2025 TRAINING CAMP

The San Francisco 49ers officially begin the 2025 season with the start of Training Camp presented by SAP.

San Francisco enters the 2025 season under President of Football Operations/General Manager John Lynch and head coach Kyle Shanahan, marking their ninth season leading the team.

Thursday, August 7: Ahead of the 49ers preseason matchup against the Denver Broncos, the teams will hold a joint practice at SAP Performance Facility. This marks the second time under President of Football Operations/General Manager John Lynch and head coach Kyle Shanahan's tenure that the 49ers will host the Broncos prior to their preseason matchup and the first time since the 2017 season.



Saturday, August 9: San Francisco hosts the Denver Broncos in the first preseason game of 2025 at Levi's Stadium at 5:30 p.m. PT.

Thursday, August 14: Ahead of the 49ers exhibition game against the Las Vegas Raiders, the teams will hold a joint practice at Intermountain Health Performance Center. This marks the second joint practice session with the Raiders in the last three seasons (2023).

Saturday, August 16: San Francisco takes on the Las Vegas Raiders in the second preseason matchup of 2025 at Allegiant Stadium at 1:00 p.m. PT.



Saturday, August 23: San Francisco returns to Levi's Stadium to host the Los Angeles Chargers for the third and final preseason game of 2025 at 5:30 p.m. PT.



Tuesday, August 26: Roster cut-down to maximum of 53 players by 1 p.m. PT.

Wednesday, September 3: After 10 a.m. PT, clubs may establish a Practice Squad of 17 players.

September 4, 5, 7-8: Week 1 of the 2025 regular season opens as the 49ers travel to Lumen Field to take on the Seattle Seahawks on Sunday, September 7, at 1:05 p.m. PT.

MEDIA ACCESS & POLICIES

TRAINING CAMP MEDIA WRISTBANDS

- There will be no admittance without an official training camp media wristband. No guests are permitted to use media wristbands and are subject to revocation.
- Media wristbands can be acquired when checking into the stadium at the Toyota Gate F entrance.
- All media members must contact the 49ers communications department to be granted permission to attend training camp. A member of your outlet must email your requests to [Caleigh Elkin \(caleigh.elkin@49ers.com\)](mailto:caleigh.elkin@49ers.com).

49ERS MEDIA WORKROOM

- All attending media must park in the Yellow lots, enter through the Toyota Gate F entrance and check in with 49ers Security (See useful maps on following pages for specific directions).
- The 49ers communications department will provide head coach and coordinator transcripts as well as up-to-date rosters throughout training camp.

49ERS 2025 SINGLE-GAME CREDENTIALS

- Information on how to apply for single-game credentials can be found in the credentials tab of the 49ers media website (<https://49ers.1rmg.com/media-credentials-information/>)
- The deadline to apply for single-game credentials is **5:00 p.m. PT 5 days prior to the requested game.**

PRACTICE REGULATIONS

- Only media regularly covering the 49ers will be allowed to attend the open portions of practice. If a media member from outside the local area wishes to attend practice it is subject to approval from the 49ers communications department.
- For practices held at the SAP Performance Facility, media are instructed to remain on the extreme sideline perimeter of all of the grass practice fields at all times. Media are not permitted to stand behind the end zones and **must remain at least 15-yards away from any drills or workouts occurring on the sidelines for safety reasons.**
- All media are **prohibited from quoting, broadcasting or posting on social media the dialogue between coaches, players and staff, including all medical personnel.** No member of the media is allowed at any time to initiate a conversation with a player, coach or football staff during practice that would distract them from doing their job.

- **As has been team policy, and in accordance with NFL regulations, media cannot report on strategic and tactical information (i.e. formations, a unique position where a player is lining up and specific plays run, trick plays, etc.). Specifically, reports on player participation with respect to individual units (first-team, second-team) should be based on general observations. Quantifying players' individual repetitions or description of personnel groupings/sub-packages (nickel defense, goal line unit, etc.,) is strictly prohibited. Generally, any information that could help an opponent prepare to play the 49ers is off limits. Strategy is defined by the head coach.**
- Rather than immediately posting speculation on topics such as why a player may not be practicing or an injury that occurs during practice, the media are asked to consult a member of the 49ers football communications staff for accurate information before posting.

