## CMC, CATCH

- Through Week 2, RB Christian McCaffrey has registered 35 carries for 124 yds. on the ground to go along with 15 recepts. for 125 yds. and 1 TD through the air.
- In each of the first 2 games of the season, McCaffrey has tallied 50-or-more rushing yds. and 50-or-more rec. yds., which leads all NFL players.
- With 50-or-more rushing yds. and 50-or-more rec. yds. this week vs. Arz. (9/21/25), McCaffrey would become the first 49ers player since at least 1950 to register 50-or-more rushing yds. and 50-or-more rec. yds. in the each of the first 3 weeks of a season.
- McCaffrey would also become the first NFL player to accomplish the feat since HOF RB Marshall Faulk in 2000.

- DL Nick Bosa has registered 15 tackles, 2.0 sacks, 1 FF and 1 FR in 2025. His 2.0 sacks this season give him 64.5 in his career, which are the 3rd-most sacks in franchise history (sacks became an official statistic in 1982).
- With 2.0-or-more sacks this week vs. Arz. (9/21/25), Bosa would tie or surpass HOF DL Charles Haley for the 2nd-most sacks by a 49ers player in franchise history.
- With 1.0-or-more sacks this week vs. Arz. (9/21/25), Bosa would become the first 49ers player to register 1.0-ormore sacks in Weeks 1-3 since he accomplished the feat in 2022 [1.0 sack Week 1 at Chi. (9/11/22); 2.0 sacks Week 2 vs. Sea. (9/18/22); 1.0 sack Week 3 at Den. (9/25/22)].

LB Fred Warner was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week (Week 2) after registering 11 tackles, 1 PD, 1 FF and 1 FR at NO (9/14/25). This marks his 4th career DPOW award (Week 12, 2019; Week 16, 2020; Week 5, 2023).



- Warner's 11 tackles, 1 PD, 1 FF and 1 FR made him the first player in the NFL to register 10-or-more tackles, 1-or-more PDs, 1-or-more FFs and 1-or-more FRs in a single game since he accomplished the feat in 2020 [14 tackles, 3 PDs, 1 FF & 1 FR at Arz. (12/26/20)].
- Warner's FF vs. NO (9/14/25) marked his first of the season and the 16th of his career. With 1-ormore FFs this week vs. Arz. (9/21/25). Warner would break the tie with HOF LB Patrick Willis for the most FFs by a 49ers player since FFs became an official statistic in 1994

### TUS FOR TIGHT ENDS \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

- Through the first 2 games of the 2025 season, the 49ers have had 3 different TEs register a TD. recept. [TE George Kittle, 5-yd. TD at Sea. (9/7/25); TE Jake Tonges, 4-yd. TD at Sea. (9/7/25); TE Luke Farrell, 11-yd. TD at NO (9/14/25)], making them the only team in the NFL to have multiple TEs with 1-or-more TD recepts.
- With 3 TEs each registering a TD recept., it marks the 2nd time in franchise history that the 49ers have had 3-ormore TEs record at least 1 TD recept, in a single season (2020 - Kittle, TE Ross Dwelley & TE Jordan Reed)."
- It also makes the 49ers just the 2nd team since at least 1960 to have 3 different TEs register 1-or-more TD recepts. through the first 2 games of a season (1978 Miami Dolphins - TE Bruce Hardy, TE Loaird McCreary & TE Andre Tillman).
