## WEEK 7 AT 49ERS

### SERIES HISTORY

Sunday night marks the 81st meeting between the Atlanta Falcons and San Francisco 49ers. The 49ers have a 47-32-1 record over the Falcons in a series dating back to 1966. This also marks the Falcons' second *Sunday Night Football* appearance as they defeated the Minnesota Vikings this season in Week 2 with a final score of 22-6.

### TOP CONNECTIONS

#### NOTABLE PRO CONNECTIONS

Falcons Defensive Coordinator **Jeff Ulbrich** was drafted by the 49ers in the third round (86th overall) of the 2000 NFL Draft out of Hawaii. In 10 seasons, Ulbrich saw action in 120 games (75 starts).

49ers Head Coach **Kyle Shanahan** served as the offensive coordinator for the Falcons for two seasons (2015-16).

Falcons Defensive Pass Game Coordinator **Mike Rutenberg** served as the passing game specialist for the 49ers for one season (2020).

Falcons **EDGE Leonard Floyd** started 17 games for the 49ers in 2024.

Atlanta Falcons

### LEADING THE LEAGUE

Atlanta's defense leads the NFL in yards allowed per game and passing yards allowed per game, while also ranking first on offense in rushing yards per game and second in total yards per game. The Falcons are the only team in the NFL to rank in the top five in both total defense and total offense.

**RB Bijan Robinson** has 822 scrimmage yards through five games this season. If he records at least **178** scrimmage yards Sunday, he would join **RB Marshall Faulk** (1,083) in 2000 as the only players this century to surpass 1,000 scrimmage yards through the first six games of a season. If he records at least **78** scrimmage yards vs. San Francisco, he would become the first player since **Derrick Henry** in 2021 to surpass 900 scrimmage yards through six games.

Atlanta's defense leads the NFL in opp. third-and-one conversions, allowing just two conversions on eight attempts for a 25.0% conversion rate, compared to the league average of 68.5%.



### DYNAMIC DUO

For just the second time in franchise history, Atlanta had a player total 150-or-more rushing yards (RB Bijan Robinson - 170) and another player record 150-or-more receiving yards (WR Drake London - 157) in a single game, joining only themselves in Week 18 of last season. Robinson and London are one of just two duos (De'Von Achane and Tyreek Hill) to accomplish the feat in multiple games since the 1970 AFL/NFL

#### STARTING OFF HOT

In the Week 6 victory over Buffalo, Atlanta's offense generated 335 yards in the first half, the most of any team in a half this season and the most by the Falcons in a first half since 2009. The Falcons are the second team in the last five seasons to have 150+ passing yards and 150+ rushing yards in the first half (Seattle in Week 18 of the 2021 season).

In Week 6, WR **Drake London** logged 10 receptions for 158 yards and a touchdown, including a career-best 64 receiving yards in the first quarter. It marked his eighth-career game with 100 yards and his fourth with at least 150 yards. His four games of at least 150 receiving yards tie Julio Jones and Andre Rison for the franchise record of such games in a player's first four seasons.

#### TO INFINITY AND BIJAN

RB **Bijan Robinson** is up to 822 scrimmage yards this season, the fourth most by any player through a team's first five games of a season in the Super Bowl era. Robinson is averaging 127.1 scrimmage yards per game in prime-time matchups, most among active players (min. five prime-time games).

There have been 28 instances in NFL history of a player having multiple 100-yard rushing games and multiple 100-yard receiving games in the same season, including Bijan Robinson this year. Of those 28, only two have done so within the team's first five games of a season: Robinson and Buffalo's Thurman Thomas in 1991.

#### IRONMAN MATTHEWS

Dating back to 1991, T **Jake Matthews** has started 183 consecutive regular-season games at left tackle for Atlanta, the 13th longest streak in the NFL as well as the third-most among offensive linemen.

#### BUILDING A BRICK' WALL

The Falcons are the only team in the NFL to hold opposing offenses to under 300 yards in every game this season, giving the franchise its longest streak (five games) of holding opponents under 300 yards since 1998 (Weeks 12-16). Atlanta is also one of two teams (Minnesota) that has not allowed a 200-yard passer this season.


#### BRINGING THE PRESSURE

The Falcons have totaled 14 sacks so far this season, Atlanta's most through five games since 2005. The Falcons also generated a 44.1% pressure rate in Week 6 vs. Buffalo, the highest pressure rate Josh Allen had faced in a game since Week 5, 2024. Entering Week 6, Buffalo had allowed a league-low 22.3% pressure rate (Next Gen Stats).