CAMERA POLICY

- Media are only allowed to record video and photographs during the designated filming period at the beginning of practice. This policy includes content collected via personal mobile devices.
- For safety reasons, tripods are not recommended on the practice fields during the allotted filming period. Instead, monopods are encouraged to be used during practice.
- When a player incurs an injury on the practice field, still and video photography of the player is to halt immediately. Cameras are directed not to film or photograph any player being treated by the medical staff.

CELL PHONE POLICY

- All members of the media must turn their cell phones to vibrate while attending practice. Media are not permitted to conduct phone conversations from the practice fields.

LIVE BROADCASTING POLICY

- Media are not permitted to live broadcast any 49ers media availabilities, practice sessions or team events without prior written approval from the 49ers football communications department, including the use of social media applications with live streaming functionality.
- Please direct all live requests to the Executive Vice President of Communications, **Corry Rush** (corry@49ers.com) at least 24 hours in advance.

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

- Media are not permitted to post on any social media platforms from the practice fields.
- Media are permitted to post video or photos from the open camera period only once they have left the practice fields. As we instruct all media not to quote or broadcast the dialogue between coaches, staff and players, the same rule applies for all social media posts.

Failure to adhere to the conditions could result in suspension/loss of credentials for members of the media.

KNOW YOUR OPPONENT

The 49ers will face the NFC South and AFC South in cross-divisional play, while continuing to battle their NFC West opponents twice a year. San Francisco will also host the Chicago Bears (Week 17) and visit the New York Giants (Week 9) and Cleveland Browns (Week 13). The Niners open the regular season on the road as they visit the Seattle Seahawks. The team is scheduled to play in five prime time games during the regular season, including three at home, with two on Monday night (Week 12 vs. Carolina & Week 16 at Indianapolis), two on Sunday night (Week 7 vs. Atlanta & Week 17 vs. Chicago) and one on Thursday night (Week 5 at Los Angeles Rams).



WEEK 1 - SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 7 **AT SEATTLE - 1:05 P.M.**



- San Francisco opens the season against Seattle for the third time in series history and for the first time since the 2011 season [W, 33-17 vs. Sea. (9/11/11)].
- The 49ers are 23-31 all-time against the Seahawks, including an 11-17 record on the road.
- The Niners look for their fourth-consecutive victory at Lumen Field, which would mark the longest road winning streak against the Seahawks in series history.



WEEK 2 - SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 14 **AT NEW ORLEANS - 10:00 A.M.**



- San Francisco owns the overall series record against New Orleans 50-27-2, including a 26-15 record on the road.
- The Niners have won four of the previous seven regular season matchups between the two teams, including the last time they met in the 2022 season [W, 13-0 vs. NO (11/27/22)].
- The 49ers travel to New Orleans for the first time since the 2020 season and look to earn their first win at Caesars Superdome since their 48-46 victory against the Saints in 2019.



WEEK 3 - SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 21 **VS. ARIZONA CARDINALS - 1:25 P.M.**



- San Francisco owns the overall series record vs. Arizona 36-31, including a 20-15 record at home.
- The Niners have won two of their last three matchups against the Cardinals at Levi's Stadium.
- The 49ers look for their first home victory against the Cardinals since the 2023 season [W, 35-16 vs. Arz. (10/1/23)].
- San Francisco looks for their fourth-consecutive victory in the home opener.



WEEK 4 - SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 28 **VS. JACKSONVILLE - 1:05 P.M.**



- San Francisco leads the all-time series against Jacksonville, 5-2, including a 2-0 record at home.
- The 49ers have won each of the previous five matchups against the Jaguars.
- San Francisco hosts Jacksonville at Levi's Stadium for the first time since the 2017 season, when they defeated the Jaguars 44-33 [vs. Jax. (12/24/17)].



