat these read option teams with so many moving parts. Everybody has to be sound in their responsibilities."

After it seemed like so many guys on defense took scrutiny after last week's loss and took it personally, they played with an edge tonight. Would you agree?

"Yeah, we're trying to find our identity too, and this is a huge step to it. This is a new group playing together and we had a great week of practice. Sometimes some adversity can set you on the right path, and if we can keep this edge about us, we can play good defense all year."

You've played against CB Charles Tillman for a lot of years. If he's really hurt, how disappointing would it be?

"He's one of the reasons why I came here, having that corner. He's a great guy, he's a great teammate, he's very dependable and accountable. If we lose him, that's a huge blow, but you saw what [CB] Kyle [Fuller] did with this opportunity, and we're going to expect him to play at the level that we're accustomed to having out there, and his first test was a great one."

There was a lot of pressure on San Francisco's offense tonight by you guys. You forced them into four turnovers and a ton of penalties. Do you think you rattled them in the second half?

"We were able to be successful on first and second downs the majority of the game, and we were able to force them to get into some one-dimensional situations so we could dictate the pace. Even though [QB Colin] Kaepernick got out a couple times, we were able to control the rush for the most part, set high walls limiting his scrambling capabilities. You look at [DE] Willie [Young]'s two sacks, he beats a guy where the other sides are rush containing, and we took shots. We weren't conservative by any means, we took our shots at him. He got out a couple times, but everybody rallied."

You have been playing this game for a while, what kind of emotional lift is winning a game like this and coming from behind?

"It is kind of like when you think your girlfriend is about to break up with you, and then she changes her mind. That is what it feels like. These guys worked hard all week. I'm super excited to see guys have the chance to make plays and step up when we needed them to step up. That was a hard fought game. Our defense was great tonight. They forced a lot of turnovers, and our offense didn't turn the ball over once. We were able to come back in the second half. [WR] Brandon [Marshall] made some big plays; [WR] Alshon [Jeffrey] made a big play for us. We just kept fighting."

What was the biggest difference in the second half?

"We came into halftime, and looked at what was going on. We were really stopping ourselves. We came in and said we need to be monsters. We are the monsters of the midway. You look under the bed, and see this type of monster, no one is going to get scared. We wanted to be more like Sully and less like Mike from Monsters, Inc. Overall, everyone just came back out and battled."

You were targeted a lot early. Did you feel like you had an advantage over their linebackers tonight?

"I always feel like I have a matchup advantage. [LB] Patrick Willis is a hell of a player. I have a lot of respect for him and I knew it was going to be a challenge to get open on him. He is an excellent tackler, so I wanted to get up field a little bit more. I think I had 20 catches for 20 yards. Overall, I thought [QB] Jay [Cutler] trusted me a lot to make plays. If something is going on with the receivers, I know all our coaches and our defense look to me to make plays and I always try and come through for them."

Can you talk about the offensive line giving Jay the time he needed to make plays?

"[C] Brian de la Puente did a great job stepping up. [T/G] Michael Ola did a great job stepping up. Kyle Long as well. Those guys fought there asses off all game. They have a great defensive line, so being able to keep Jay upright as much as we did was excellent. Jay's arm can do the rest if we can keep the defenders off of him."

Can you talk about Cutler's composure during the comeback?

"Jay kept telling us we were still in it. He did a great job of controlling the emotions of each player on offense. We have a fiery bunch, and everyone wants to make a play. He did a great job with the coaches worrying about the next drive and not what just happened. When your quarterback does that, then everyone does. He just gets you ready for the next drive. He did a great job with the next play mentality."

"It's emotional just to be in special situations. To have the man next to you stand up and make plays especially when we need them."

Why were you guys playing with such an edge?

"We are built that way. These are the kind of guys the coaches brought in, and that is the kind of guys we are going to be. None of us have the history of being pushovers or push arounds. We're going to ball until we fall."

You forced them into four turnovers; they had a flock of penalties obviously. Did you rattle them, especially in the second half?

"I am not going to take anything away from our defense, or our unity as a team, because we got the win. But that is a great team over there, I take nothing from them. You just never know; any given Sunday. Much respect to the 49ers though."