## OFFENSE



### QUARTERBACKS (2)

#### 9 Michael Penix Jr. 2nd season Washington

Finished Week 6 20-of-32 for 250 yards and one touchdown for a passer rating of 97.1, the second-best rating of his career...Became the second Falcons quarterback all-time to have 300+ pass yards, a 75% completion percentage, and two touchdown passes in a single game in Week 4...Has completed 98-of-157 passes for 1,168 yards (62.4%), four touchdowns and three interceptions for a passer rating of 85.6 through the first six weeks of the season...Completed 27-of-42 passes for 298 yards and one touchdown for a passer rating of 93.2 in Week 1...He also rushed six times for 21 yards and a touchdown...Appeared in five games (three starts) his rookie season, completing 61-of-105 passes for 775 yards, three touchdowns and three interceptions for a 78.9 passer rating...Also recorded seven rushes for 11 yards.

#### 18 Kirk Cousins 14th season Michigan State

Has appeared in 165 regular-season games (159 starts), completing 3,773-of-5,637 passes (66.9 %) for 43,008 yards, 288 passing touchdowns and 126 interceptions for a passer rating of 97.4...Has also totaled 327 carries for 958 rushing yards and 19 rushing touchdowns over 14 seasons (2012-25) for the Commanders, Vikings and Falcons.

### RUNNING BACKS (3)

#### 7 Bijan Robinson 3rd season Texas

Totaled a career-best 238 yards from scrimmage, a career-best 170 rushing and 68 receiving, the most scrimmage yards by a running back on Monday Night Football since 1986 (Joe Morris) in Week 6...Notched an 81-yard rushing touchdown in Week 6, the longest rush of his career and the longest rush of any player in the NFL this season...The run boosted his average rush as he finished the night with a career-best average of 9.0 yards per rush...Became the second player to reach 450 rushing yards and 300 receiving yards through the first five games of a season in NFL history, joining Thurman Thomas in 1991...Earned NFC Offensive Player of the Month honors after notching 181 yards from scrimmage in Week 4...Week 6 marked his 23rd career game with at least 100 yards from scrimmage, which leads the NFL since he joined in 2023...His 90-plus scrimmage yards in 11 consecutive games is the longest active streak in the NFL...His 584 scrimmage yards through four games were the second-most yards from scrimmage in that span in franchise history...Finished the Week 2 game with 22 carries for 143 yards (6.5 avg.) and a long of 25 yards, in addition to three catches for 25 yards...His 168 scrimmage yards in Week 2 helped him become the first Falcon to have 120+ scrimmage yards in each of his first two games of a season since 2015...Notched 124 scrimmage yards against the Bucs in Week 1...Also scored a 50-yard receiving touchdown, the second 50-plus yard touchdown reception of his career...Has appeared in 39 games (38 starts) and recorded 582 carries for 2,746 yards and 19 rushing touchdowns, along with 137 receptions for 1,188 yards and six touchdowns for the Falcons.

#### 25 Tyler Allgeier 4th season Brigham Young

Powered his way into the endzone with a 21-yard touchdown run on the Falcons opening drive in Week 6, marking the first time in his career he has recorded a rushing touchdown in consecutive games...Notched the 12th rushing touchdown of his career in Week 4...Carried the ball 16 times for 76 yards and scored the game's lone touchdown in Week 2...Has appeared in 55 games (11 starts) and totaled 586 carries for 2,549 yards (4.3 avg.) and 13 rushing touchdowns, in addition to tallying 50 receptions for 430 yards and two receiving touchdowns over four seasons for the Falcons.

#### 38 Nathan Carter Rookie Michigan State

Recorded the first carry of his career in Week 3, finishing the contest with seven carries for 46 yards (6.6 avg.) and a long of 10 yards...Made his NFL debut in Week 2 against the Vikings...Rushed for 1,297 yards (4.3 avg.; 54.0 ypc) and nine touchdowns on 301 carries in 24 games, including 22 starts, during two seasons at Michigan State (2023-24).

### WIDE RECEIVERS (7)

#### 1 Darnell Mooney 6th season Tulane

Has appeared in 79 games (68 starts), tallying 284 receptions for 3,664 yards and 16 receiving touchdowns, in addition to 13 rushes for 59 yards and one rushing touchdown over five seasons for the Chicago Bears (2020-23) and the Falcons (2024-25).