WEEK 5 - THURSDAY, OCTOBER 2 **AT LOS ANGELES RAMS - 5:15 P.M.**



- San Francisco owns the overall series record vs. the Los Angeles Rams, 78-71-3, including a 40-35-1 record on the road.
- The Niners will face the Rams on *Thursday Night Football* for the fifth time in series history and for the first time in consecutive seasons.
- The 49ers will play at SoFi Stadium on *TNF* for the first time.
- The 49ers have won seven of the last nine regular season matchups on the road against the Rams since their return to Los Angeles in 2016.



WEEK 6 - SUNDAY, OCTOBER 12 **AT TAMPA BAY - 10:00 A.M.**



- San Francisco leads the all-time series against Tampa Bay 21-7, including a 7-4 record on the road.
- San Francisco will play Tampa Bay in the regular season for the fourth-consecutive season for the first time since the 1977-1980 seasons.
- The 49ers visit the Buccaneers in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 2018 and 2019 seasons and look for their fifth-consecutive victory against the team.
- The Niners have won seven of the last 10 meetings between the two teams.



WEEK 7 - SUNDAY, OCTOBER 19 **VS. ATLANTA - 5:20 P.M.**



- San Francisco leads the all-time series against Atlanta, 48-33-1, including a 29-12 record at home.
- It marks the first time the 49ers have hosted the Falcons since the 2021 season [W, 31-13 vs. Atl. (12/19/21)].
- The 49ers face the Falcons on *Sunday Night Football* for the second time in series history (12/19/82).
- The 49ers are 4-2 against the Falcons in prime time, with their most recent victory coming in the 2013 season [W, 34-24 vs. Atl. (12/23/13)].
- The Niners have won three of their previous five home games against the Falcons.



WEEK 8 - SUNDAY, OCTOBER 26 **AT HOUSTON - 10:00 A.M.**



- San Francisco is 4-1 all-time against the Houston Texans, including a 1-1 record on the road.
- The 49ers look to earn their fourth-consecutive victory against the Texans and the first since defeating the Texans 23-7 at Levi's Stadium on January 2, 2022.
- The Niners will visit NRG Stadium for the first time since the 2017 season when they earned a 26-16 victory against the Texans [at Hou. (12/10/17)].



WEEK 9 - SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 2 **AT NEW YORK GIANTS - 10:00 A.M.**



- San Francisco is 22-21 all-time against the New York Giants with a 9-11 record on the road.
- The Niners will face the Giants in the regular season for the first time since 2023 [W, 30-12 vs. NYG (9/21/23)].
- The 49ers look to earn their third-consecutive overall victory against the Giants and their second-consecutive road win after beating the Giants on their last trip to New York in 2020, 36-9 [at NYG (9/27/20)].

WEEK 10 – SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 9 VS. LOS ANGELES RAMS - 1:25 P.M.



- San Francisco owns a 38-36-2 record at home against the Los Angeles Rams.
- The 49ers are 9-3 in the previous 12 regular season matchups between the two teams.
- The Niners have won four of their last six home games against the Rams.



WEEK 11 – SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 16 AT ARIZONA - 1:05 P.M.



- San Francisco is 16-16 when on the road against Arizona.
- The Niners have won four of the previous six road games against the Cardinals.
- San Francisco looks to earn a victory at State Farm Stadium for the first time since their 45-29 victory against the team in 2023 [at Arz. (12/17/23)].



WEEK 12 – MONDAY, NOVEMBER 24 VS. CAROLINA - 5:15 P.M.



- San Francisco is 10-13 in the all-time series vs. Carolina, including a 4-7 mark at home.
- The 49ers will host the Panthers at Levi's Stadium for the first time since the 2019 season [W, 51-13 vs. Car. (10/27/19)].
- The Niners will face the Panthers on *Monday Night Football* for the second time in series history [W, 34-21 at Car. (9/29/97)].
- The 49ers are 2-0 when facing the Panthers in prime time.
- San Francisco's 53 wins on *Monday Night Football* are the second-most wins on MNF in NFL history.



WEEK 13 – SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 30 AT CLEVELAND - 10:00 A.M.



- San Francisco is 8-13 all-time against Cleveland and 2-8 on the road.
- The 49ers are looking for their first road win against Cleveland since the 1984 season, when they defeated the Browns 41-7 [at Cle. (11/11/84)].
- The two teams have split the previous four meetings.



WEEK 14 – SUNDAY, DECEMBER 7 - BYE



- This marks the first time since BYE Weeks were introduced in 1990 that the 49ers have had their BYE Week in Week 14.



WEEK 15 – SUNDAY, DECEMBER 14 VS. TENNESSEE - 1:25 P.M.



- San Francisco is 9-6 in the all-time series vs. Tennessee, including a 4-3 record at home.
- The Niners have won six of the previous 10 matchups against the Titans.
- The 49ers host the Titans at Levi's Stadium for the second time and the first since the 2017 season [W, 25-23 vs. Ten. (12/17/17)].
- San Francisco is looking for their fourth-consecutive victory coming off the BYE Week.



WEEK 16 – MONDAY, DECEMBER 22 AT INDIANAPOLIS - 5:15 P.M.



- San Francisco is 18-27 all-time against Indianapolis, including a 7-15 mark on the road.
- The Niners will face the Colts in prime time for the second time in franchise history and the first since October 24, 2021.
- San Francisco will travel to Indianapolis for the first time since the 2017 season and look to earn their first road victory since defeating the Colts, 40-21, at Lucas Oil Stadium (11/25/01).



WEEK 17 – SUNDAY, DECEMBER 28 VS. CHICAGO - 5:20 P.M.



- San Francisco leads the all-time series vs. Chicago, 36-33-1, including a 23-14 mark at home.
- It marks the first time the 49ers have hosted the Bears in consecutive regular seasons since the 1978-79 seasons.
- The 49ers have won six of their previous 10 matchups with the Bears.
- The Niners will play in prime time games in back-to-back weeks for the first time since Weeks 10-11 of the 2022 season.



WEEK 18 - TBD VS. SEATTLE - TBD



- San Francisco owns a 12-14 record at home against Seattle.
- The Niners have won five of the previous 10 regular season matchups against the Seahawks, including two of the last three home matchups.
- The 49ers and Seahawks will meet in the final week of the regular season for the fifth time in series history.

DRAFT CLASS OF 2025

The San Francisco 49ers added 11 players this offseason through the 2025 NFL Draft. The team also signed seven undrafted rookie free agents to the roster.

DL MYKEL WILLIAMS - 1ST ROUND (11TH OVERALL)

- Originally a 1st-round (11th overall) draft choice by SF in 2025.
- Appeared in 40 games (17 starts) over three seasons at Georgia (2022-24) and finished with 67 tackles, 21.5 TFLs, 14.0 sacks, 3 PDs, 3 FFs and 1 FR.
- In 2024, was named Second-Team All-SEC after appearing in 12 games (5 starts) and registering 21 tackles, 8.5 TFLs, 5.0 sacks, 2 FFs and 1 PD.
- In 2023, appeared in 13 games (10 starts) and earned Second-Team All-SEC honors after recording 18 tackles, 6.5 TFLs, 4.5 sacks, 2 PDs and 1 FF.
- As a freshman in 2022, appeared in 15 games (2 starts) and tallied 28 tackles, 6.5 TFLs and 4.5 sacks, helping the Bulldogs win the 2023 College Football Playoff National Championship and earning SEC All-Freshman Team honors.