#### 4 KhaDarel Hodge 8th season Prairie View A&M

Has seen action in 110 games (nine starts), totaling 64 receptions for 995 yards (15.5 avg.) and three touchdowns, two on offense and one on special teams for the Rams (2018), Browns (2019-20), Lions (2021) and Falcons (2022-25)...Named to the 2024 Pro Bowl Games.

#### 5 Drake London 4th season Southern California

Returned two kicks for 57 yards and two punts for 29 yards in his Falcons debut...Appeared in 84 games (five starts) in seven NFL seasons with the Detroit Lions (2017-20) and Jacksonville Jaguars (2021-23), totaling 77 receptions for 746 yards and five touchdowns...Has returned five kickoffs for 126 yards (25.2 avg.) through Week 4 of the 2025 season...One of four players in NFL history to record at least one rushing touchdown, one

receiving touchdown, one kick return touchdown and one field goal return touchdown during their career.

#### **34 Ray-Ray McCloud III 8th season Clemson**

Has totaled 158 receptions for 1,518 yards (9.6 avg.) and two touchdowns, in addition to 25 carries for 271 yards (10.8 avg.) and one touchdown over eight seasons for the Bills (2018), Panthers (2019), Steelers (2020-21), 49ers (2022-23) and Falcons (2024-25).

#### **87 David Sills V 4th season West Virginia**

Notched his first reception as a Falcon in Week 3 for nine yards...Has appeared in 21 games (seven starts) and recorded 14 receptions for 132 yards.

Has totaled four receptions for 52 yards (13.0 avg.) in two games in 2025...Notched three receptions for 33 yards with a career-long reception of 19 yards in his first career start in Week 1...Appeared in eight games for the Falcons in 2024 and recorded one reception for 14 yards vs. Seattle.

# ARTHUR M. BLANK

## Owner and Chairman

Atlanta Falcons

Perhaps best known as co-founder of The Home Depot, Arthur M. Blank is now widely recognized for his diverse businesses. Recipient of the 2024 Sports Business Journal's Lifetime Achievement Award for his immense industry impact and named by ESPN as the 2021 Sports Philanthropist of the Year, Blank is a tireless advocate of using purpose and profit hand-in-hand to benefit the communities around him.

In addition to the Atlanta Falcons, Blank's portfolio of businesses includes AMB Sports and Entertainment, Mercedes-Benz Stadium, Atlanta United, PGA TOUR Superstore, Atlanta Drive GC, AMB West and the Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation.

### Atlanta Falcons Ring of Honor

In 2024, Blank was enshrined as the 13th member of the Atlanta Falcons Ring of Honor. Blank has made his mark as a renowned steward of the franchise. As a leadership voice in the incredible growth of the NFL over the last two decades, Blank has also championed using the Falcons and NFL platforms to grow youth football, support America's military and build community in Atlanta.

Blank's journey to Falcons' ownership started as a fan, then as a believer, in what was possible for the city of Atlanta and the Atlanta Falcons. After purchasing the team in 2002, results on and off the field elevated, and Blank's unwavering dedication to the franchise, its fans and the city of Atlanta brought stability and a renewed vision to the Atlanta Falcons that has stood the test of time.

Blank raised the bar and level of expectation for the Falcons and quickly became a trusted leadership voice within the National Football League. The Blank Family Foundation and the Atlanta Falcons consistently work to leave a positive imprint on the city of Atlanta and its broader community, including its commitment to youth and girls flag football, and helping to revitalize the neighborhoods surrounding MBS.

Under Blank's leadership, the Falcons have earned eight postseason berths, including trips to the NFC Championship Game in 2004, 2012 and 2016, three NFC South Division crowns and a trip to Super Bowl LI. In 2010 and 2012, the Falcons posted NFC-best 13-3 records. Atlanta's winning percentage has been raised significantly under Blank's ownership, climbing over .500 since 2002 after sitting at just .394 in the club's first 35 years of existence.

### Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation

The Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation was founded in 1995 to help transform lives and communities by uniting people across differences to find common cause. With more than \$1.5 billion in giving history, the success of the Atlanta Falcons has allowed the Blank Family Foundation the opportunity and platform to pour into the surrounding communities through substantial grants over the years, contributing to significant projects and initiatives.

Examples include a \$200 million donation to Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, the largest donation in Children's Healthcare of Atlanta history, with the goal to provide a world-class facility to improve quality of care, patient experience and access to specialized pediatric healthcare for Georgia's children and families, and more than \$20 million to the National Center for Civil and Human Rights in downtown Atlanta to educate people on the American Civil Rights Movement and the struggle for human rights locally and globally today.