DL ALFRED COLLINS - 2ND ROUND (43RD OVERALL)

- Originally a 2nd-round (43rd overall) draft choice by SF in 2025.
- Appeared in 64 games (28 starts) over five seasons at Texas (2020-24) and registered 142 tackles, 18.0 TFLs, 7.5 sacks, 13 PDs, 1 INT and 2 FFs.
- In 2024, earned Associated Press Second-Team All-American honors after starting in 16 games and registering 55 tackles, 5.5 TFLs, 1.0 sack, 7 PDs and 1 FF.
- Saw action in 14 games (6 starts) in 2023 and earned Honorable Mention All-Big 12 honors after recording 2 tackles, 2.0 TFLs, 2.0 sacks, and 2 PDs.
- In 2022, appeared in 12 games (1 start) and registered 17 tackles, 3.0 TFLs and 1.0 sack.
- In 2021, appeared in 12 games (4 starts) and notched 25 tackles, 5.0 TFLs, 2.0 sacks and 1 FF.
- In 2020, appeared in 10 games (1 start) during the shortened COVID-19 season and registered 23 tackles, 2.5 TFLs, 1.5 sacks, 4 PDs and 1 INT.



LB NICK MARTIN - 3RD ROUND (75TH OVERALL)

- Originally the first of two 3rd-round (75th overall) draft choices by SF in 2025.
- In four seasons at Oklahoma State (2021-24), appeared in 35 games (19 starts) and registered 203 tackles, 23.5 TFLs, 7.0 sacks, 4 PDs, 2 INTs, 2 FFs and 2 FRs.
- In 2024, started all 5 games he appeared in and registered 47 tackles, 7.5 TFLs, 1.0 sack, 2 PDs, 1 FF and 1 FR.
- As a junior, earned First-Team All-Big 12 honors after starting in 14 games and recording 140 tackles, 16.0 TFLs, 6.0 sacks, 2 PDs, 2 INTs, 1 FF and 1 FR.
- In 2022, appeared in 13 games and tallied 15 tackles.
- As a freshman in 2021, appeared in 3 games and registered 1 tackle before redshirting.



CB UPTON STOUT - 3RD ROUND (100TH OVERALL)

- Originally the second of two 3rd-round (100th overall) draft choices by SF in 2025.
- In five seasons at Western Kentucky (2022-24) and North Texas (2020-21), appeared in 45 games (34 starts) and registered 166 tackles, 21 PDs, 10.0 TFLs, 6 INTs (2 returned for TDs), 1.5 sacks, 1 FF and 1 FR.
- In 2024, earned First-Team All-Conference USA honors after starting in 12 games and recording 52 tackles, 7.5 TFLs, 2 PDs, 1.0 sack and 1 INT.
- In 2023, appeared in 7 games (6 starts) and tallied 29 tackles, 9 PDs, 1.5 TFLs, 1 INT (returned for a TD), 1 FF, 1 FR and 0.5 sack.
- Earned Conference USA Honorable Mention honors in 2022 after appearing in 14 games (11 starts) and tallying 44 tackles, 6 PDs, 4 INTs and 0.5 sack.
- In 2021 at North Texas, appeared in 4 games (2 starts) and tallied 6 tackles and 1 PD.
- As a freshman in 2020, appeared in 8 games (3 starts) during the shortened COVID-19 season and totaled 35 tackles, 3 PDs and 0.5 TFL.

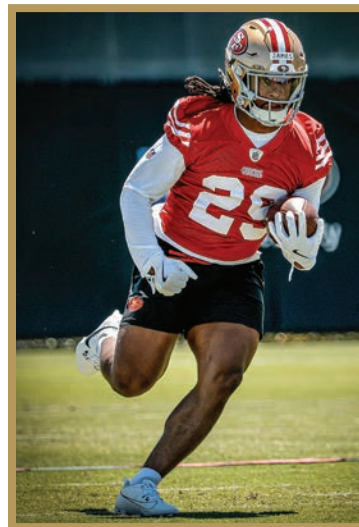

- As a true freshman in 2021, appeared in 14 games (11 starts).