### FAN FRIENDLY PRICING

Blank redefined the global stadium food and beverage experience with Mercedes-Benz Stadium's innovative, fan-first pricing, recognized by SBJ as the 2018 Sports Breakthrough of the Year, followed by a No. 1 rating in the NFL Voice of the Fan survey, which the team has maintained in that category every year since.

### Arthur M. Blank Hospital

In 2024, Children's Healthcare of Atlanta opened the doors of Arthur M. Blank Hospital. The new 19-story, two-million-square-foot facility is the largest healthcare project in the history of Georgia and was made possible by a \$200 million donation from the Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation.





# **MERCEDES-BENZ STADIUM**

## MERCEDES-BENZ STADIUM

This year marks the ninth season of Falcons football at Mercedes-Benz Stadium (MBS). In that time, MBS and its leadership have proven to be game changers in the sport and entertainment industry.

When Arthur M. Blank set out to build MBS, his vision was to create a world-class venue that would ensure the city remained a permanent contender in attracting the world's largest sport and entertainment events, as well as catalyze positive transformation in and around downtown Atlanta. Nine years later, that vision has become a reality.

Named the 2019 Sports Business Journal Sports Facility of the Year, voted number one for best NFL Stadium Food and number two for Best NFL Stadium in the Readers' Choice Awards by USA Today 10Best. MBS has achieved many industry firsts since its establishment: MBS has achieved many industry firsts since its establishment:

- First professional sports stadium in North America to achieve LEED Platinum certification
- First stadium to achieve TRUE Platinum Certification for Zero Waste
- First sports and entertainment venue globally to achieve LEED Zero Waste certification in any category
- First professional sports stadium to offer fan-friendly pricing
- First professional sports stadium to implement a cashless model
- First and only roof of its kind in the world
- First professional sports stadium to leverage a 360-degree digital halo board



### EVENTS

MBS has become one of the busiest stadiums in North America, hosting 50 major events on average, three million guests and over 100 private events annually. Over the past eight years, the venue has hosted a variety of sporting and entertainment events in addition to numerous Atlanta Falcons games, Atlanta United matches and concerts from A-list artists such as The Rolling Stones, Beyoncé, Luke Combs, Taylor Swift, George Strait, Coldplay, Ed Sheeran and more. This summer, MBS will host the 2026 FIFA World Cup for eight matches including a semifinal. In 2024, MBS became the first stadium to repeat as host of the College Football Playoff National Championship Game. MBS will host Super Bowl LXXII in 2028, the second time that Mercedes-Benz Stadium has hosted the Super Bowl (2019) and the NCAA Men's Final Four in 2031.

### SUSTAINABILITY

Since its inauguration in 2017, MBS has been leading the charge in sustainable practices within the sports industry. The two-million-square-foot building has set a new standard, becoming the first professional sports venue in North America to achieve the United States Green Building Council's LEED Platinum certification, as well as the LEED Zero Waste certification. In 2022, MBS became the first professional sports stadium globally to achieve TRUE Platinum Certification for Zero Waste. From water conservation measures, energy optimization, and alternative transportation initiatives to urban gardening and agriculture programs, MBS is dedicated to exploring new avenues for reducing our environmental impact.



### INNOVATION

MBS is actively leveraging fan feedback to enhance the overall stadium experience by utilizing cutting-edge technological innovations. In 2022, the stadium implemented Delta Fly Through Lanes, which offer touchless entry, allowing fans to access the stadium and premium clubs using facial authentication technology. MBS has also revolutionized the concession process with four check-out free marketplaces that allow fans to quickly grab food or drink without spending time in lines. Most recently, the stadium launched Spirited, an enhanced beverage experience, where fans can use facial recognition to purchase a cocktail through a self-serve cocktail machine without retrieving a credit card or identification.

### COMMUNITY

The Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation is working to increase economic mobility for legacy residents in Atlanta's Westside, the community that is home to MBS. While the foundation has an enduring commitment to the Westside, over the next seven years, the foundation's work will focus on affordable housing and financial security. The foundation's total Westside financial commitment since 2007 exceeds \$107 million. Adjacent to MBS is The Home Depot Backyard (HDBY), an award-winning 11-acre green space. The HDBY provides a variety of community programming and events while serving as the premier parking and tailgating destination for the Atlanta Falcons, Atlanta United, and other stadium events. The space aims to give back to the community by providing cultural and enriching opportunities for continued learning and enhancement.