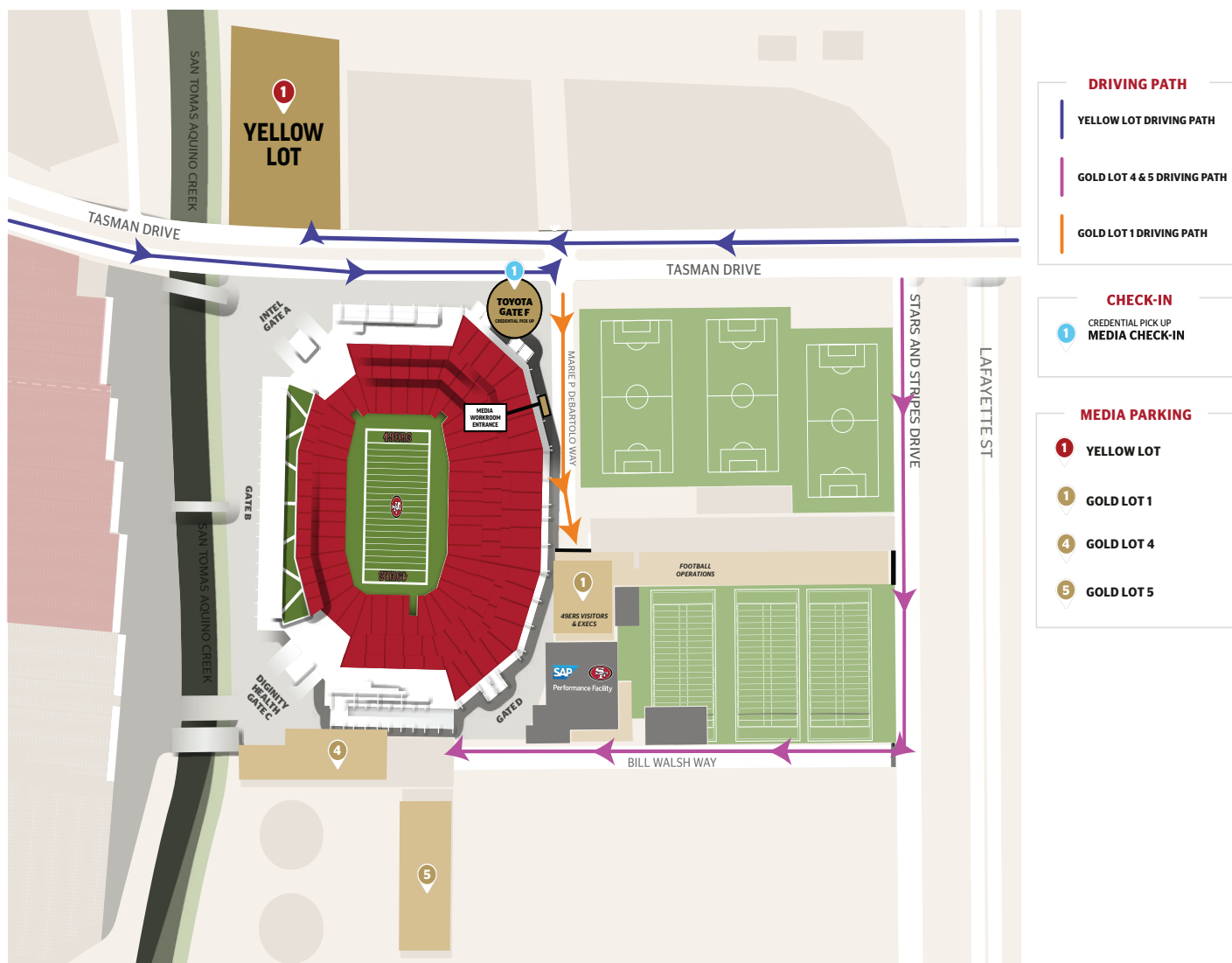

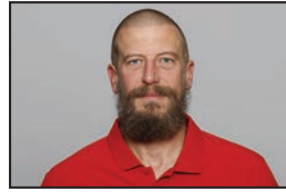

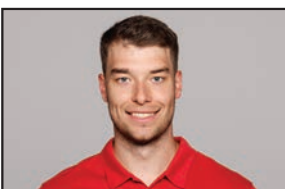
